A team of five juniors and two sophomores spent more than 300 hours inventing "IllumiLane," a laser-illuminated portable bike lane with an AI warning system for the cyclist, which won the Golden Beaver award, the top award at MIT's Eurekafest in June 2024.

Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Council and Student-Led Diversity Conference

AP Platinum With Access

Country Day is the only coeducational independent school in Ohio to earn the Platinum with Access award from the College Board. The Access award signifies that "the percentage of AP exam takers who are underrepresented minority and/or low-income students mirrors the school's overall student demographics." This award recognizes the consistently high scores achieved by our students on AP exams and the school's clear and effective commitment to equitable access.

Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) Classes

Honors courses and AP classes are **equivalent**. Honors courses either precede or follow an AP course, except for Honors Modern World History, which replaces an AP course not in our curriculum. All Honors and AP courses extend well beyond exam prep and challenge students to understand, create, and express knowledge in multiple ways.
