

Dear Parent and or Guardian:

We are requesting your assistance in identifying federally connected students for our Impact Aid federal grant program. The South Kitsap School District's operating budget is largely financed through state and local taxes; however, military bases and other federal properties are exempt from some local and state taxes. As a result, our school district does not receive all of the operating revenues that would normally be generated through the collection of these taxes.

The Impact Aid federal grant program provides funds to local school districts financially impacted by federal activities. These funds provide critical support to our students.

The survey to support our request for Impact Aid funds, is being conducted electronically through our Skyward Student System, family access and will be open October 1, 2024. Please take a moment and complete the survey. If you are <u>not</u> a federally connected family, there is an option to choose NO, please take the time to complete the survey, even if you are not connected. Participation is critical in the success of our survey.

Student Drop Off and Pick Up

Do you drop off or pick up your student in your personal vehicle? If you do, read on for some helpful tips to keep things moving smoothly!

-Students arriving in personal vehicles are to be dropped off and picked up in the gravel parking lot on the north side of our campus.

-Stay to the right side of your lane except to pass. If you have already dropped off or picked up, you are welcome to drive around other waiting vehicles so long as you can safely do so. Please do not stop in the passing lanes.

-Pull all the way forward in your lane to the front cones before stopping. This helps us get more cars through quicker.

-Be mindful that this is a very active parking lot. Always watch for students crossing!

-Use your turn signal early to help our parking lot helpers know what you intend to do and they can help keep traffic flowing.



Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a
 bully or facing some other difficulty.
- · By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- · By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- · Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- · Try not to schedule dental and non-urgent related medical appointments during the school day.
- . Keep your student healthy. If you are concerned about about a contagious illness, call your school or health care provider.
- If your children must stay home because they are sick, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- · Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- · Encourage your child to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Support your students if you notice signs of anxiety, and if needed, seek advice from your school or health provider

Communicate with the school

- · Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- · Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.

· Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.

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Hello Parents!

Below (next 7 pages) is the information regarding the system available to help you monitor your child's activities on their school issued accounts. Parent Reports and Portal

Lightspeed Parent Reports are available to SKSD parents and guardians interested in knowing more about their child's activity on an SKSD device. Parents can <u>opt-in via Skyward</u> to receive reports of their child's internet usage over the last 7 days. Our internet content filtering service, Lightspeed, provides a summary that recaps when the web is being used, top sites visited, and more. This allows parents to see their child's school and home internet activity for the past seven days and helps ensure they are safe and focused on learning.

What is the Parent Report Email?

Parents who have <u>opted-in via Skyward</u> will receive a Parent Report email (on Sunday mornings) sharing statistics about their child's browsing activity for the previous 7 days while using an SK-issued Chromebook. Due to a limitation between Skyward and Lightspeed, only the primary household for the student will be able to opt-in to receive the reports. Below is a sample of the email report delivered to parents.

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What is the Parent Portal?

The Parent Report email contains an invitation to Log In or Register for the **Parent Portal**. Click the button at the end of the Parent Report email to create an account. Creating an account for the Parent Portal provides web activity insights, including visited websites.

What does the Parent Portal Dashboard look like?

The dashboard summarizes the child's most recent browsing activity over the last 7 days, including times the sites were accessed. Click the date headers (Today, Yesterday, etc.) to expand that day's viewing history.

Parents and guardians with multiple children can select the child whose report information they would like to view within the Parent Portal.

How can I support my child with device use?

SKSD makes every effort to equip families with tools and information to ensure the safe use of SK-issued devices in the home. Filtering services provided in our schools - in compliance with minimum federal regulations for the protection of students - are extended to Chromebooks when they are used away from school. In addition to filtering services and tools like the Parent Report and Parent Portal, parent/guardian involvement is key for keeping students safe online.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I sign up for Parent Reports?

 Parents can opt-in to receive parent reports via Skyward. See the <u>LIGHTSPEED WEEKLY REPORT</u> <u>EMAIL OPT-IN</u>.

I signed up for Parent Reports but have not received them yet. Why?

 Check your email's spam folder. Your email provider might have flagged Parent Reports as spam. Reports are sent from <u>do_not_reply@lightspeedsystems.com</u> email address on Sunday morning. If you don't see the email in your spam folder, try manually adding the <u>do_not_reply@lightspeedsystems.com</u> to your email allow or friend list.

Can I pause web browsing on my child's device while they are at school or at home during the school day?

While your student is at school or home during the school day, they need to have filtered access to
websites as part of their instructional day. Teachers work in conjunction with the web filter to guide
student use during the school day.

Can I pause web browsing on my child's device outside of the school day?

- The Parent Pause feature has been enabled. Parents will be able to pause student Internet access during the time frames below. This is a daily setting currently. The Internet pause will be removed daily at 5:00 a.m.

Can I schedule the Parent Portal to pause web browsing at a specific time?

 There are currently no options to allow parents to set up a recurring pause or to adjust the times for holidays that occur during the week. Lightspeed is constantly working to improve its software, and we hope this feature will be added in the future. Can I block specific websites?

How do I stop the Lightspeed Parent reports? I have used the unsubscribe feature in the email, but the reports continue to arrive.
