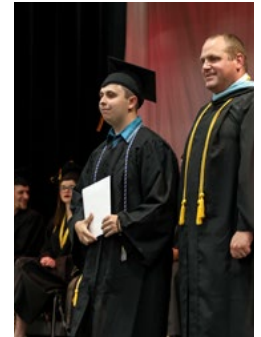
Congratulations

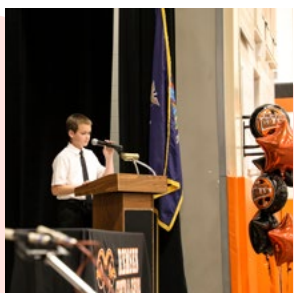


Sixth Grade Graduation

Scholar Athletes

At the conclusion of each school year, Section III athletics honors its member schools and their top senior athletes that excelled both in the classroom and on the playing field. The Section III Scholar Athlete Awards presented by Coca-Cola Beverages Northeast celebrates the accomplishments of the section's top scholar athletes and recognizes the achievement of each student. The best male and female scholar athletes from each of the 106 schools within Section III are honored with a \$100 scholarship, plaques and a commemorative program. This year's program, which awarded students more than \$25,000 in college scholarships to outstanding high school student-athletes, took place on June 13.

The Section III Scholar Athlete Award is the highest academic honor bestowed by the organization. To be eligible for selection, student-athletes must have maintained a cumulative grade point average of 90% or better, and have participated in varsity competition in a Section III sponsored sport. Other factors such as community service, exemplary citizenship or other extracurricular activities are taken into consideration. Twenty-eight of Section III's 179 scholar athletes are ranked #1 in their class and 145 of the 179 scholar athletes are ranked 10th or higher in their respective class.

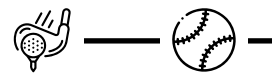
Breaking Records

Track & Field Class D Championship

On May 27, the boys and girls track & field teams competed at the Section III Class D Championships at Oriskany. Almost all Remsen athletes set new personal bests and had great performances. Individual sectional champions were Matt Murphy in the triple jump and 200, Ben Becker in the 110 hurdles, Ben Staskoski in the 400, Wyatt Ehart in pole vault and seventh grader Ella Lafave in the 400 hurdles. Even after only returning one scorer from last year's sectional champion team, the boys managed to finish second out of 14 teams. Without any graduating seniors, the boys will return their entire team next year. With some great performances, the girls managed a very respectable fifth out of 15 teams.



In addition to winning the 400, first year track athlete Ben Staskoski also set a new school record with a time of 52.21.

In addition to winning the 200 and triple jump, Matt Murphy also set a new school record in the 200 with a time of 23.46. The previous record had been held for 40 years.

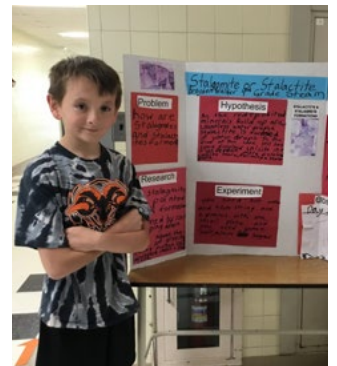
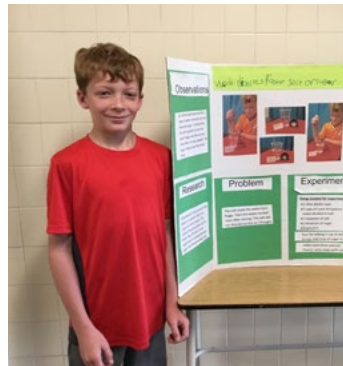

On May 24, the top 10 percent of the class of 2022 was recognized and treated to ice cream.

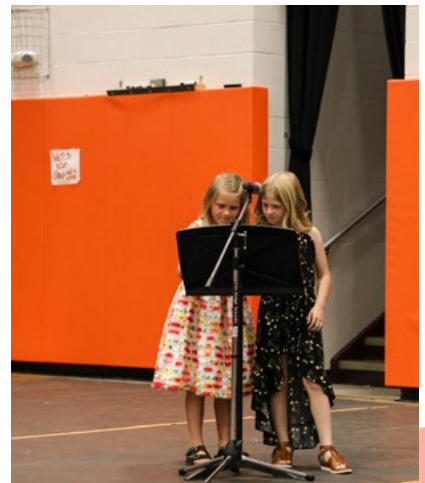
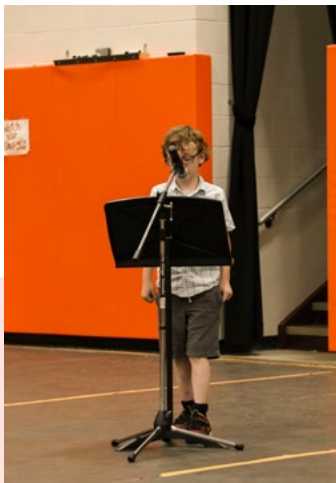
