Community members may come to walk or run on the track any time it is not in use by students. Please help keep our track beautiful - no pets, bikes or strollers.


# **Snow Closing Information**

The Remsen Central School District may have to make a decision to delay or close school due to weather or road conditions. When the weather requires closing or a delay, the district's automated phone system will be activated to let you know as soon as possible. The major radio stations in the Utica-Rome area, WBRV, Boonville, WIBX, Oldies 96, Big Frog 104.3, and Lite 98.7 and TV Channels 2-Utica, 3, 5, and 9-Syracuse, will also be notified to broadcast the information.

Occasionally, it is necessary to close school early due to rapidly deteriorating weather conditions or an adverse condition within a particular school. When this situation occurs, the district's automated phone system will be activated to let you know of the need for an early dismissal. Local radio/TV stations will also be notified. This information will also appear on the school district website (www.remsenscd.org).

Parents should make arrangements for the supervision of their children on "snow days" or in the event of an early dismissal. We recommend that such arrangements be made as soon as possible to be prepared for our upcoming winter months.

When Remsen schools are closed, all scheduled activities, events and programs in the schools for that day are cancelled. If there is a two-hour delay in the morning there will be no A.M. BOCES for that day. The school closing information applies to all students receiving transportation on Remsen Central School District buses, including out-of-district programs, BOCES students, and all others.



School buses are the safest mode of motorized transportation for getting children to and from school, but injuries can occur if students are not careful and aware when getting on and off the bus.

### **Top Tips**

- Students must wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before getting on or off and should never walk behind the bus.
- If your child needs to cross the street after exiting the bus, they should take 10 giant steps in front of the bus, make eye contact with the bus driver and cross ONLY when the driver uses the universal crossing signal to indicate that it's safe! Students should still look left, right, and left again before crossing the street.
- It is helpful for younger students to use handrails when boarding or
  exiting the bus. Be careful of straps or drawstrings that could get caught
  in the door. If your child drops something, they should tell the bus driver
  and make sure the bus driver is able to see them before they pick it up.
- Slow down and stop if you're driving near a school bus that is flashing yellow or red lights. This means the bus is either preparing to stop (yellow) or already stopped (red), and children are getting on or off.

#### **Winter Safety Tips**

- Allow extra time in the morning to get to your bus on time.
- Stand away from where the bus stops. Buses need extra room to stop when there is snow and ice.
- Dress properly. Winter clothing, hats, mittens and boots will help keep you warm.
- Don't play in the snow while waiting for the bus.
- Don't throw snowballs at the bus or anyone else.
- Don't slide on the snow or ice patches in driveways or on the street. You could slide underneath the bus.

We look forward to another safe school year transporting our students!

# **Extremely Cold Temperatures**

In Remsen we are very fortunate in that we have a facility that houses most of our buses. Normal route buses are parked in the bus garage and therefore the cold weather isn't often a factor in getting them started in the morning. Buses are started early and allowed to warm-up before beginning the routes. Please note that students who normally walk to school are encouraged to ride the bus on extremely cold days. If your child normally walks to school, they may wait with other students at a regular stop. If our drivers see a student walking to school on an extremely cold day, they will also stop and offer them a ride.

### Specific to the cold temperatures and wind chill:

- Frostbite can occur on exposed skin in about 30 minutes in adults at -25 degrees F and in as little as 10 minutes in adults at -40 degrees F. It takes less time for children.
- Frostbite can occur in children even before temperatures reach this low; it just takes a little longer.
- No one should be outside with unprotected skin with wind-chill factors -40 degrees F or lower.
- When wind-chills are -20 degrees F or below outdoor activities should be reviewed and possibly suspended.

Parents are ultimately responsible for ensuring that their children are properly clothed and not allowed to remain outdoors in extreme weather conditions. However, sometimes weather conditions change quickly and parents are caught off-guard. Please talk with your child and remind them about how to best care for themselves in adverse conditions.

Please know that extreme weather conditions are trying for all of us and there is no clear cut answer as to when schools should be closed and/or delayed. We will always do what we think is best for all students. The ultimate decision, however, remains with you, the parents. If schools are open and you feel as though the conditions are too severe to send your children, please exercise your right to keep them home.

Remsen Central School District has purchased a book vending machine through School Store Funds, PTG donation, Box Top for Education, Hannaford and Remsen Teacher Association donation.

The book vending machine lives in the Elementary School and is available for use by students who have earned token certificates. Classroom teachers have a few token certificates each month that they are able to give out to students for excellent behavior and/or great academic work. Principal Winghart also gives away two token certificates each week during announcements as well as upon witnessing excellent behavior or good citizenship. Token certificates can be redeemed at the end of each week for tokens to use in the machine. Each book costs one token.

### Remsen Pre-K Takes Part in Fire Safety Activities

Remsen CSD Pre-K, led by Ms. Spatto, spent two weeks learning about fire safety and what firefighters do. They discussed escape routes, stop/drop/roll, what's too hot to touch at home and what they should do if there is ever a fire.

# **Excelsior Scholarship Information**

The Excelsior Scholarship in combination with other student financial aid programs, allows students to attend a SUNY or CUNY college tuition-free.

### Eligibility

### An applicant must:

- be a resident of NYS and have resided in NYS for 12 continuous months prior to the beginning of the term;
- be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen;
- have either graduated from high school in the United States, earned a high school equivalency diploma, or passed a federally approved "Ability to Benefit" test, as defined by the Commissioner of the State Education Department;
- have a combined federal adjusted gross income of \$125,000 or less;
- be pursuing an undergraduate degree at a SUNY or CUNY college, including community colleges and the statutory colleges at Cornell University and Alfred University;
- be enrolled in at least 12 credits per term and complete at least 30 credits each year (successively), applicable toward his or her degree program;
- if attended college prior to the 2019-20 academic year, have earned at least 30 credits each year (successively), applicable toward his or her degree program prior to applying for an Excelsior Scholarship;
- be in a non-default status on a student loan made under any NYS or federal education loan program or on the repayment of any NYS award;
- be in compliance with the terms of the service condition(s) imposed by a NYS award that you have previously received; and time the award was received, and, if employed during such time, be employed in NYS.
