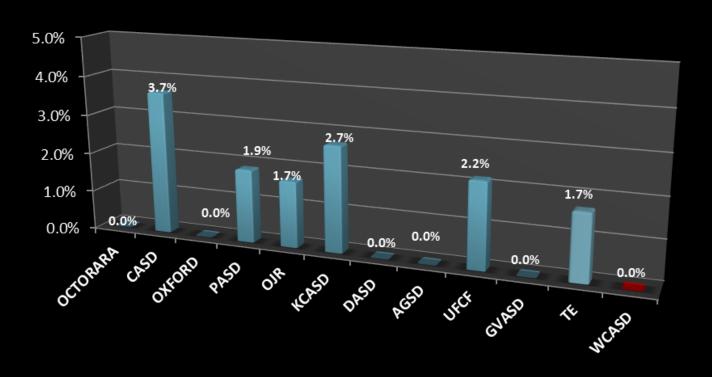


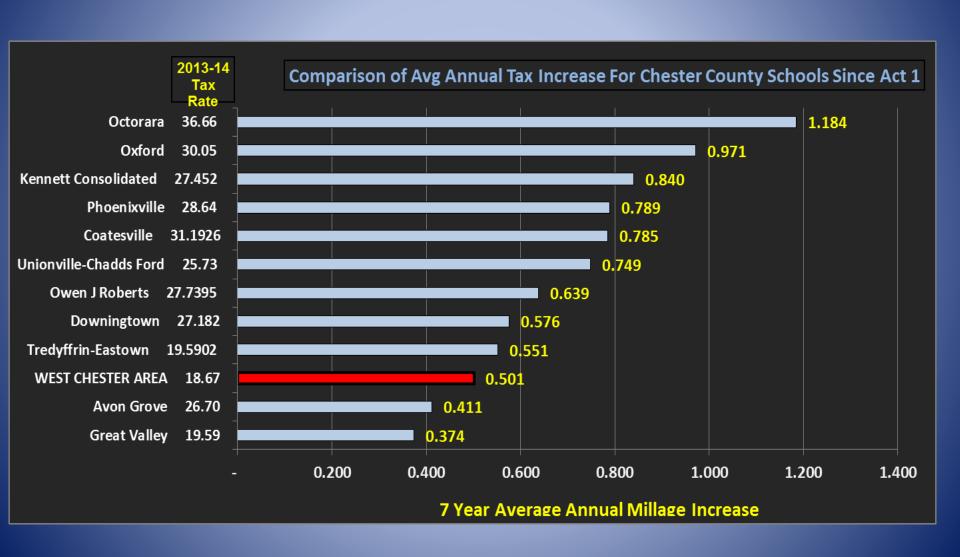


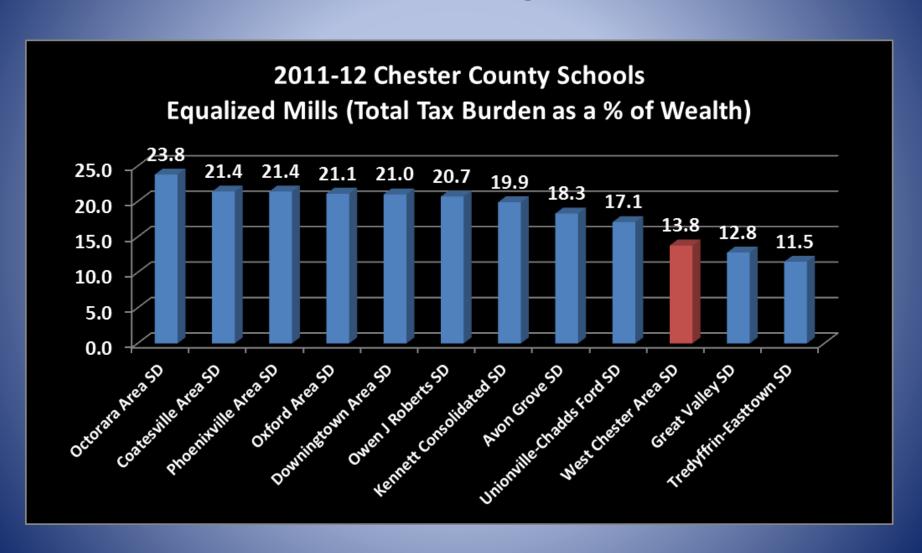
2013-14 Millage Rates Chester County Schools



