• Mr. McKeown and Mr. Jenny discussed the recommendation to fund an additional Capital Reserve in preparation for the upcoming Capital Improvement Project. A potential referendum in May to create said reserve was also discussed.

Discussion of Capital Project Scope Items

- Mr. Jenny shared with the Board that the facilities team had been working with the architects and engineers to work on prioritizing items on the project list. He shared that while there are many items on the project list, the team must work to prioritize the most important project items to fit within the envelope of an upcoming Capital Project. Mr. Jenny invited board members to share any thoughts or priority areas that they had at the top of their list so that he could bring these items back to the facilities team as they continue to work on the project scope.
- Mrs. Allen proposed that the BOE continue to have the facilities team, in coordination with the facilities director, Mr. Kevin Roberts, complete the prioritized list to share with the Board.
- Mrs. Karis stated that the athletic fields should be considered since they are unplayable
 when it is very wet with such poor drainage. She reminded everyone that a game had to
 be canceled halfway through due to poor field conditions and that the modified field was
 not playable.
