Wildcat Spotlight-Recognize Students with Perfect Scores on the Spring IREAD-3 and ILEARN Assessments

Each spring students in grades 2-8 participate in the statewide testing program by taking IREAD and ILEARN. Dr. Lorey stated she is proud to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of students who achieved perfect scores on the assessments. Mr. Eckerle the Board President presented each student with a certificate of achievement and had their photo taken.

Athletic Department Report-Phil Kendall

Mr. Kendall stated the school athletics had a very successful year. The athletes have completed one full cycle in the SIAC as this was the fourth year competing in the conference. He stated the athletes competed extremely well in all sports.

For the fourth consecutive year JHS has finished 2nd overall in the All-Conference standings, behind only Castle. However, this year was the closest they have come to winning the All-Conference trophy. In the SIAC, Jasper High School was able to capture 4 team Conference Championships out of 19 overall sports.

Seven sports finished 2^{nd} overall, two finished 3^{rd} , and three finished 4^{th} . In the 29 sports, JHS finished in the top 4 in 16 of the 19.

Mr. Kendall stated from a financial perspective they are "healthy" at this point. Coaches and their programs continue to do a great job of distinguishing wants vs needs when it comes to requesting items for their programs. He stated the athletic department is saving money for items they would like to have

for the newly renovated facilities that weren't part of the project. He stated with hosting IHSAA events it has helped to raise money in the concession stands. Individual sport booster clubs and fundraisers continue to help with expenses in their sports, which allows the athletic department to save funds.

Mr. Kendall said all sports passes are up this year which has helped with the financial program. He also stated the digital scoreboards have brought in an additional \$15,000 and more people are asking how to be added to the process.

Mr. Kendall said the balance for the athletic department is \$187,096.44.

A motion by Dr. Englert, second by Arlet Jackle, to adjourn the regular meeting, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Open Public Hearing-FY 24 Budget Hearing

The 2025 Budget was presented to the Board at the July Board meeting. The corporation has advertised Form 3 Notice to Taxpayers the CPF and Bus Replacement Plans in Gateway and on the corporation website. This year's advertised budget total is \$44,832,999 with an advertised tax rate of \$1.7127. The advertised rate is inflated to protect the levy. The DLGF will reduce the rate in the final budget orders. For example, the advertised tax rate in 2024 was \$1.9208. The approved tax rate was \$1.0083. The public hearing is conducted to give the public an opportunity to make comments about the advertised budget.

Dr. Lorey asked if there was any public comment.

No public comment.

Additional Appropriation Public Hearing

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve a Resolution for Additional Appropriation in the Education Fund in the amount of \$1,750,000. Per the 2024 1782 Notice, we were given permission to spend \$22,231,625 of the cash balance. At the end of July, the corporation had spent nearly 62% of the approved appropriations. The remaining Education Fund expenses may be over the limit. The anticipated revenue for FY 24 is \$25,847,716. Regardless of the cash balance, the corporation can only spend the amount approved by the DLGF on the 1782 Notice.

Dr. Lorey asked if there was any public comment.

No public comment.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the Resolution for the Additional Appropriation. A motion by Arlet Jackle, second by Steve Lukemeyer, to approve the Resolution for the Additional Appropriation for \$1,750,000, was unanimously approved by the Board.

A motion by Sara Schmidt, second by Dr. Englert, to adjourn the Public Hearing, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Curriculum Update—Mrs. Fawks

Mrs. Fawks gave an update on the 2024 IREAD Assessments.

- Grade 3 results included students who passed the assessment as second graders in 2023, third
 grade students who passed during the 2024 Spring Administration, and third grade students
 who passed during the 2024 Summer Retest Administration
- Grade 2 students who passed will not retake IREAD-3 in their third-grade year
- Students with a passing status will be included in the pass percentages during the cohort year of 2024-25
- Students considered On Track are progressing as expected; with continued literacy instruction in third grade, they think this group of students will pass upon retesting in third grade
- Students falling into the At-Risk category will be provided additional support in literacy instruction through classroom differentiation and intervention services. Many of these students also attended 2024 summer school sessions.

