From the Health Office

With respiratory illnesses circulating, it is more important than ever to receive a flu vaccination through your doctor's office, a pharmacy clinic, or the CT River Area Health District clinic (<u>www.CRAHD.info</u>). Please note that students who are registered in the preschool program must be vaccinated against the flu no later than December 31st in order to be eligible to return to school on January 2, 2025. You may send in proof of vaccination through your child's backpack, or scan and email it to <u>lgriswold@rsd17.org</u>.

Covid, RSV and common cold viruses swell during the winter months, so be sure to prepare your home with some of the following tools for symptom management: nasal saline, a cool mist humidifier, fluids or frozen popsicles with electrolytes, acetaminophen, ibuprofen, lollipop lozenges, honey (age 1+ only), Vitamin C gummies or tablets, and mentholated chest rub, to name a few. Additionally, free Covid testing kits are available at <u>https://covidtests.gov</u>.

Many of the common viruses can linger, but if your child is experiencing difficulty breathing, increased pain with swallowing, extreme fatigue, and fever that does not subside, consult with your pediatrician. Remember that rest is extremely important for the body to heal, and an extra day at home can make all the difference when fighting a pathogen.

It is a good time to stock your child's backpack with an extra pair of pants, and to have them dress in layers with our seasonal changes.

When notifying the office regarding your child's absence from school, please provide information regarding the reason for the absence. Hello from Mrs. Kelsey's art room. We are off to another great start this year in the art room. The students are busy drawing, painting, learning, and responding. The kindergarten classes have been working on their rainbow name clouds; learning new friends' names while learning about lines, shapes, and colors. We will start butterfly drawings, continuing to learn about the elements of art we use in our drawings. First grade just finished their large name drawings with lettering, colors, and patterns. They will be coming home

soon. They learn about abstract art and evaluate the artwork of artist Wassily Kandinsky. They will be creating their abstract paintings using oil pastels and watercolor paints. They will be practicing Chinese brushstrokes with inks to paint on their watercolor backgrounds.

Hello KES Families,

I hope each and everyone of you had a fantastic summer. We are off and running this year, picking up where we left off. We started off the school year reviewing the gym norms: Be Safe, Be Kind, Have Fun! We touched on how we want to make people feel happy, feel proud and feel like you are a part of a team. During social studies this month, students will engage in the study of our local government and the various roles and responsibilities that are needed to make a community thrive. We also continue to build our classroom community through fun filled activities that help us to learn about each other.

Second graders are excited about our first unit study in science this year, Properties of Matter! Students are learning about a real-world problem of trying to help keep ice pops frozen through investigation and exploration. Students will learn to classify different kinds of materials by their observable properties, including color, texture, and heat conduction.

As you can see, second graders are working diligently to grow as learners! The second grade teachers thank you for your support as we strive to make this a wonderful year for our students!

Welcome to third grade! We are so excited to be your child's teacher! Since school has started, we have spent time getting to know each other while learning new routines of third grade. In language arts, we started our first Wit & Wisdom module which is focused on the sea. The first arc invites students to analyze poetry, art, and a fiction text, which present different images of the ocean and prepare students to

consider the ocean as complex and compelling. Students develop a variety of skills, such as asking and answering questions, identifying main ideas and details, using domain-specific vocabulary to express ideas, and developing strong topic statements with supporting details. In math, our first unit focuses on understanding the concept of multiplication. Students are learning the foundational multiplication facts, which include x10, x5, x2, x1, and x0 facts. In science, our first unit is forces and interactions. Students are learning about the six simple machines and using our Vex Kits to build some of the simple machines. We look forward to meeting with you at the end of the month at parent-teacher conferences!



Twigs are a fabulous resource for making shapes and demonstrating what kids know about their attributes.



Count The Chestnuts

Acorns or chestnuts are a great resource to practice place value.

You will need:

- Baskets or buckets (which will act as 100s, 10s, 1s columns and so on...).
- Chestnuts or acorns (to throw into the baskets/buckets).

How to run the activity:

- 1. Collect 10 of 3 items from outside (Ex rocks, acorns, chestnuts).
- 2. Designate each item as representing 100s, 10s or 1s.
- 3. Set up and label baskets and assign them a place value 100s, 10s, 1s.
- 4. Shout out a number.
- 5. Child throws acorns or chestnuts into the respective baskets to make up the number.
- 6. Ex. If you shout out 684. Then the child would throw 6 chestnuts in the 100's bucket, 8 rocks in the 10s bucket and 4 acorns into the 1's bucket.
- 7. Adjust the place value for different ages (Ex. Use 2 buckets for younger children to practice two-digit numbers).
