GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

This week I found out about graduation requirements from Mrs. Pustay. In order to graduate you need a total of 22 credits to graduate high school. New York State requires 5 Regents Exams for a Regents diploma. There are several ways to do this.

All students need credits in all 4 Basic Subjects: Math, English, Science, and Social Studies. Students also need 2 credits of Physical Education. Kids need one-half year of health credit to graduate from high school. 7 and a half credits are considered a full course load each year.

Kids also need electives to fill in their credits. Students need up to three electives to move on in each year of high school. Some examples of Electives are Journalism 1 and 2, Agriscience through Morrisville ENSC, Sociology and Psychology, and Intro To Cooking and Baking. Other electives are Personal Finance, Orchestra, Band, Chorus, and also Foreign Language - (Spanish and French), Film As Literature, Creative Writing, American History

Through Film, Digital Photography And Graphic Design, Horticulture, Small Animal Care, Studio 1, 2, and 3, Painting And Drawing, and Yearbook.

Another way to graduate is through BOCES, but what does that mean? Boards of Cooperative Educational Services are public organizations created by The New York State Legislature. BOCES has different programs for students to attend for credit. Students can do Cosmetology, Culinary, Criminal Justice, and Graphic Design, plus many more.

These are the requirements for high school graduation. Students can get diplomas in different ways. This allows students to get different types of education. It is flexible while still meeting New York State's requirements.

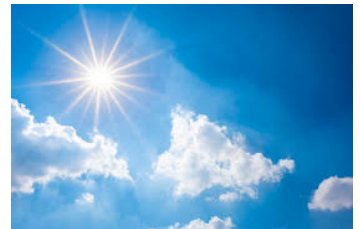

Trump's Would-Be Assassin Left a Note

On Monday, September 23, new evidence was filed as part of the current court case against the would-be assassin found on presidential candidate Donald Trump's golf course in West Palm Beach. Included in this court filing was a letter that 58-year-old suspect Ryan Routh addressed to the world and mailed to an anonymous witness before his arrest on September 15.

Until Tuesday, Routh was only being prosecuted for federal gun crimes, including possession of a firearm as a convicted felon. Since he never actually fired his weapon, there wasn't enough evidence to prove that he was trying to assassinate Trump - until now, that is. The note left behind at the scene of the crime explicitly states, "This was an assassination attempt on Donald Trump." It also states that Routh was

willing to pay a cash reward to anyone "who can complete the job;" mailed in a box along with the letter was ammunition, 4 phones, and other supplies. With this new evidence, federal prosecutors were able to officially charge Routh with the attempted assassination of a former president on Tuesday, September 24. Routh is now facing up to life in prison.

For week three we have the Helene hurricane update as the hurricane starts to appear more of an immediate threat to the residents of Florida and other states. Tropical Storms coming from Hurricane Helene are beginning to hit the Florida gulf coast. The category three hurricane is starting to make its way up the north as it begins



to climb up the Atlantic coast and head inwards. The category three hurricane is set to reach wind speeds from 30 to 40 miles per hour in the lower and middle keys and 25 to 35 in the upper keys. As of now the governor of florida has yet to close schools located in miami and although the keys and florida have yet to be evacuated center officials state that "Residents should ensure they have their hurricane plan in place,.". The Broward County school district sent out a notice to its residents saying "we are closely monitoring the storm in collaboration with local emergency management teams. At this time, there is no impact on District operations. And although the evacuations and shut down of cities in Florida hasn't begun, the officials and government is setting up plans and actions to put in place if need be.

Biden Doesn't Approve of AI?

Joe Biden, America's soon-to-be former president, has shown his dislike for using AI, at the U.N General Assembly . He claims that while it has many positive benefits, there should be international laws to prevent crime, such as fraud and security risks.

"Artificial intelligence is going to change our ways of life, our ways of work, and our ways of war," he said, warning of "profound risks, from deep fakes to disinformation to novel pathogens to bioweapons." He continues to talk about the danger claiming, "Nothing is certain about how AI will evolve or how it will be deployed. No one knows all the answers,"

"We need an equally urgent effort to ensure AI safety, security, and trustworthiness. As AI grows more powerful, it ... must grow more responsive to our collective needs and values," he added. "Second, we ensure that AI supports rather than undermines the core principles that human life has value and all humans deserve dignity. We must make certain that the awesome capabilities of AI will be used to uplift and empower everyday people, not to give dictators more powerful shackles on ... the human spirit in the years ahead." He says in his speech, leaving the GA and the public slightly shocked at the attention brought to the subject.

