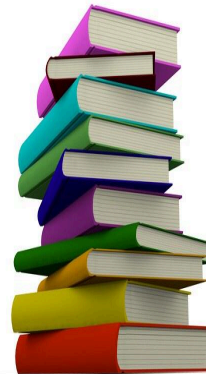
### Title I offers your child...

### What is Title I?

Title I is a federal assistance program for schools that provides additional academic support for students. The goal of Title I is to help every child meet the academic standards and get a high quality education. Title I provides millions of children with the help they need to be successful in school.

## Title I helps students, teachers and parents. The program can help:

- Children do better in school and feel better about themselves.
- Teachers understand the needs and concerns of students and parents.
- Parents understand their child and are more involved in the child's education.

Let your child see you:

- Read newspapers, books, and magazines.
- Write letters, grocery lists, a journal etc.

Make learning fun. Help your child to build language and reading skills during:

- Games- crossword puzzles, word games, etc.
- Outings- help your child read signs while shopping or traveling.

- Trips- ask your child to read and tell you about where you are traveling to

Take advantage of resources at the:

- Public library- visit it together; help your child pick out books to read just for fun.
- Child's school- ask if you can borrow materials.

Read to your child:

- Even if he/she can already read, talk about the story; ask what might happen next.
