We are excited to inform you we will be administering the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) on October 16th. ALL Grade 9 students will be taking the PSAT 8/9 and all Grade 10 and Grade 11 students will be taking the PSAT. The

PSAT is an important standardized test designed to prepare students for the SAT and provide an opportunity to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

The PSAT offers several benefits:

- Practice for the SAT: It allows students to experience the format and timing of the SAT while receiving valuable feedback on their academic skills.
- Scholarship Opportunities: High scores on the PSAT may qualify students for the National Merit Scholarship and other recognition programs. - Eligible for ONLY Juniors
- College and Career Planning: After the test, students receive access to tools that help them explore career interests and college opportunities, based on their performance.

Immediate removal from contests/events, suspension from future contests/events (local districts may administer additional sanctions), and required completion of an educational component before returning to future contests/events.



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SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

The NISIAA along with local conferences and school districts are adhering to a newly approved Spectator Code of Conduct policy. Please be aware that spectators that do not follow these expectations are subject to consequences.

Under the Spectator Sportsmanship Policy,

unsportsmanlike conduct includes:

- Verbal or physical abuse/harassment of an official, staff, coach, player, or spectator.
- Intentional inciting of participants or spectators to violent or abusive action; use of obscene gestures or profanity before, during or after events; use of artificial noisemakers or disruptions to distract participants.
- Entering the field of play at any contest/event.
- Engaging in harassing verbal or physical conduct related to race, gender, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation or religion at an interscholastic event.

Immediate removal from contests/events, suspension from future contests/events (local districts may administer additional sanctions) and required completion of an educational component before returning to future events.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we strive to maintain a productive learning environment, we want to remind you of the attendance regulations that are in place to support student success.

A Day in Session

According to New Jersey Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3), a school day must consist of a minimum of 4 hours of instructional time, exclusive of recess or lunch periods.

Tardiness

Ensuring that students arrive on time is essential. The first warning bell for the school day rings at 7:12, student arrival after 7:20 will be marked tardy. Student arrival after 10:20 a.m. will automatically be marked absent for the school day.

Early Dismissal

For students who are dismissed early or picked up before the end of the instructional day, please note they must be present for at least 4 hours of instructional time to be counted as present for the day. For example, if a student arrives by 7:20 a.m. and is dismissed after 11:20 a.m., they will be considered present for the day. In equal measure, if a student arrives by 7:20 a.m. and departs before 11:20 a.m., they will be marked absent for the day.

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that your student attends school regularly and arrives on time. Thank you for your continued support!
