What do the first six weeks of school look like?



Starting school is a big deal and our youngest students are rocking it! They are already settling into their new school routines! I have been in rooms where kids already know where their backpacks go, where snacks and water bottles go, and how to follow the daily schedule. They are making friends, singing songs, and learning is happening everywhere!

The start of the year is focused on creating a sense of community in the 4K classroom. Some children have had experiences away

from mom or dad and this is something they are accustomed to, other children this is their first time away from home, in a group setting. The first weeks of school are spent adjusting to being in school, understanding classroom routines, setting classroom expectations, and getting to know each other. Days have been filled with name games, classroom scavenger hunts that introduce the areas of the room, arrival and departure routines, and plenty of time for playing, fun, and laughter. Building trust and establishing relationships with students creates a safe and fun school environment.

For most of our learners, this is the FIRST time they have been to school. Many are learning how to sit at circle time, get in line, eat snacks or lunch at school, wash their hands, clean up, and wait their turn. Teachers spend time teaching basic school skills that they will not only use this year but throughout their educational journey.

We hope your students have come home singing new songs, talking about new friends, and are excited about school.

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We Take Care of Ourselves

Focus on Self-Help Skills and Independence

One of our primary focuses in 4K is helping our youngest learners become independent with their self-care tasks. Our goal is to empower all students to be self-sufficient, ensuring they can participate fully in both classroom activities and everyday routines.

Self-care skills encompass everything from **hanging up backpacks** and coats to managing folders, snacks, and water bottles upon arrival. To support these budding skills, we use visual aids that show students the steps they need to complete before starting their day. This routine helps build consistency and confidence in their ability to manage their own belongings.


Throughout the day, we encourage children to take care of themselves by **asking for what they need**. For example, if they need help, they're taught to ask a friend or teacher. Whether they want a specific color of paper or are wondering when snack time is, they are encouraged to explore their environment and problem-solve by checking the daily schedule or accessing supplies on their own.

As winter approaches, we focus on building independence in **putting on snow gear**, with a fun twist! Songs help remind kids of the important order: boots come *after* snow pants! In dramatic play, we have dolls and dress-up clothes, and we work on fine motor skills, such as threading beads on pipe cleaners, to strengthen fingers for tying shoes and zipping jackets.

Self-help also extends to bathroom and hygiene skills. In 4K, students are encouraged to be **independent in the bathroom**, which includes using the toilet and managing personal hygiene. We also focus on **building healthy habits** like coughing into elbows, blowing noses, and keeping toys out of mouths. Routines such as washing hands after using the toilet, after blowing noses, and before snack are embedded into our day.

We understand that these **self-help skills take time, practice, and support**. Teachers are there every step of the way, offering encouragement and guidance through picture supports, visual routines, songs, and stories.

If you have any questions about your child's self-care progress, we encourage you to connect with their teachers. We are always happy to share resources and strategies to ensure consistency between home and school. Together, we can help our 4K kiddos gain the confidence and skills to thrive independently!



We hold our fall conferences the <u>week of October 21st</u>. Your child's teacher will be sharing a signup with you to join them for a 15-20 minute time block to discuss your student's first few weeks of school.

AMPLIFY CKLA Update

Our First Domain (Unit) is "All About Me!!"

Our new Literacy Curriculum is under way! We are so excited to start CKLA as a curriculum to increase alphabet knowledge, phonics and phonemic skills, as well as build our 4K vocabularies and background knowledge!



This curriculum supports the interests and skill building that already exists in 4K. We always start with helping students get to know their classmates, understand classroom routines and expectations, and build a classroom community. This first domain fits right into this.

In All About Me we are working on finding our own names- and the first letter in our names, and identifying the names of our friends. We are talking about our five senses, the different parts of our bodies like eyelashes, eyebrows, elbows, and knees! We will share the ways in which we are the same and what makes us "unique" (one of our new words). We are learning that we are all "humans", that even grown-ups start out as "infants", and there are things that each of us "prefer" different things.

All of these lessons help to build a strong understanding of self and others and help build our classroom communities.

Our next domain will be about our families and the communities we live in. Stay tuned for more great learning!

Why We Teach Through Play!

1. Children learn through their play.

Don't underestimate the value of play. Children learn and develop:

Cognitive skills – like math and problem solving in a pretend grocery store

Physical abilities - like balancing blocks and running on the playground

New vocabulary – like the words they need to play with toy dinosaurs

Social skills – like playing together in a pretend car wash

Literacy skills – like creating a menu for a pretend restaurant

2. Play is healthy.

Play helps children grow strong and healthy. It also counteracts obesity issues facing many children today.

3. Play reduces stress.

Play helps your children grow emotionally. It is joyful and provides an outlet for anxiety and stress.

4. Play is more than meets the eye.

Play is simple and complex. There are many types of play: symbolic, socio-dramatic, functional, and games with rules—to name just a few. Researchers study play's many aspects: how children learn through play, how outdoor play impacts children's health, the effects of screen time on play, to the need for recess in the school day.

5. Make time for play.

As parents, you are the biggest supporters of your children's learning. You can make sure they have as much time to play as possible during the day to promote cognitive, language, physical, social, and emotional development.

6. Play and learning go hand-in-hand.

They are not separate activities. They are intertwined. Think about them as a science lecture with a lab. Play is the child's lab.

7. Play outside.

Remember your own outdoor experiences of building forts, playing on the beach, sledding in the winter, or playing with other children in the neighborhood. Make sure your children create outdoor memories too.

8. There's a lot to learn about play.

There's a lot written on children and play. Here are some <u>NAEYC articles and books about play</u>. David Elkind's The Power of Play (Da Capo, 2007 reprint) is also a great resource.

9. Trust your own playful instincts.

Remember as a child how play just came naturally? Give your children time for play and see all that they are capable of when given the opportunity.

10. Play is a child's context for learning.

Children practice and reinforce their learning in multiple areas during play. It gives them a place and a time for learning that cannot be achieved through completing a worksheet. For example, in playing restaurant, children write and draw menus, set prices, take orders, and make out checks. Play provides rich learning opportunities and leads to children's success and self-esteem.

KOBUSSEN BUS NEWS for 4K Bus Riders

Please wait for your bus to stop

Please have your child wait by your side until the bus has come to a stop, has red lights flashing and the door is open. The drivers are checking for surrounding traffic to make sure it is safe for your child to approach the bus



Double-check your pick-up and drop-off times

Since we provide door-to-door busing we need to have everyone ready to get on the bus when it arrives in order to be at school on time. Please be at the pick-up/drop-off location 15 minutes prior to your scheduled time.

Early Release Thursdays

Elementary sites are released at 1:30

Community sites are released at 1:20.

That means they will arrive at your drop-off location 1 hour and 10 minutes earlier than other days.

Face-to-Face Pick up and Drop Off

Student safety is our primary concern. That is why our busing for 4K is door-to-door with the expectation of an adult being present. We want to keep our youngest scholars safe so whether you are meeting the bus at the end of a driveway or at a stop with K-5 students our bus drivers need to see an adult before they will allow 4K students off the bus.

Bus Tags

All eligible bus students will receive a bus tag on the first day of school. They must have their bus tags on their person. Your teacher will attach it to their backpack, please keep it attached to their backpack. Drivers will ask to see bus tags of students they don't recognize. If your child needs a replacement bus tag please let your teacher know.

Las investigaciones indican que hacer las actividades de Ready4K es una excelente manera de mantener a su hijo aprendiendo.


