Grades in Campus Portal

All grading information is available to families online through Campus Portal. You can go directly to Campus Portal from our Quick Links on the Deer Creek webpage. Gradebooks are updated each week, so this is a great tool for staying informed of your student's progress throughout the year. Trimester report cards are also posted to Campus, so you have access to those records as soon as they are finalized each term.

community organization or group is providing an opportunity for our students, the school will make flyers available to students and may include information in our newsletter.

There are some groups, however, that wish to personally distribute items to students. We do not allow distribution of flyers, materials, food, or fundraising materials on the school grounds that are not directly approved by the school. However, while we may prohibit the distribution on school grounds, the sidewalks along Columbine Drive are not school property and are public walkways. As such, we cannot prevent groups or individuals from lawful distribution. Some examples that have confronted schools in the area include the distribution of donuts by a local youth group, fundraising for other schools, passing out religious materials, or flyers for an after-school for-profit program.

Because we cannot prevent the distribution of materials on the public walkways, I encourage you to **talk frankly with your student(s) about not accepting materials from strangers** around the school grounds or as they walk to and from school. Students are under no obligation to accept anything offered to them.

As always, we will continue to supervise the school area before and after school to ensure student safety, and we will monitor any distribution of materials to make sure they are compliant with the law.

From the Dean

Students are settling into the routines of school quite well this year and we appreciate your support with setting them up for success each morning. If there is something we can help with, please reach out to teachers, counselors or other staff in support of your student. We are looking forward to a productive and fun school year.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience with drop off and pick up at school! By the looks of it, many have adjusted to avoid long lines and traffic jams, and we appreciate your help. PLEASE use the crosswalk on Columbine Drive to cross the street! It is not safe to cross in other areas and puts students at risk. Support the DCMS staff with safety by following this expectation, both student and adult.

Students watched a presentation covering information from the Jeffco Student and Parent Handbook and the DCMS Student Handbook. The presentation included highlights of each handbook, not the full content. Both documents can be found on the DCMS website under the Students tab. It is important for students and families to read through each document to understand the expectations, responsibilities and policies of the school and district. Each student took home an acknowledgement form to be signed and returned to their teacher. Please support your student and the school by reinforcing the policies and expectations for a safe and supportive learning environment.

Some additional reminders are provided below.

Student IDs: Students need their student ID every day at school, especially at lunch. Students who regularly come to lunch without their ID will be asked to contact a parent/guardian. Students may purchase another ID at school for \$5.

Attendance and Tardiness: Students should be in class and ready to learn by 8:50am. The doors open at 8:40 so having your student at the school at or before that time will ensure they will be on time for learning. Being late affects not only your student, but the teacher and the class. For a tardy to be excused, it must be called into the attendance line. A pattern of tardiness will result in consequences at school, so please help your student get to school on time. Being in school consistently offers students the best opportunity for learning and academic and social/emotional growth. Read the attendance and tardy policies in the DCMS Student Handbook for more information.

Phones: Deer Creek is a phone-free zone during our school day and students should have their phones stored in their lockers during classes and at lunch/recess. Read through the phone policy in the Student Handbook. We appreciate your support with keeping the focus on learning and reminding your students to keep their phones in their locker.

Engineering at Deer Creek Middle School

In **Engineering 1 - Flight and Space**, we are working with Newton's laws, and how aircrafts fly. Students have built prototypes and tested planes to start figuring out those concepts.

In **Engineering - 2 Design and Modeling**, we just finished up our first design challenge. Students built a prototype for a child with cerebral palsy to fit on their foot and ankle. We are now starting to dive into technical, multi-view sketches in order for students to solve their unit problem, which is making an orthopedic toy.



Updated COVID Guidelines

COVID Guidelines have changed and been updated.

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19, current guidance from CDC states that individuals should stay home and away from other people while they are experiencing respiratory virus symptoms that can't be explained by another cause.
- **You can go back to work, school, and other activities when, for at least 24 hours, your symptoms are overall improving and you have not had a fever without use of fever-reducing medication.**
- You can read more about CDC's updated guidance here: [CDC Respiratory Virus Guidance \[external link\]](#).
- CDC still recommends taking additional precautions for 5 days after returning to normal activities, since some people may still be contagious for that long after feeling better. If you have been exposed to someone who has COVID-19, you could take additional precautions such as wearing a well-fitted, high-quality mask around others for 10 days after exposure. You could also take a test on day 6 after exposure, and monitor yourself for symptoms. If you become ill with respiratory symptoms, you should follow the guidance above.
- Continue reporting to DCMS attendance if your student has Covid as we are tracking its prevalence in Jeffco.

Dear Families:

Panorama Education is a company who conducts student and family surveys in schools and districts across the country. Deer Creek Middle School will be giving students the Panorama Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Student Survey 3 times per year.

Content. The Panorama student survey gathers information on the following areas/competencies of social emotional skills:

- Self-Awareness
- Self-Management
- Social Awareness
- Relationship Skills
- Responsible Decision-Making

The results are compiled into both individual and group summaries of social emotional skill progress. These reports are used by district leaders and school staff to guide our development of school-wide, small group, and/or individual social emotional support. You will be notified if your child is invited to join a small group or individual intervention.

It is Voluntary. Your child does not have to take the student survey.

It is Confidential. No students will be identified in any public reports or publications. Individual student information (name, student number, school and grade) will be uploaded into the Panorama system, as with other Panorama surveys. Individual student data may be shared with school staff to provide instructional and social emotional support.

Timing: The survey will be administered in the fall, winter, and optionally in the spring. It will take about 10 minutes.


Stock the Snack Shack!
