With its opening in fall 2014, UWC Dilijan became the 14th member of the UWC movement.

UWC Dilijan evolved from the original idea to create Dilijan International School of Armenia, first conceived in 2006 by Ruben Vardanyan and Veronika Zonabend with the support of other Founding Donors.

The school is now an integral part of Dilijan and Armenia and aims to have powerfully positive local and regional impact.

Students are between 16 and 17 years old upon entry, and are selected based on academic achievement, co-curricular involvement, leadership, potential and fit with the UWC mission.

UWC Dilijan is devoted to providing educational access for students around the world - 87% of students receive some level of financial support out of whom 30% are on full scholarships

UWC Dilijan's 220 students hail from about 80 countries. 10% are Armenian, and the rest of the students come from other countries.

TRANSFORMATIVE, TWO-YEAR, RESIDENTIAL EDUCATION

Co-curricular involvement significant component of the student experience. Many of the co-curricular activities available at UWC Dilijan are entirely initiated and led by the students themselves. Additionally, all students are involved in on-campus service as well as off-campus engagement in the Dilijan community. The richness of learning beyond the classroom includes frequent cultural weekends and issue-oriented focus weeks, as well as two off-campus project weeks each year

Living and learning with students and staff of different cultures and backgrounds is an essential feature of UWC Dilijan. All students live on campus and are expected to be fully involved in the academic, residential and co-curricular life of the College. Residential programming and structures encourage students to explore and negotiate diversity in all aspects of life.

students pursue the full International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, in English. As part of the IBDP, students take 3 subjects at the Higher Level (HL), and 3 subjects at the Standard Level (SL). Additionally, students complete a Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course, a 4000 word Extended Essay (EE) on a topic of their choice, and the requirements of Creativity, activity, service (CAS).