2013-14 Millage Rates Increases Chester County Schools

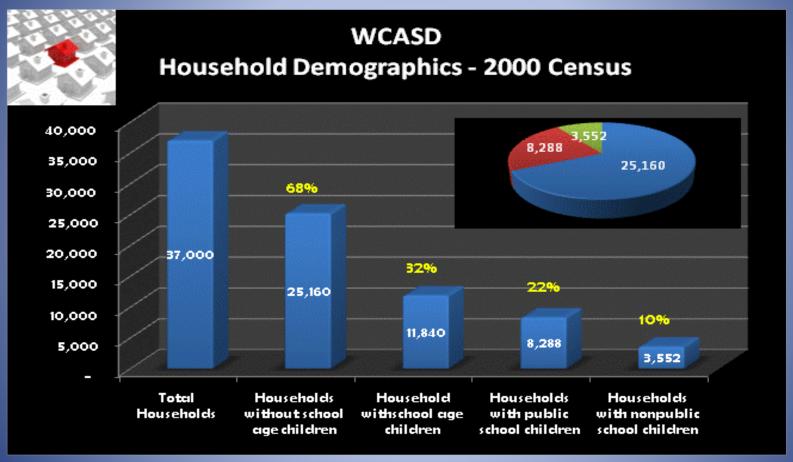

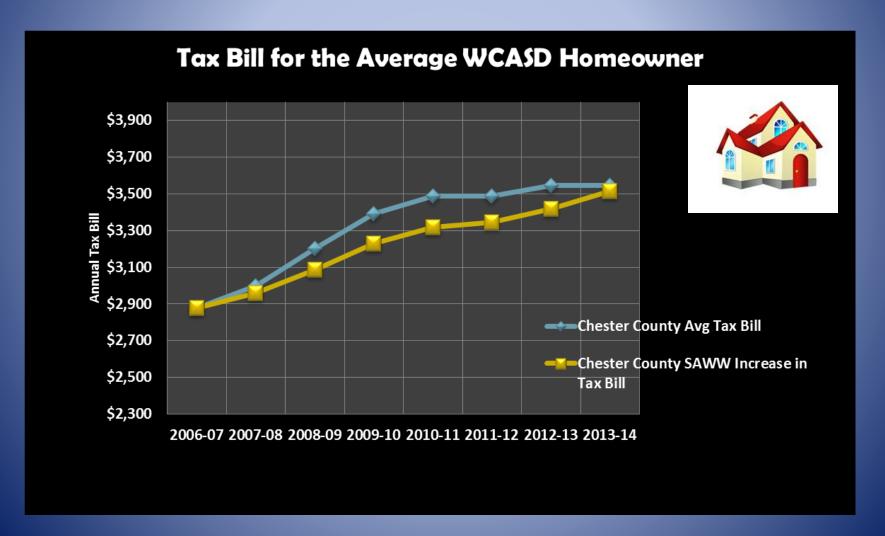

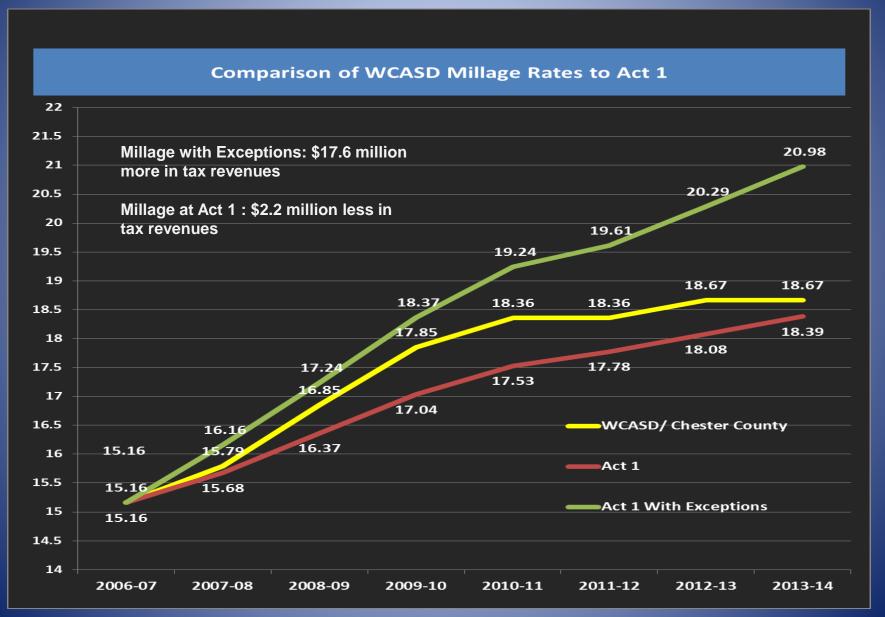


32,000 homeowners pay \$116 million in RE taxes and all working residents pay \$19 million in EIT

