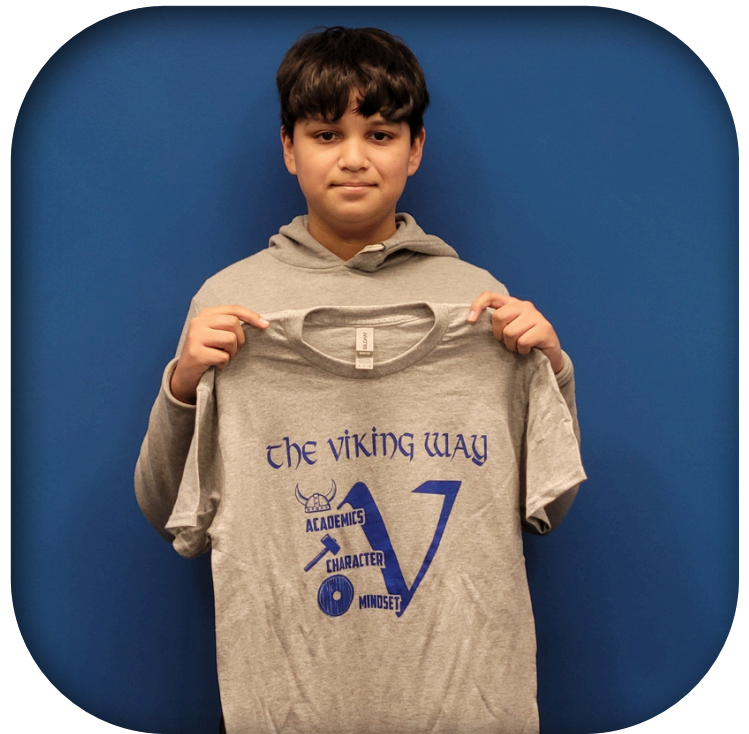

Most people do not realize that the roots for cardiovascular disease in adults often begin in childhood from age 10 and even younger. That's why it's important to make changes now to help your children and other family members eat healthy foods, stay physically active, and live tobacco-free.

As this year's coordinator, the students have shown a lot of interest and excitement in taking part in this year's Kids Heart Challenge. I will be sending home with each of them an information/money envelope along with this letter. This will have a listing of the prizes they can earn as well as your child's consent form. That's right, I said prizes! Students who collect money donations for their schools Kids Heart Challenge event will receive dollar amount prizes for their hard work from the American Heart Association.

**This year I am asking all parents to convert all cash and coins collected into one check. It makes it a lot easier to count the individual money collected and get it sent so the students receive their prizes sooner. If someone that donates wants to write a check, please ask him or her to write it out to the American Heart Association. I also encourage you to register your child online and collect money donations that way as much as possible. See the collection envelope for information to register online. I ask that you do not allow your son or daughter to go door to door asking for money donations. I would prefer that they ask friends and family for money donations. Parents may take collection envelopes to their place of employment if they wish. I am giving the students two weeks to collect money donations after the kick off to turn money donations back into me by November 6, 2024 or sooner.**

Kids Heart Challenge is a fun and effective way to teach heart-healthy living. It emphasizes the importance of physical activity as our children do something they enjoy. # Child Find

Lakeview Community Schools takes an active role in our students' education. According to NDE Rule 51, "All children with disabilities residing in the state, including children with disabilities who are homeless children or wards of the State and children with disabilities attending nonpublic schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, and who are in need of special education and related services, shall be identified, located, and evaluated and a practical method shall be developed and implemented to determine which children with disabilities are currently receiving needed special education and related services."

Child Find also applies to highly mobile children including migrant children, and children who are suspected of being a child with a disability and in need of special education despite that the child is advancing from grade to grade.

