Oakwew PBIS

PBIS is an acronym for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. It is a school-wide approach to develop a safer, more positive school environment for our students. We work to establish an environment where appropriate behavior is the norm by explicitly teaching and reinforcing behavioral expectations. Our district's set of behavior expectations is called "the Sailor Code."

The Sailon Code.

- **1.** Be here & be ready.
 - 2. Be safe.
- **3.** Be positive.
- 4. Be respectful.

When students follow the Sailor Code, they can be recognized by any staff member with a **Sailor Shout Out**. Students who earn a Sailor Shout Out have their names

- announced, get a certificate, have their photos put on the Bingo Board, and get special recognition on the school's Facebook page. Once an entire row or column on the Bingo Board gets filled, all of the students in that row/column have a special party with fun activities and snacks! Mystery Mates are also recognized for
- consistently following the Sailor Code and earn a spot on the Bingo Board as well.

Every nine weeks, we host a **school-wide celebration assembly** in which everyone gets to celebrate positive behavior. At these assemblies, we give out prizes, play games, review expectations, and dance!

Free Farmer's Market Event



Parent Right to Know Information as Required by The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)] and the Every Student Succeeds Act [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)]

Dear Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s):

Your child attends school in the Lakeview School District, which receives Federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law and your child's education. This letter lets you know about your right to request information about the qualifications of the classroom staff working with your child.

At Lakeview, we are proud of our teachers and feel they are ready for the school year and are prepared to give your child a high-quality education. As a Title I school, we must meet federal regulations related to teacher qualifications as defined in ESEA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your child's teachers' training and credentials. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject they are teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additional right-to-know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
 - subject matter tested,
 - o purpose of the test,
 - source of the requirement (if applicable).
 - o amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - o time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.
