## AFFORDING LAKESIDE

Lakeside School has an extensive need-based financial aid program that supports qualifying families with incomes from \$17,000 to over \$250,000. Families who make less than \$75,000 a year typically pay \$250 a year, at most.

Financial aid applies to all school programming, including trips, technology, lunch, athletics, and more.

## LAKESIDE BY THE NUMBERS

Lakeside has both a Middle School (5th-8th grade) and Upper School (9th-12th grade). Students do not need to attend the Middle School to go to the Upper School. Our 289 Middle School and 587 Upper School students enjoy an average class size of 18 students. Our student body is made up of students from over 250 different “sending schools”, with over half coming to us from public schools.
