Mr. John McKeown and Mr. Timothy Jenny held the Budget hearing presentation from 6:00 p.m. to 6:40 p.m.

Meeting called to order by Mary Lou Allen, Board President, at 6:41 p.m. following the budget hearing.

Pledge of Allegiance recited by all present.

Each individual speaker will be allotted three minutes. Elementary Principal's report given by Gary Winghart included the following items:

• **Upcoming Events:** May 8-12: Spirit week. May 12: Pre-K Mother's Day Event. May 18: STEAM Club Family Fun Night. May 25-26: Kindergarten screening. May 29: Memorial Day. May 31: Grades 4-6 Spring Concert. June 9: Elementary Career Day.

- **Arbor Day Assembly:** On April 28<sup>th</sup>, the Elementary school celebrated Arbor day with a special assembly and trees for every student provided by the Saratoga Tree Nursery. At the end of the day, all students came together for an assembly where Ranger Chris Pelrah and Forester Dan Welc spoke with the students about the importance of trees, how to protect and preserve forests, and the history of Arbor Day.
- **Personal Safety Lessons:** On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Sergeant Morgan visited the Elementary school to speak with students about personal safety. Ms. Kistowski and Sergeant Morgan met with kindergarteners, first graders, and third graders to discuss the importance of being safe and checking in with trusted adults.
- **NYS Assessments:** The NYS ELA Assessments began on April 19<sup>th</sup>. The NYS Math Assessments took place on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. All Assessments went well and all of the students worked very hard.
- Around the School: Spring Spirit Week: The Spring Spirit week is being sponsored by the Elementary Student Council. The students are enjoying the fun dress up days such as Wacky Inside Out Wednesday, Patriotic Day, and Black and Orange Day. Kids Heart Challenge: The students have raised close to \$5,000 this year for the American Heart Association during the Kids Heart Challenge Campaign. Water Safari Reading Challenge: Students have the opportunity to earn one free child admission to Enchanted Forest Water Safari theme park. Throughout the months of April and May students are challenged to read a total of 6 hours outside of school. Any student that logs 6 hours or more during the challenge will receive a ticket for free admission.
- New Elementary Lockers: Students in grades 4 through h6 are excited about the new elementary lockers. The orange and black lockers add a little color to the hallway and encourage Remsen pride.

High School Principal's report given by Sanya Pelrah included the following items:

- **Team Workshop and Instructional Focus:** There was a Staff-Led Professional Development on April 25<sup>th</sup>. This opportunity was designed by the High School Instructional Committee as a way for teachers to share their knowledge and learn from each other.
- Culture and Climate: at the end of the marking period, we did the Ram Ticket Drawings and our students were awarded \$25 gift cards. On April 27<sup>th</sup>, Ashley Neuschel from the Center of Family Life and Recovery, presented to grades 7-12 about the hazards of vaping. On May1, Mr. Bunker took a group of the 9th grade students to Law Day at the Oneida County Courthouse where students were able to learn about the legal system and talk to district attorneys. On May 4, Sergeant Morgan, from the Oneida County Sheriff's Office, presented the students attending prom about how to stay safe and make good decisions.

## • Clubs and Activities:

12<sup>th</sup> grade: The senior class has chosen to go to Niagara Falls for their Senior Trip on June 9<sup>th</sup>. The class was able to cover all major expenses.

11<sup>th</sup> grade: The 11<sup>th</sup> grade class participated in the Krispy Kreme fundraiser and are planning to survey their class regarding next years' prom and senior trip.

<u>Drama Club:</u> The members of the Drama Club enjoyed dinner and seeing the musical *Legally Blonde* in Utica.

FFA: The FFA Club is preparing for the FFA Plant Sale on May 16<sup>th</sup>. On May 18<sup>th</sup> the students will be competing in the Food Science and Agriscience Fair at the FFA Convention in Buffalo.

<u>International Club:</u> The club held a Cinco de Mayo meeting where members were able to make their own piñatas.

Music Department: On May 12 and 13<sup>th</sup>, students from grades 5-11 will be attending NYSSMA Solo Festival at Central Valley Academy in Illion, On May 20, the High School Band and Chorus members will be performing at the Remsen Arts Festival held at the Remsen Performing and Visual Arts Center. On May 24, the High School Band will be performing at NYSSMA Majors Festival at Holland Patent. On June 3, the High School Band and Chorus will perform at the Music in the Parks Festival held at Darien Lake. The Junior and Senior High School Spring Concert will be on June 7 at 7 p.m. in the High School gym.

National Honor Society: Members of the NHS participated in the Remsen Earth Day Cleanup on April 22.

Athletic Director's Report given by Dale Dening included the following items:

- Important Dates: May 11: Modified Track & Field Meet. May 16: Track & Field CSC League Championships at Waterville. May 21: Sectional Seeding Meeting Baseball/Softball. May 22: Sectionals at Carlowden Golf Course Varsity Boys Golf. May 23: Sectionals at Kannon Valley Golf Course Varsity Girls Golf. May 26: Track & Field Class D Championships at West Canada Valley.
- **Spring Sports:** In grades 7 12 there is approximately 60% of our students participating in modified and varsity spring sports.
- Senior Recognition Dates: May 9: Varsity Track & Field vs. Poland, NY Mills. May 18: Varsity Baseball and Varsity Softball vs. Poland.
- Combinations: Cross Country Old Forge and Remsen (Host) for boys and girls at the modified level for the Fall 2023 season. Football Remsen and Holland Patent (Host) for football at the modified, JV, and varsity levels for the Fall 2023 season.

Facilities Report given by Kevin Roberts included the following items:

- 2023 Capital Outlay Project: New Elementary lockers. Most of the lockers have been installed.
- Next Capital Improvement Project: The scope of work has been determined. The district is working on financial piece.
- Lead in the Drinking Water Testing: The NYSDOH has lowered the threshold for lead in the applicable water outlets from 15ppm to 5ppm. This new round of testing must be

- completed between 1/1/2023 to 12/31/2025. The testing must be conducted on a triannual basis after the test is completed. Currently awaiting direction from the OHM BOCES Safety Office on further guidance.
- **Easter Sunday Electrical Brown Out:** We suffered damage from the electrical brown out on Easter Sunday. Voltage dropped to around 60 volts in the area and lasted around 4 hours. The brown out damaged the 2 Variable Speed Pump Drive Controllers at the High School. The speed pumps have been disassembled with the help of Trane technicians and are waiting for parts to rebuild.
- **Department Updates:** One of our retirees has been filling in for our injured grounds worker.

Transportation report given by Adam DeGrace included the following items:

- **Bus Inspections:** There was bus inspections of buses 99, 94, 96, 11, and 15. All buses passed inspecting making this the fourth year of buses passing inspections within the first inspection.
- **Bus Fleet Updates:** The buses are in good condition. Orders for next years' supplies are being placed. The new Suburban is now in service and we have handed the old Suburban to the Senior Custodian, Kevin Roberts.
- **Bus Driver News:** All drivers are current on their qualifications. Our trainee passed their road test 1<sup>st</sup> time up. Mrs. Justine Johnson has been a great help during the training process. Our team is working on summer maintenance.