Mrs. Fawks discussed where the corporation stood as Indiana % Pass and where Greater Jasper % Pass.

Mr. Eckerle asked what happens to the students who do not pass.

Mrs. Fawks said there are assessment tests that pinpoint what areas the student needs help in.

Student Support Services and Transportation Update—Mr. Buechlein

Mr. Buechlein asked the Board to approve the purchase of a new special needs transportation bus. The max capacity is 48 on a 78-passenger length bus. Each seat will provide 2 three-point belts and two child integrated seats. There are up to 5 wheelchair stations or ten track mounted seats. The track system allows for accommodation of larger wheelchairs which are becoming more common. With the bus you can remove two seats for each wheelchair station. The price of the bus is \$181,036.00. A motion by Dr. Englert, second by Steve Lukemeyer, to approve the purchase of a new bus from Blue Bird for \$181,026.00, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Buechlein informed the Board-

- On August 29th JHS will have a team from the State perform a safety audit
- On August 30th he is hosting a regional training event to focusing on multi-disciplinary threat assessment teams
- On September 4th he is hosting the Dubois County Safety Commission for all county schools

Other Business:

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the 2024-2025 Teacher Evaluation Plan. The Board is required to approve the Teacher Evaluation Plan used by the district annually. There have been no changes to the plan from last year.

A motion by Arlet Jackle, second by Sara Schmidt, to approve the 2024-2025 Teacher Evaluation Plan, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the revised adult breakfast price.

A motion by Arlet Jackle, second by Dr. Englert, to approve the revised adult breakfast price, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the Uniform Conflict of Interest Disclosure for Arlet Jackle because she is a corporation bus driver.

A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Sara Schmidt, to approve the Uniform Conflict of Interest Disclosure for Arlet Jackle, was unanimously approved by the Board with Arlet Jackle abstaining from voting.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the Uniform Conflict of Interest Disclosure for Brady Gunselman because he has an independent business and will be paid to remove trash at Alumni Stadium after games.

A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Sara Schmidt, to approve the Uniform Conflict of Interest Disclosure for Brady Gunselman G-Crew LLC, was unanimously approved by the Board.



AGREEMENT BETWEEN SCHOOL AND INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR TO PROVIDE SERVICES

This Agreement, entered into by and between Nancy Knies, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor", and Greater Jasper Consolidated Schools, an Indiana school corporation, of Dubois County, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as "School",

WHEREAS, Contractor is an educator who desires to and may offer consulting services to school corporations in Southern Indiana and is desirous of providing services to School in the area of Speech Language Pathology; and Greater Jasper Consolidated Schools desires to engage the services of Contractor as an independent contractor to provide such special services for a period beginning September, 2024, for a total of fifteen (15) days to be completed no later than December, 2024.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises herein stated the parties hereto mutually agree and covenant as follows:

- 1. Beginning September, 2024, and extending until December 2024, Contractor will furnish all material, equipment and labor (except as specifically stated herein to be the responsibility reasonably necessary to provide instruction to students assigned to Contractor by School. The responsibilities to be fulfilled are to act as a Speech Language Pathologist to Students and Teachers, and assist in assessment of students in the Jasper School facilities not to exceed fifteen (15) student days, at such locations as School may from time to time direct.
- 2. For the services provided Contractor will be paid Three Hundred Ninety Dollars and Seventy One Cents (\$390.71) per day, per week, not to exceed fifteen (15) days of service. Additionally to pay to or for Contractor one-half of the FICA contribution required from Contractor on his/her contracted amount.
- 3. It is hereby declared to be the expressed intention of each of the parties that the relationship created between them by this contract is that of independent contractor/principal. Contractor, not being an employee, shall not receive any contributions to the Public Employment Retirement Fund or the Teachers' Retirement Fund or any employment-type of fringe benefit by way of this agreement. Contractor shall exercise all control, direction and supervision with respect to the physical details of the work to be performed and the manner in which the work is performed under this contract, so long as within the guide-lines of the Indiana Department of Education.