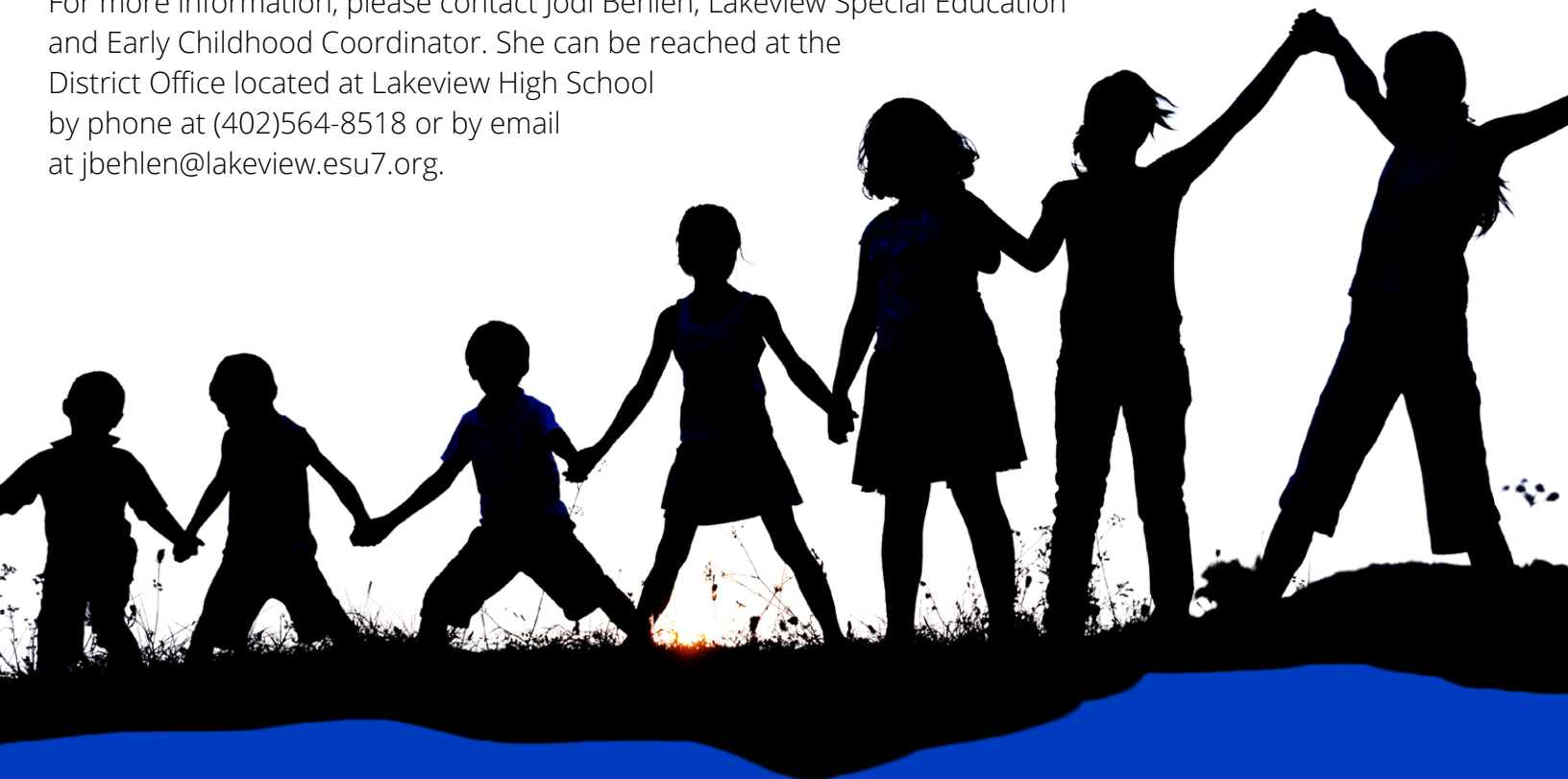
## Non-Public Student Child Find:

Child Find is the responsibility of the public school district where the accredited non-public school resides. For a non-accredited preschool, Child Find is the responsibility of the student's home district.

## Early Childhood Part B:

Lakeview Community Schools works with our Educational Service Unit #7, specifically their early childhood team to provide Child Find activities for children age birth-5. The Planning Region Team serves a 7 county area around Columbus. Examples of Child Find activities include banners/brochures set up at parent-teacher conferences, literature in doctor offices, mailings on talking to parents to all childcare providers.

