Archie Williams High School: Situated on a 21 acre campus, Archie Williams High School (AWHS) is the Tamalpais Union High School District's second high school to open in 1951 and was named Sir Francis Drake High School through May 2021. Located in the Ross Valley, Marin County, Archie Williams serves the West Marin communities, Fairfax, and San Anselmo. AWHS is an academically rigorous and innovative curricular program. Our school was a part of a systematic change movement in the 1990's to provide small learning communities (SLCs) for our 9th and 10th grade students. We continue this tradition in order to provide a personalized academic and social/emotional approach to learning. All 9th and 10th grade students are placed in one of our six SLCs to receive parts of their core academic education. Much of our educational approach involves curricular integration and project-based learning. Archie Williams offers three integrated Academies for students in their junior and senior year who are interested in communication (ComAcad), environmental studies (SEA-DISC) or an experiential learning model (TEAM). Archie Williams is also proud to offer a four-year Engineering program, Peer Resource and numerous elective course offerings. 84% of our students are UC/CSU eligible.

Course Offerings: Archie Williams's curriculum emphasizes a college preparatory program but provides for all levels of ability and interest. Course offerings range from Advanced Placement and Honors classes to academic support for those who need extra help. Eleventh and twelfth grade students may choose a traditional curriculum or an integrated, project-based program mentioned above. Extracurricular Program: We believe in a strong connection between a student's activities and a student's academic success. Athletic teams for all students include soccer, volleyball, football, tennis, water polo, cross-country, basketball, wrestling, track and field, softball, baseball, swimming and diving, golf, lacrosse, field hockey, mountain biking. Dance team adds to the great spirit at Archie Williams and an active student leadership program provides a variety of student engagement and activities as well as service to the community. Students pursue individual interests in many organized clubs and internships.

Length of Semester/Day Archie Williams High School has two semesters and 180 school days. Students are required to take six classes per day and may choose to take seven. Monday classes are 50 minutes in length. Tuesdays through Fridays are block days when classes meet for 90 minutes for each block period. Tutorial meets twice on Wednesdays for 40 minutes each.