- a. INSTRUCTIONS. Except for those functions above described, Contractor is not required to comply with other persons' instructions about when, where and how he/she is to work.
- b. TRAINING. No additional training is required of Contractor based on prior proven ability to fulfill the contractual requirements. Any further training, except as required by the State of Indiana, is at Contractor's discretion and expense.
- c. INTEGRATION. The performance of services under this Agreement shall be at School facility from time to time selected by School.
- d. SERVICES RENDERED. Contractor is responsible for fulfilling the responsibility, and may do so either in person, or by employing his/her own person(s) to fulfill the requirements. Replacement(s) must be qualified and certified to instruct students and act as a facilitator to teachers in the subject field above described and shall at all times be approved by School.
- e. HIRING, SUPERVISING, AND PAYING WORKERS. Contractor has the sole right to hire and fire all workers who may work for him/her to fulfill the requirements of this contract. Contractor shall exercise all control, direction and supervision over such workers with respect to the physical details of the work to be performed and the manner in which the work is performed under this contract. School shall not, nor have the right to, exercise any control, directions or supervision over any of the same, other than as set forth for satisfaction of the terms of this Agreement.
- f. CONTINUING RELATIONSHIP. The relationship set in this contract shall end upon completion of contract requirements. Provided, however, both parties may agree to a new contract at the end thereof, but neither party shall be obligated to so renew.
- g. FULL TIME IS NOT REQUIRED. Contractor is not required nor expected to devote substantially all of his/her full time to the fulfillment of the services above described.
- h. PERFORMING SERVICES ON EMPLOYER PREMISES. It is required that all of the services shall be performed on premises and at locations determined by School based on students location.
- i. ORDER OR SEQUENCE. The choice of the order or sequence of performance of the contractual requirements shall be established by Contractor.
- j. ORAL OR WRITTEN REPORTS. Oral or written reports are required from Contractor when requested by the building principal.
- k. PAYMENT. This agreement calls for payment each second week on Friday as a convenient way of paying. Due to convenience to Contractor, School is requested to and shall withhold normal taxes from Contractor's payments. Full and final payment shall be made

within 14 days after completion of this contract.

- l. PAYMENT OF BUSINESS AND/OR TRAVELING EXPENSES. Traveling and other expenses of Contractor are not reimbursable, unless previously approved by the Superintendent.
- m. FURNISHING OF TOOLS AND MATERIALS. Contractor shall receive the opportunity to use office space and communication devices at School. Choice of tools and materials are for Contractor to determine, but Contractor shall use School approved instructional materials.
- n. REALIZATION OF PROFIT OR LOSS. Contractor in acting as an independent contractor providing student and teacher instruction and facilitation services is responsible for realizing his/her own profits or losses, depending on his/her expenses in providing the services.
- o. WORKING FOR MORE THAN ONE FIRM AT A TIME. Contractor is free to offer services to others besides School.
- p. MAKING SERVICE AVAILABLE TO GENERAL PUBLIC. Contractor offers his/her services as a consultant in the educational field to other school corporations and may continue to do so.
- q. RIGHT TO DISCHARGE. School does not have a right to discharge Contractor. However, either School or Contractor may terminate this independent contractor agreement by giving the other seven (7) days' written notice.
- 4. School shall defend, hold harmless, and indemnify Contractor from any and all demands, claims, suits, actions, or legal proceedings brought against her in her official capacity as independent contractor providing services for School, provided the incident arose while Contractor was acting within the scope of this Agreement with School. For this purpose, School will list Contractor as an "also insured" under School's liability insurance coverage. All actions, choices, and decisions made, which are customarily and usually considered within the authority and responsibility of an Indiana public school teacher, or which were made under apparent authority of statute or applicable common law or were specifically or impliedly authorized by the

Board, shall be considered within the scope of this Agreement for purposes of this provision. SO AGREED, this 24 + h day of 44 + h, 2024.