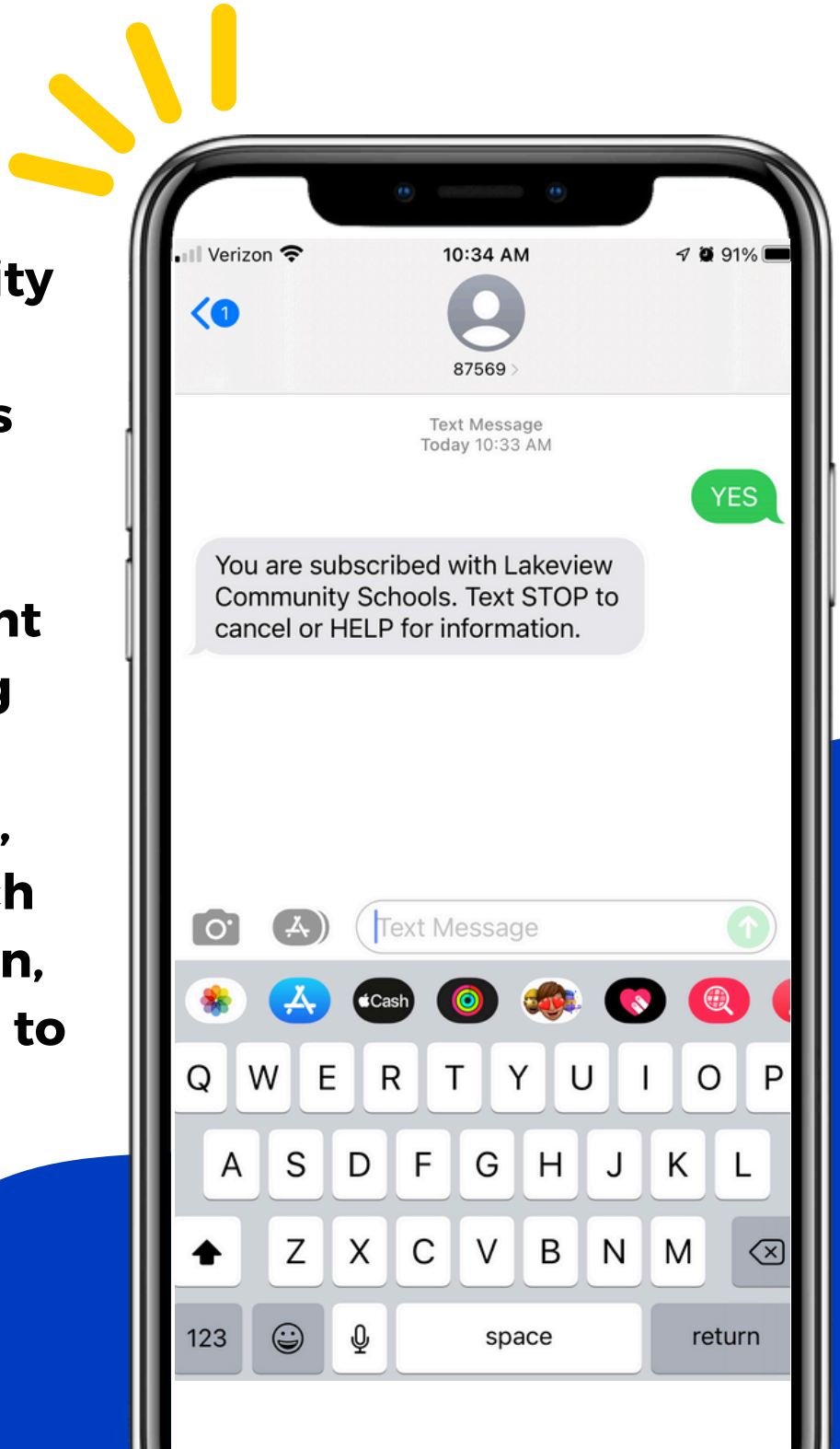

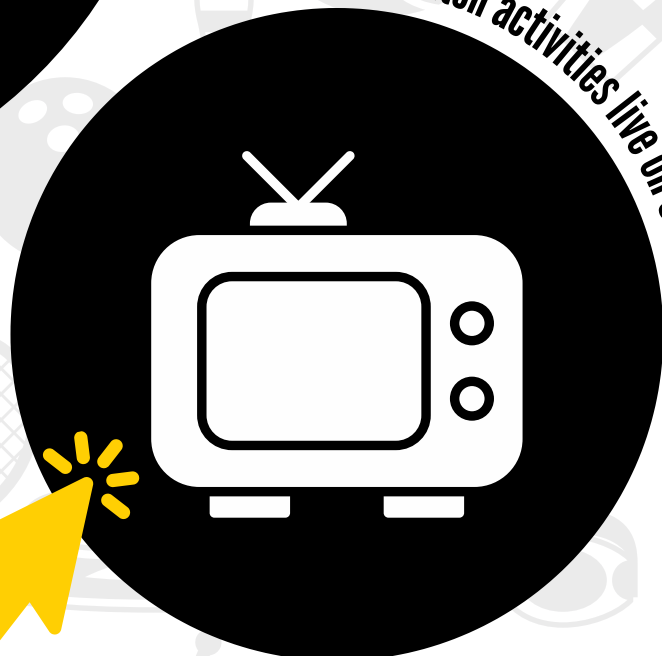
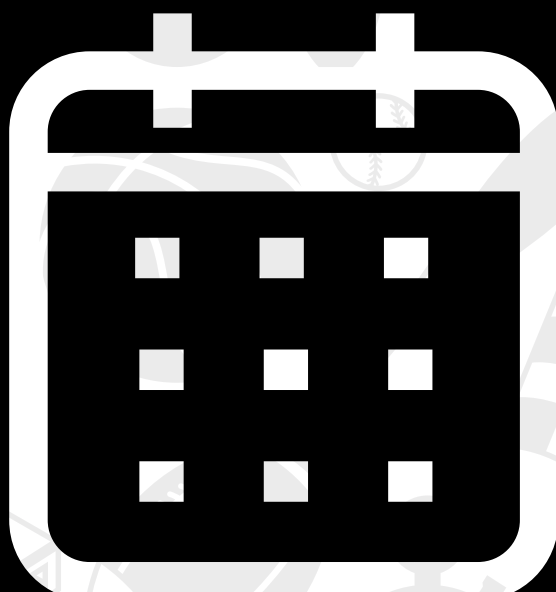

# NEBRASKA CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY LAW

New Law Following Passage of LB42 (effective January 1, 2019)



## Nebraska Child Passenger Safety Law Update

- Children ride rear-facing up to age two or until they reach the upper weight or height limit allowed by the car seat's manufacturer.
- All children up to age eight must ride correctly secured in a federally approved child safety seat/belt positioning booster.
- Children up to age eight must ride in the back seat, as long as there is a back seat equipped with a seat belt and not occupied by other children under eight years of age.
- Children ages eight to eighteen must ride secured in a seat belt or child safety seat (belt positioning booster).



Violation carries a \$25 fine plus associated court costs and 1 point may be assessed against the operator's driving record.  
(Statute # 60-6,267)

Nueva ley después de la aprobación de LB42 (vigente desde el 1 de enero de 2019)



## Niño Pasajero en Nebraska Actualización de la Ley de Seguridad de Nebraska para Niños Pasajeros

- Los niños viajan mirando hacia atrás hasta los dos años de edad o hasta que alcancen el peso superior o el límite de altura permitido por el fabricante del asiento para el automóvil.
- Todos los niños hasta los ocho años deben viajar correctamente asegurados en un asiento/cinturón de seguridad para niños aprobado por el gobierno federal.
- Los niños de hasta ocho años deben viajar en el asiento trasero, siempre que haya un asiento trasero equipado con un cinturón de seguridad y no sea ocupado por otros niños menores de ocho años.
- Los niños de ocho a dieciocho años deben viajar asegurados en un cinturón de seguridad o en un asiento de seguridad para niños (refuerzo de posicionamiento del cinturón).



*La infracción conlleva una multa de \$ 25 más los costos de la corte asociados y 1 punto puede ser evaluado contra el historial de manejo del operador. (Estatuto # 60-6,267)*
