





### **FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTION DAYS**

The Trinity Area School District has been approved to utilize Flexible Instruction Days (FIDs). Trinity will move to remote instruction when schools are closed due to weather or other concerns. It is no longer a necessity to cancel instruction for weather or facility issues. When a FID is announced, teachers will teach from home and students will learn remotely from home. If it becomes necessary to cancel school, staff, parents, guardians, and students will receive notification via the Skylert System, local television, and radio sources. On a FID the students will log onto their Chromebooks and attend school remotely as they have done during closures in the past. Staff, parents/guardians, and students need to be prepared for short-term or sporadic closures due to weather related issues. Students should have their Chromebooks available daily at school and at home. Staff and students must be prepared to work from home at all times.

### CEP FAQ TRINITY AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT What is the Community Eligibility Provision? (CEP)

CEP is a non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas. CEP allows schools and districts to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed using a formula based on the percentage of students categorically eligible for free meals based on their participation in other specific means-tested programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

# How does my student get a free meal?

For a student to receive a free meal, they must take a minimum 3 items at lunch and/or breakfast. Of these 3 items, one must be 1/2c. fruit/juice or vegetables. The food service department offers various entrees, fruits, and vegetables for maximum choice options.

# Do I need to fill out an application to get the free meals?

No, you do not need to fill out a free/reduced application to receive the free meal. However, you can fill out an application to determine if you qualify for other reduced cost options, such as Chromebook insurance. Any family that is a direct certification through other specific means-tested programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, will be automatically received through the Compass website. https://www.compass.dhs.pa.gov/intake/#/applynow/gettingstarted

# My student already received free meals, anything different for them?

No, your student will follow the same meal patterns as all other students. The CEP program now allows all students to eat for free.

# My student just wants a milk/fruit. Why isn't this free?

Student's must take the required 3 components, including fruit/vegetable for the milk/fruit to be free.

# Can my student get a second/extra food for free?

Federal Child Nutrition guidelines only allow one breakfast and one lunch per student to be free per day. Any additional food will be available for purchase.

# How can I add money on my student's account?

You can add money to your student's account three ways: 1.Send cash in an envelope with student's name on the front 2. Make check to Trinity Food Service with student's name in note section 3. Pay online at E-funds, which can be found on the Food Service page on the website

### What if my student doesn't grab everything for a free meal?

If your student is missing something to make the meal complete, our kitchen staff will gladly help your student.

Parent Right to Know Information as Required by The Elementary and Secondary Education Assistance (ESEA) [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)] and the Every Student Succeeds Act [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)]

Trinity Area School District receives Federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards. Throughout the school year, we will be providing you with important information about this law and your child's education. This letter lets you know about your right to request information about the qualifications of the classroom staff working with your child.

We are very proud of our teachers and feel they are prepared to give your child a high-quality education. Our Title I schools must meet federal regulations related to teacher qualifications as defined in ESEA. These regulations allow you to learn more about your child's teachers' training and credentials. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

You may also ask whether your child receives help from a paraprofessional. If your child receives this assistance, we can provide you with information about the paraprofessional's qualifications.

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additional right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include
  - o subject matter tested,
  - o purpose of the test,
  - o source of the requirement (if applicable),
  - o amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
  - o time and format of disseminating results.

Our staff is committed to helping your child develop the academic knowledge and critical thinking he/she needs to succeed in school and beyond. That commitment includes making sure that all of our teachers and paraprofessionals meet applicable Pennsylvania state requirements.