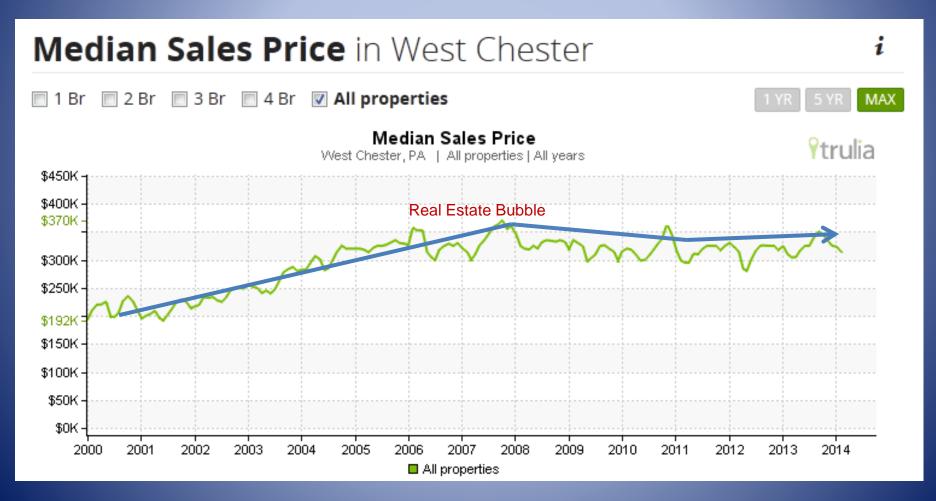




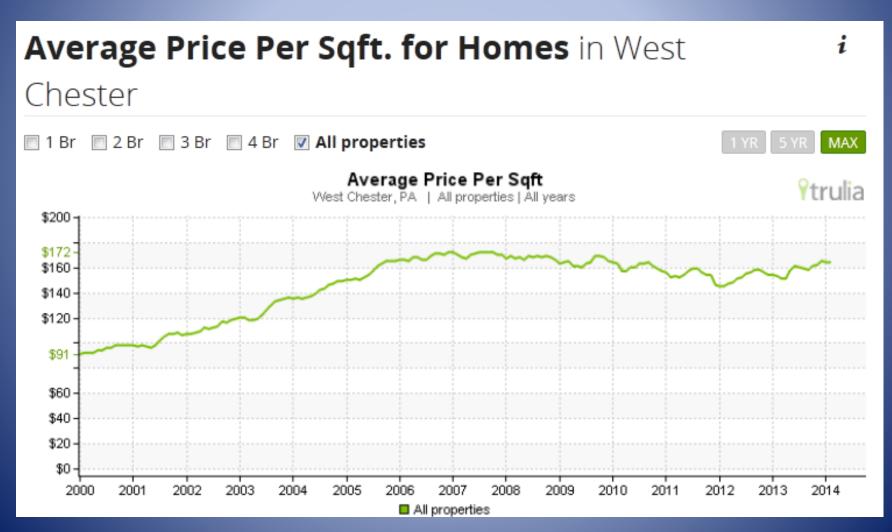

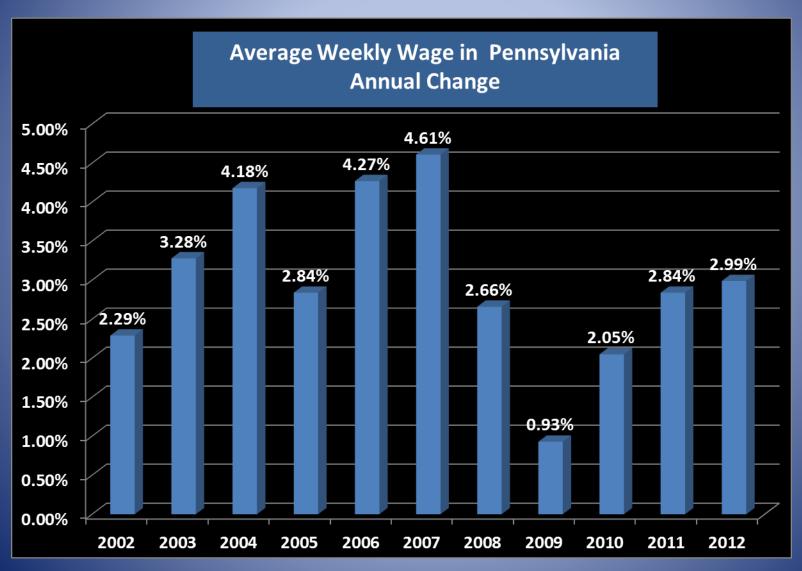
