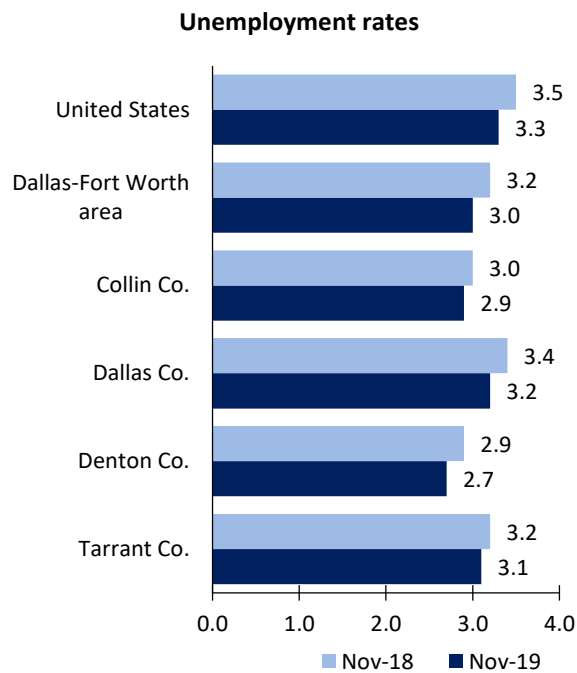


Dallas-Fort Worth Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates for the Dallas-Fort Worth Area, selected area counties, and the nation

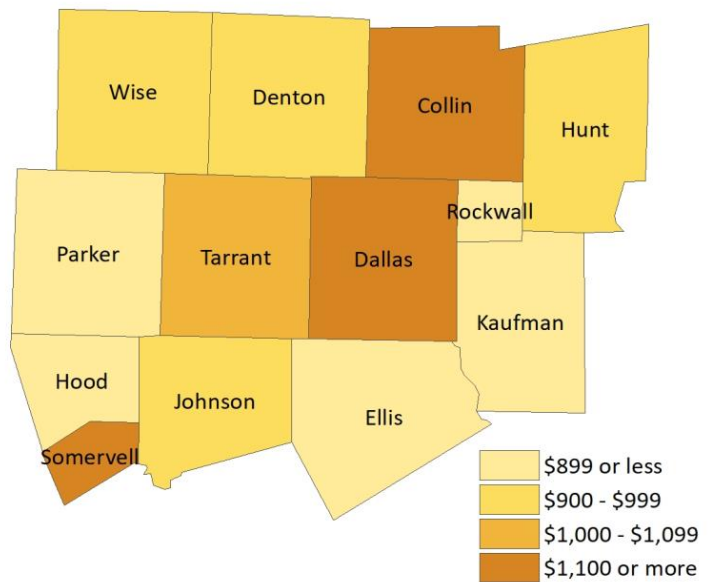

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

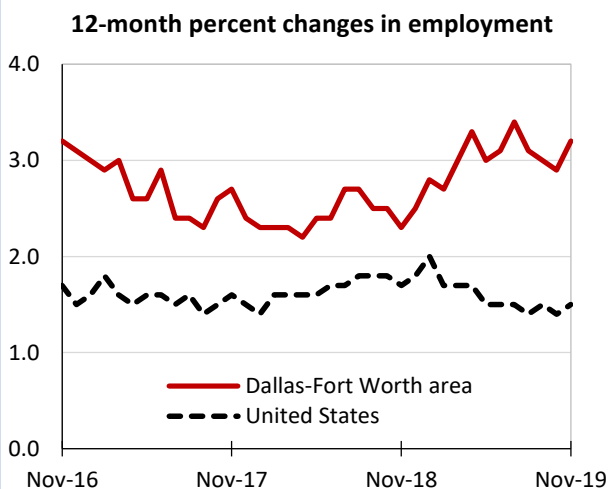
Dallas-Fort Worth area, second quarter 2019

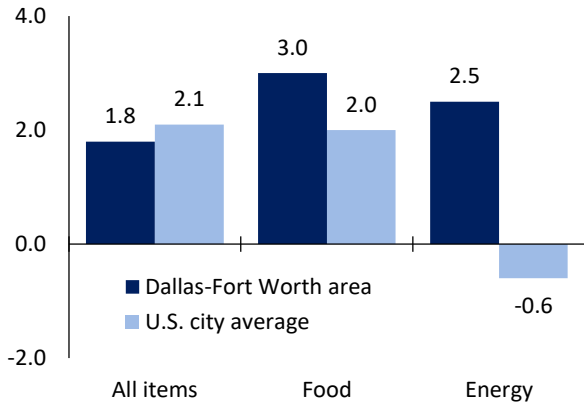

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

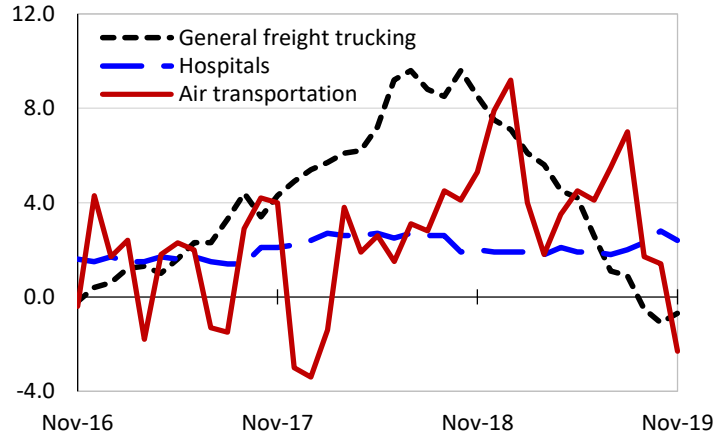
12-month percent change in CPI-U, November 2019

Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide

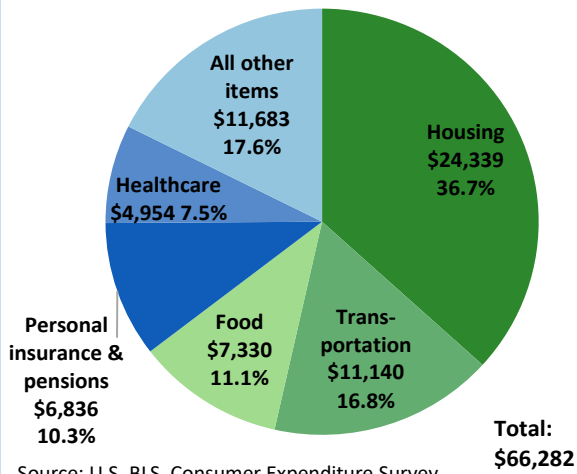
12-month percent changes in PPI

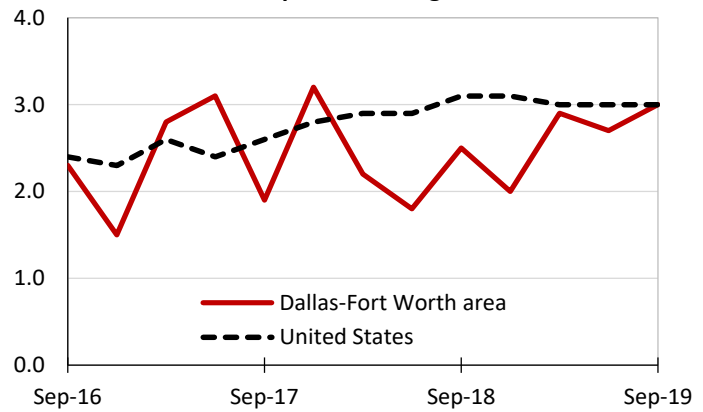
