### **NJ STARS**

- ☐ Students who rank in the top 15 percent of their high school class at the end of either junior or senior year (self-report) may be eligible.
- ☐ Students must take at least 12 college credits per semester. NJ STARS will cover up to 18 credits per semester.
- ☐ Students must maintain continuous full-time enrollment for up to 5 semesters. NJ STARS resources are NOT available to cover any summer courses.
- ☐ Students must enroll in a full-time course of study no later than the fifth semester following high school graduation.
- ☐ Students must attain a GPA of 3.0 or higher by the start of the second year to meet the academic requirement for NJ STARS renewal.
- ☐ Students with a 3.25 GPA can qualify for NJ STARS II with participating NJ Schools. Amount not to exceed \$1,250 per semester.
- ☐ Family income must be less than \$250,000.

- ☐ Required now for graduation (2025-2027 classes)
  - Dreamers can submit NJAFAA

- ☐ Required for NJSTARS students and some scholarships as well
- ☐ Financial Aid Planning Meeting: 10/10/24 6PM in auditorium
- ☐ FAFSA Workshop: TBD (After December)

## JUNIOR YEAR CHECKLIST

- Focus on grades/GPA: speak to your counselor and find out class ranking and GPA. This is can be seen on Genesis under grading tab. Maintain or try to increase your GPA.
- Update resume
- Study for October PSAT: Tuesday Oct 22nd
- Attend local and regional college fairs: Oct 25th
- Register for ACT or SAT in Spring
- Finalize college lists: and visit choice colleges in summer before senior year (Naviance).

- Research colleges/majors through Naviance



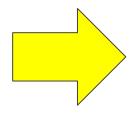

# Why take SATs and ACTs when Colleges are Test Optional?

- 1. To be considered for merit-based financial aid, and for outside scholarship applications
- 2. Some majors require standardized test scores Engineering, Accelerated programs for Medicine, Physical Therapy, PA), PreLaw,
- 3. If a student's GPA is below the middle 50% average of accepted for schools, a strong test score could help boost your academic profile.
- 4. "Honors" Colleges typically require SATs or ACTs

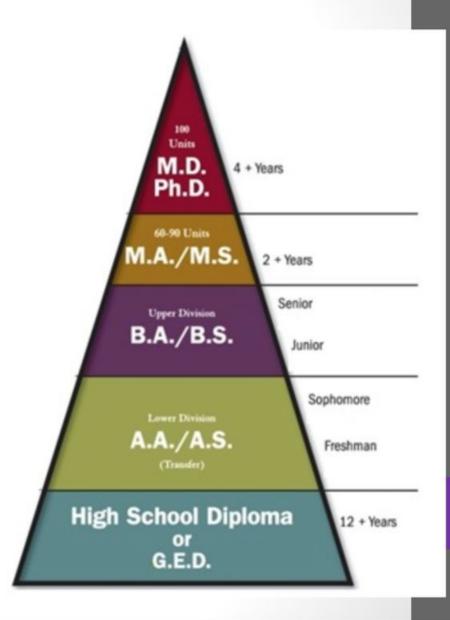

# College Speak

- Undergraduate: a college or university student who hasn't earned his/her bachelor's degree
  - → First four years of college!
- Graduate: a student who has earned his/her bachelor's degree and is studying for an advanced degree
- → after your first college degree

Examples: Master's Degree, Doctoral Degree, Law Degree



# COLLEGE APPLICATION DEADLINES

### EARLY ACTION

- · apply early, find out early
- can apply elsewhere
- not binding: can still choose another school
- indicates strong interest

# EARLY DECISION

- apply early, find out early
- apply ED to only one school
- binding: obligated to go if admitted & withdraw other applications
- indicates strong interest
- no chance to compare financial aid offers

### REGULAR DECISION

- apply by deadline & find out in spring
- deadlines vary
- commit by May 1

### ROLLING ADMISSION

- application open until college meets capacity
- apply when you wish, though there may be priority deadlines
- · find out in a few weeks

- □ Naviance will also help with your college application process.
  - -linking common app
  - -requesting letters of recommendation
  - -requesting Transcripts
- ☐ Your school counselor will send all documents to colleges and universities using Naviance.



