We are constantly striving to create an inclusive and supportive environment for all CES students. One of the key ways we accomplish this is through our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework. This year. we've taken another step in supporting student achievement by integrating a WIN (What I Need) period into our daily schedule. The WIN period is a dedicated time for students to receive Academic Intervention Services (AIS), enrichment, and targeted interventions to meet their individual needs. Whether a student requires additional support or opportunities for enrichment, the WIN period is designed to ensure that all students have access to what they need to succeed.

WIN is part of our Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) and allows us to provide tiered academic and behavioral support tailored to each student. During the WIN period, teachers work closely with students to offer interventions within the classroom, promoting a collaborative and inclusive environment. This model ensures students receive timely, evidence-based interventions without missing instruction time.

By embedding WIN into our daily schedule, we're maximizing every moment of the school day to support learning and growth. This period not only strengthens our AIS program but also ensures that every child's needs are met. Whether through PBIS, WIN, or our broader MTSS approach, CES is committed to providing the best educational experience for all students.

Student-created mural now displayed at Chester Elementary School office



A week before the 2024-2025 school year, Chester Elementary School hung up its newest student masterpiece in the main office, so students could see their completed work for the first day of school.

In spring 2024, the entire third grade class at Chester Elementary School came together to help create and participate in painting the newest artwork; a 16-foot by 4-foot mural showcased in the school.

The idea came about by Emily Daunicht, art teacher at CES, during midwinter break while the main office was being renovated. She noticed a large blank white space and was inspired to spruce it up with art. Mrs. Daunicht discussed her idea with Principal Mary Kate Boesch, then began creating the mural, which students helped bring to fruition. Mrs. Daunicht worked with the third grade students to brainstorm ideas and aspects of the school to incorporate into the mural. The piece encompasses images and themes that are a part of everyday life at the school, such as reading, writing, social studies, science, robotics, art, music and technology.

"I really like that this is something that the students can see up in the building forever that students created," said Mrs. Daunicht.