So where is the line? Between what is safe with ai, and what isn't? Should we get laws pertaining to it? Biden certainly thinks so.

Israel Strikes Lebanon - with Pagers

Just after 3:30 in the afternoon on Tuesday, September 17, explosions rocked southern Lebanon, where Israel has been trading blows with Shia Islamist group Hezbollah. These explosions were caused by pagers packed with plastic explosives that the Israeli government had sold to Hezbollah agents through a shell company and then detonated remotely. At a funeral for victims of the first bombing, only a day later, Hezbollah agents' walkie talkies were detonated in the same way. The death toll for the two bombings totals at least 37, including 4 children and several healthcare workers who had also



bought the Israeli pagers. At least 3,300 more are injured.

Hezbollah is comparable to Hamas in motivations and tactics, but they are

much better armed and stronger militarily, thanks to backing from Iran. They have a very long history with Israel - in fact, the group was created specifically to keep the Israel Defense Forces from invading Lebanon during the Lebanese Civil War back in the 1980s. IDF and Hezbollah's most recent conflict until now was the 2006 Lebanon War, when Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah sent agents to kidnap two IDF soldiers in hopes of negotiating for a prisoner swap. Israel instead launched a retaliatory airstrike, beginning a 34-day war which ended in a stalemate.

The pager bombs were merely the beginning of this latest conflict between Israel and Hezbollah. Just this Monday, September 23,

IDF carried out an airstrike on southern Lebanon in an attempt to push Hezbollah back away from Israel's border. 492 people were killed, including 35 children, and 1,645 more were wounded - all in only *one day*. Israeli president Benjamin Netanyahu issued a warning to Lebanese civilians to "Please get out of harm's way now. Once our operation is finished, you can come back safely to your homes." However, traffic is heavy on the highway north to Lebanese capital Beirut, and many civilians have still not been able to evacuate. We at the EP will have more updates in the coming weeks.

John Hits Mexico

Hurricane John hits the southern coast of Mexico Monday night September 23rd. Brining tons of rain and warnings about life threatening floods. Hurricane John hit the coast around 9:15 P.M with a wind speed of 120 mph. As John started moving northwest the hurricane has turned into a tropical storm. This tragedy has damaged a lot of homes and buildings, as well as people.



John will continue to produce major rainfall and life threatening flash-floods, along Mexico for the next few days. As hurricane John hit Oaxaca state the government had to evacuate 3,000 people and they set up 80 different shelters. People are leaving their homes and trying to get to safe areas around Oaxaca's coast with between 10 to 20 inches of rain with a chance of 30 inches coming through thursday. Reporters are saying that this rain will likely cause flooding and mudslides.

Hezbollah Enters the Battle of Reckoning with Israel as World Powers Urge Restraint

During the past week, we have seen a big escalation in the almost year-long conflict going on between Israel and Lebanon's Hezbollah. Israel and Hezbollah have had conflict going on for many years now. Hezbollah launched a series of rocket attacks to the north of Israel. As this was all starting up the world powers implored that both sides Israel and Hezbollah step back from the brink of this war.



During a funeral for the top commander who was killed, along with about 44 other people who were also killed in this Israel strike on the south on Friday, Deputy secretary-general, Naim Qassem, said on Sunday an "Open-ended battle of reckoning has started." "Threats will not stop us," he said. "We are ready to face all military possibilities." Many of the Israeli warplanes hit border villages and at least more than 100,000 people fled to the north. Israel's defense sources said early Sunday, "Hundreds of rockets had been sent into Israel from Lebanon Hezbollah with some rockets landing near north of the city Haifa." They said, "Rockets have been sent toward their civilian areas, leading to a possible escalation after previous barrages aimed at military targets."

A quick recap: During the past week Hezbollah launched a series of rocket attacks to the north of Israel while they were having a funeral for the top commander who was killed along with about 44 other people who were also killed in this Israel strike on the south on Friday, Hezbollah's deputy secretary-general, Naim Qassem, said on Sunday an "Open-ended battle

Would I watch it again? Maybe with friends, but overall the movie seemed mediocre compared to past depictions of fantasy, dystopian books.

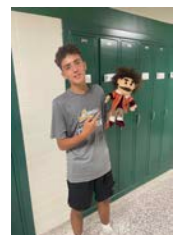
