## Visual Arts and Woodworking

Discover Tower's vibrant visual arts and woodworking curricula and our emphasis on craftsmanship, creativity and personal expression. Visual arts students execute multi-step projects utilizing a range of mediums—clay, papier mâché, oil pastels, paint, and more. Students strengthen fine motor skills and expand problem-solving abilities as they envision the result of their work. In the woodshop, students use coping saws, miters, chisels, and wood steamers to create a portfolio of work ranging from name boards to cutting boards and model boats. Throughout, student curiosity and creative thinking are honored.

## Physical, Cognitive and Emotional Well-Being

## Progression of Spanish Curriculum, from Early Childhood to Middle School
