SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS NEEDED!

The Remsen Central School District is seeking per diem substitute teachers for grades K-12 for the 2019-20 school year.

The Remsen Central School District maintains an active list of substitute teachers who are utilized on an as-needed basis, to cover the classroom in the absence of the regular (full-time) teachers. The primary role of the substitute teacher is to continue student learning along the continuum, established by the teacher for whom he/she is substituting.

Substitute teachers, providing day-to-day service, are paid at the per diem rate, for the actual days worked. They do not receive any benefits. The Remsen Central School District substitute teacher rates are \$90.00 per day for non-certified teachers and \$100.00 per day for certified teachers.

Remsen Teacher Resource Center

Once again, the Remsen Central School District Teacher Resource Center has received funding from the New York State Education Department to continue their mission of providing professional development to teachers in the district. The Teacher Center is a small piece of the New York State Teacher Center Organization, a larger network of over 125 centers across the state. All Teacher Centers provide local support for faculty and staff. The goal is to provide professional development to teachers and staff, to positively impact the classroom and the community.

The Teacher Center at Remsen CSD was busy and productive during this last school year. Allowing teachers to design and develop their own professional development is a core part of their mission, and this past year they were able to support several professional learning communities (PLCs). Teachers worked together to develop curriculum, activities and systems in order to engage students at a higher level and increase their opportunities for success. Some of the areas developed by the PLCs were STEAM programs, ELA in the primary school, and social and emotional strategies. The Teacher Center also provided Google training and held a book study focused on resiliency by students in the classroom.

This coming year, there are plans to expand their assistance in several areas. Along with continuing the PLC programs, they will also offer professional development scholarships to teachers. These will allow for teachers to attend training opportunities outside the district. Another initiative the Teacher Center will support is the opportunity for teachers to enhance their instruction by learning about the latest educational apps available for iPads. Teachers who attend this training will be given iPads to use in their classroom during the school year.

The Remsen Central School District Teacher Resource Center looks forward to another great year supporting teachers as they support students!

STUCKES, SUMMER

This summer, about 40 intrigued Remsen Central School District students entering grades 3-7 participated in a STEAM camp, held at the Remsen Performing and Visual Arts Center.

Program instructors included elementary and high school teachers: Ms. Janice DiNitto, Mr. Richard Gallo, Mr. John Glass, Ms. Rayne Ives, Mr. Dan O'Brien, Ms. Amy Piaschyk, Ms. Jodi Richard and Ms. Kelly Runninger.

A Summer of Improvements in Remsen CSD

The summer has been a busy one in Remsen Central School District, with many improvement projects underway at both the elementary and Jr./Sr. high schools.

Projects that have taken place over the summer include:

CAPITAL PROJECTS

- Reconstruction of Jr./Sr. high school 1936 entrance steps and stone surround
- Jr./Sr. high school corridor locker replacement
- Boys and girls locker rooms renovations, to include updated lockers, bathrooms and shower facilities
- Improvements to the outdoor track (regrading and resurfacing) and softball fields (drainage)
- Removal and replacement of the elementary school roof
- Reconstruction of curbs and walkways at the elementary school, including pedestrian safety improvements
- Replacement of the lights along the driveway and elementary school bus circle
- Replacement of flooring in the elementary school cafeteria and gymnasium
- Multiple technological upgrades including cameras both inside and outside of the buildings and utilization of a system of card readers to control access to the buildings

It is anticipated that all of these projects will be finished by the beginning of the school year and ready to be seen and enjoyed by all.