Utilize Common App to apply to Colleges and Universities. Most schools utilize common app. If they do not, you will apply directly through the institution.

The common app is one application that will be submitted to all schools

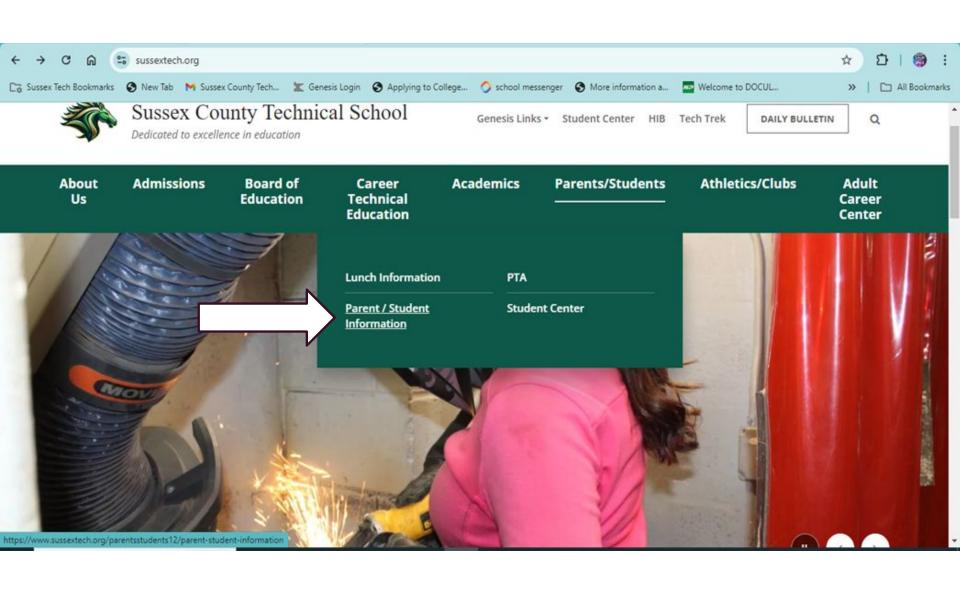
Do not do anything in common app until August ENTERING senior year. We will email all incoming Seniors when rollover occurs and students can log in to create accounts.

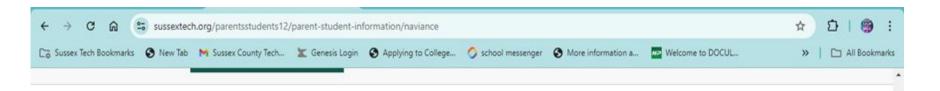

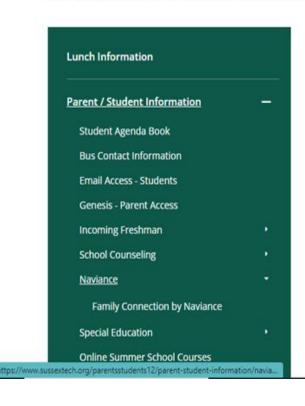

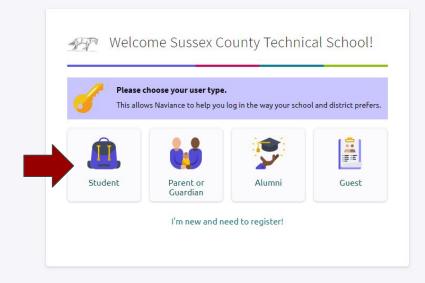
**Step 1:** On the home page, click on the "I need to register" link under Are you new here? Enter in the registration number which was given to you by your teacher or guidance counselor.
