We are continuing the same Focus and Artist studies as provided in the September newsletter. Please ask your artists about what they are learning and creating!

Kindergarten:

- Focus: Line and Color
- Artist: Jasper Johns
- Activities: Create letters and names using lines and explore color mixing to form secondary colors.

1st Grade:

- Focus: Color and Shape
- Artist: Howardena Pindell
- Activities: Design compositions with repeated shapes and primary/secondary colors.

2nd Grade:

- Focus: Line
- Artist: Charles McGee
- Activities: Draw organic lines and create relief sculptures with burlap and yarn.

3rd Grade:

- Focus: Line
- Artist: Joan Miró
- Activities: Draw with nondominant hand and eyes closed, then create abstract sculptures using Miró-like symbols.

4th Grade:

- Focus: Line
- Artist: K.A.W.S.
- Activities: Design art incorporating lines within



Music 📌 Kindergarten Focus:

Students will explore different ways to use their speaking and singing voices, as well as demonstrate musical understanding of fast/slow, loud/soft.

1st Grade and 2nd Grade:

Students will revisit pitches "So" an "Mi", and quarter and eighth notes through different musical activities

3rd Grade Focus:

Students will revisit pitches of "Mi", "So", "La". Students will also start learning how to play the recorder!

4th and 5th Grade Focus:

Students will revisit pitches of "Mi", "So", "La" and rhythmic understanding. They will also learn different "time signatures" and incorporate this knowledge into their compositions.

Grades K-2 - In September we learned how fire hydrants can be superheroes in <u>Lou</u>, and how algorithms are like pizza recipes in <u>Every Night is Pizza</u> <u>Night</u>. In October, we will continue making our way through the Monarch Award nominees and practice our STEM skills through building and typing practice.

Grades 3-5 - In September, we built "waterslides" and used Google Earth to learn more about characters' countries of origin in <u>Invisible</u>. In October, we will continue learning about our Bluestem award nominees, practice our STEM skills and learn more about the mystery/horror genre by writing our own stories. silhouettes of favorite characters, exploring the concept of art.

5th Grade:

- Focus: Line, Shape, and Color

Health Reminder


Welcome Back Washington Families,

Vision and Hearing Screenings

As part of our commitment to support the health of our students, we will be conducting our annual Vision and Hearing Screenings on **Tuesday, October 8th and Thursday, October 10th**. These screenings are essential in identifying potential issues that may affect your child's learning and development. Vision screenings will be conducted on students in Kindergarten, 2nd grade, New to the district, Students with an IEP and Teacher recommendations.

Hearing screenings will be conducted on students in Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, 3rd grade, New to the district, Students with an IEP and Teacher recommendations.





How to help prepare your child:

- Talk about the screenings
- For hearing screenings, the child will listen for a sound through headphones. They should raise their hand each time they hear a new sound.
- For vision screenings, the child will look at the "camera." It will be similar to taking a picture.
- Ensure corrective devices are worn: If your child wears glasses or hearing aids, please make sure they bring them to school everyday and especially on testing day.

After the screening: If any concerns are identified, I will notify you with a recommendation for further evaluation by a healthcare provider.
