SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Villa Park High School is a comprehensive public school, grades 9-12. It is located in the heart of Orange County, and its approximately 2200 students live primarily in the adjacent cities of Villa Park (population 6,200) and Orange (population 143,000). The graduating class of 2022 had 589 seniors. There are 96 teachers and 46 support staff. Villa Park High School is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and is a California Distinguished School.

STUDENTS

Villa Park High School supports a diverse student body. Our 2,060 students come from many different countries of the world, and a percentage of our students self-identify with multiple ethnicities.

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


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ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT DATA



CURRICULUM

At Villa Park High School, the academic program utilizes a Modified Block Schedule where each Monday is a traditional schedule with periods 0-6 day, and Tuesdays through Fridays feature alternating odd periods (0-1-3-5) and even periods (0-2-4-6). On traditional Monday schedule classes are 47 minutes long while block schedule periods are 100 minutes each. Zero period is 50 minutes and is held every school day. Students are enrolled in six year-long courses where they earn 5 credits per course totaling 30 credits per semester. Students may enroll in a zero period class or a 7th period class when available.

GRADES AND CREDITS

Honors and Advanced Placement courses are weighted on a 5-point scale with all other classes on a 4 point scale. We do not rank students.</p>
