## **Alumni Update**

#### Keith Partington '79



On April 6, 2023, Keith Partington, VCS Class of 1979, shared a new chapter in his thirty-two-year writing journey with the 81,000-word Amazon release of his debut fiction novel, *Fraternal Resolve*.

Keith visualized the idea for his first manuscript on a late US Air flight from LaGuardia to Rochester

one evening in 1991 after delivering a sales meeting presentation with a day-in-the-life theme of working for Microsoft Corporation in Upstate New York.
The local landmarks such as Eastman Kodak, Niagara Falls, garbage plates, the Buffalo Bills, and Lake Ontario worked surprisingly well, with positive feedback from his tri-state colleagues. When he reached his gate at the Rochester airport, his twelve-pound luggable laptop

contained a roughed-out plan for a part-time hobby to weave a crime fiction story referencing various landmarks and products in our region. The pandemic provided an extended in-home period, a natural lever to finish the project. He was thankful that his VCS classmate, *David Cowles*, offered to create the final cover art, which finalized the project into a commercial reality.

Keith credits his family and friends for their encouragement to press through multiple versions of his writing project over the years. He also praises other authors, always willing to help with questions for his self-publishing plan, and raves about the tools and process through Amazon Kindle Direct Publishing. Keith also partnered with many area libraries to access new readers, including an idea to hand deliver copies during his Canalway Challenge 360 bike tour last year to 31 libraries along the canal path from Buffalo to

Albany. The New York State Canalway Challenge is a free recreation program that allows participants to set a personal mileage goal to explore the 524-mile NYS Canal System and the 360-mile Erie Canalway



Trail with a combination of walking, rolling, cycling, paddling, or running.

WGRZ aired a news story about Keith's writing and Canalway journey.

Fraternal Resolve is available in over 35 libraries throughout New York State. Keith also released a free eBook, The Canalway Challenge Library Tour, last

September that offers a unique view of the Canalway Challenge program. The eBook includes an elevator pitch description of 31 Canal town libraries along the trail. It is available in paperback, alongside paperback and large print editions of *Fraternal Resolve* at the Victor Farmington Library.


Keith encourages prospective authors to follow their dreams. He enjoys sharing feedback from his experience, a pay-it-forward offer based on all the



feedback he received along the way. Keith reports that the sequel to *Fraternal Resolve* will be available by the end of the year, and a draft for book three is under development.

Can you tell me how to get, how to get to Sesame Street?



# What did you do after you graduated from VCS?

I went to Hartwick College to study Geology. That didn't quite work out though, so I switched my studies to Political Science, focusing on Political Theory and Environmental Politics. While I was at college,

I worked for Hartwick's phone-a-thon program and later moved up into being a student worker in their Advancement Office. I also worked for Hartwick's team of students who operated the ropes courses and was part of the team who routed the first bouldering wall at Hartwick.

I ultimately found my way back to Hartwick a couple years after graduation and a few odd jobs here and there. I started working at Hartwick again in August of 2019, as the Alumni Events Assistant. The position started out as an alumni relations support position, but given my fundraising experience I took on annual giving responsibilities and became the Leadership Annual Giving Officer after about a year and a half.

I worked in that position for about two years before taking the role of Assistant Director of Donor Stewardship, at Hartwick. I decided that wasn't what I wanted to be doing at the time, so I switched to the



Student Experience Office at Hartwick in January of 2024 and have been the Assistant Director of Civic Engagement and Fraternity and Sorority Life ever since. In my current role I manage student volunteering opportunities both on campus and in relation with the City of Oneonta, assist Hartwick's Institute of Public Service in getting students registered to vote and bringing them to Oneonta's polling location if they don't have their own transportation. I also manage our on-campus Food Pantry and Professional Clothing Closet; both which service students in need. On top of that I'm the advisor for Hartwick's Habitat for Humanity Club and I'm on the trails Committee which manages the hiking trails we have on campus. Lastly, I'm the Chair of Hartwick College's Staff Council where I'm the liaison between the Staff of Hartwick and Senior Leadership Team, representing the Staff at President's Cabinet meetings and Board of Trustee meetings.



### What classes/activities and/or teachers at VCS most inspired you?

My involvement with the S.E.A.S. Club and the guidance of Mr. Cronmiller both really helped take my interest in environmental protection and stewardship to the next level. Mr. Cronmiller also had an interesting "History of the National Parks" class that I loved. In a similar direction, I had an alternative energy class with Mr. Selvek, which taught me a lot. Mr. Ojeda's Music History class has really stuck with me as well. I took a couple music history courses in college and still read books that focus on specific parts of music history to this day. ### How did your VCS education prepare you for work and life in general?

## What advice would you give to VCS graduates today?

When considering your first job, don't worry about finding your career. Find something that you're interested in or passionate about and get job experience that way. You can also meet

and network with people in those positions that could be helpful in the future.

In my spare time I love being outdoors; hiking, biking, paddling, playing frisbee. Listening to music and learning more about specific genres and cultures from music is also a big interest of mine. I inherited my grandfather's vinyl records in 2020 and that sparked an interest in me to start listening to music on vinyl. I go to a lot of concerts as well. The local music scene is fun in Oneonta, but I do find myself traveling to NYC or places in Pennsylvania for larger concerts.

#### Dollars for Scholars (cont'd from front cover)

Welcoming remarks were given by high school teachers and Co-Presidents of the VSP-DFS Laurie Fiorito and Julie Merges. Words of appreciation were extended to VCS educators, parents, guardians, family members and especially VSP-DFS donors. The financial support of community groups, businesses, individuals and school groups made possible the awarding of 136 scholarships worth over \$134,000 to 95 students.

Special recognition was given to Dr. Mike Spoon for his 31 years of creating the evening's video presentation and to Mr. Aaron Isaacs for controlling the auditorium sound and lights. Laurie Fiorito and high school teacher Dawn Knapp emceed the awards ceremony.

Seniors are requested to complete an online scholarship application which covers all scholarships. While the criteria for some scholarships emphasize scholastic aptitude, many do not. The criteria may be as specific as the college the graduate plans to attend or the student's anticipated field of study such as education, health-related, and vocational. Some scholarships are specific to sports participation, school activities, and community service.

All awards are chosen by a committee comprised of guidance counselors, administrators and teachers representing all departments. The selection process takes a considerable amount of time and the committee is extremely diligent in reviewing candidates and making sure the scholarship criteria is met.

Members of the VCS Class of 2025 will be able to complete the online scholarship application between November 1st, 2024 and January 31st, 2025. Students will be given additional information and instructions from Mrs. Fiorito and Mrs. Merges.

Since its initial awards night in 1989 the VSP-DFS has awarded \$2.5 million to over 3,200 VCS graduates. Anyone interested in learning more about the VSP-DFS program may contact Laurie Fiorito at fioritol@victorschools.org or Julie Merges at mergesj@victorschools.org.
