Fall Conferences

- Conference Sign Up opens Monday Sept 30 and closes Thursday Oct 10.
- Review your student's Trimester 1 schedule and grades before signing up for conferences. You will only sign up for teachers that your student currently has in Trimester 1.
- Plan to bring your student with you to conferences.
- Conferences are scheduled with individual teachers and are 5 min in length, per teacher. You will move between teacher classrooms for each 5 min conference.
 Come prepared so you can make the most of your 5 minutes with each teacher.
- Conferences are optional and teachers' 5 min time slots are limited. Please
 prioritize scheduling with just the teachers you really need to meet with you do
 NOT need to schedule a conference with all teachers
 - If you do not need an in-person appointment with your student's teacher, please connect with the teacher and schedule an alternate method of communication.
- Due to a limited number of conference slots, you may not be able to schedule
 with all teachers you would like to meet with. In this case, please reach out to
 the teacher directly via email to request an alternate time to have a brief phone
 conversation.
- Please allow at least 5 minutes between teachers you sign up for, so you have time to move between classrooms.

Emergency School Closures

When weather is harsh, Jeffco may close schools to keep students and staff safe. Jeffco families and staff are notified via SchoolMessenger through phone call, email, or text message. You determine how you get messages by setting up notifications in <u>Campus Portal</u>. The district will place information on its hotline at 303-982-6600, on its website at <u>www.jeffcopublicschools.org</u>, on Facebook and Twitter. The local news channels are also alerted so they may broadcast school closures.

What are the possibilities during a weather situation?

2-hour delay schedule: A 2-hour delay at the start of school due to bad weather. A late start decision will be made as early as possible and direct notification will be by 6:00 AM. Buses are delayed two hours, and students are not expected to arrive at school until two hours after the regular start time. There will be limited staff at schools to supervise any early-arriving students.

Snow day: The determination to cancel school for an entire day will happen as early as possible. Families and staff will be directly notified by 6:00 AM.

Orange & Black Day is Tuesday, Oct. 31

Halloween is coming up and students can get into the spirit by participating in **Orange & Black Day on October 31.** Dig out your black and orange favorites from the closet and join in the fun. **Costumes at school are not permitted** - that includes Halloween masks, props, and make up - and all attire must meet dress code. From the Dean

Fall is here and with it comes cool mornings and beautiful afternoons. This is the time that we can also have some unpredictable weather. Remind your student to check the weather report each day and come to school prepared to go outside during recess. Students have 25 minutes of continuous outside time opposite their lunch every day and we will be outdoors whenever possible. Students must come to school prepared with a warmer jacket or coat for cool and even cold temperatures!

Families may not realize that students are expected to have their school ID every day, especially at lunch. Students scan their ID when getting lunch or snacks. With limited time for lunch, and all students having access to a free lunch, it is important that students have their ID to make the process efficient. Students without an ID must wait until all students with an ID have gone through the line and it takes more time without the ability to scan the ID. The fastest way to get lunch is to bring their student ID every day.

For students who have lost their ID, they must purchase a new one in the office for \$5. Students who continually fail to bring their ID to lunch will contact a parent/guardian to problem solve and could receive school consequences. Please help your student practice preparedness.

At Deer Creek we are committed to supporting your student and we need some help from families. If your student tells you something has happened at school or has a concern or challenge, please reach out. It is possible your student has not reported this issue to someone at school, or assumes an adult already knows something is wrong or challenging. There can be a difference with what is shared at home with what is shared at school, so we appreciate when a parent/guardian asks for more information. Check in with a teacher, counselor or admin if you need clarification, want to verify a story, or would like someone to follow up or check in with your student. We appreciate the opportunity to partner with you to support your Deer Creek Mountaineer.



Charge Chromebooks

As part of our PEAK expectations at DCMS, students are expected to bring a charged Chromebook to school every day. We understand that nobody is perfect and allow students to check out a loaner if they forgot their Chromebook or forgot to charge their Chromebook.

We have had over 200 daily loaner requests during the first month of school. Please help your student be successful by coming up with a charging plan to ensure that they are at 100% for the next school day. Here are some helpful hints for your student: Charge the Chromebook in the same spot each night.

- Charge the Chromebook in a family "common area" not the student's room.
- Set an alarm for 8:00 pm Sunday Thursday to charge the Chromebook.
- Make sure the charging light comes on, before you walk away. If it doesn't come on, check the charger at the outlet and at the charging block. Sometimes they get loose.
- Have an "assigned" outlet for each of your students. Keep the charger at the outlet. It doesn't need to be plugged in a day, but don't move it from it's spot.

Each student gets 3 "free" loaner Chromebooks. On their third time, students will have a problem-solving chat with Mrs. Zanetti to find a way to be successful. On the 4th time, Mrs. Zanetti will call home to discuss successful strategies. On the 5th time, students will have detention during recess. They will create a poster for the school to remind students to charge their Chromebook. Beyond their 5th time, students will do other acts of community service in the library, like reset Chromebooks.

Library Books:

The library is open and available for book check out. Books are checked out for 3 weeks at a time. There are no overdue book fines in Jeffco. However, a fine will be placed on your student's account for any books that are lost or damaged beyond repair.

We have been increasing our library collection to reflect the diverse population at our school. Please take a moment to read <u>this</u> <u>letter</u> regarding our library collection.
