Tips for a Positive School-Home Experience

Stay Engaged with School Communication: Regularly check emails, texts, and the school's website for updates and event notices.

Create a Structured Home Routine: Establish a consistent routine for homework, study time, and extracurricular activities. Include a dedicated space for studying that is free from distractions.

Maintain Open Communication with Teachers: Develop a positive relationship with your child's teachers by staying in touch throughout the school year. Don't wait for formal meetings—reach out when you have questions or updates about your child.

Be an Active Participant: Involve yourself in the school community by attending school events, the Principals monthly meetings, parent-teacher conferences, and volunteering. This shows your child the importance of education and community engagement while allowing you to build connections with other parents and school staff


Week of Respect | Oct. 7-11
