# Structured Literacy Module 8: Time to Grow!

Module 8 will continue to focus on different types of r-Controlled Vowels. Each week of this module, we will focus on a new form of the r-Controlled Vowel being learned and have time for review previously learned r-Controlled Vowels. When r follows a vowel, it changes the way we say the vowel sound. We call this vowel + r combination an r-controlled vowel.

## Phonics Focus: *r*-Controlled Vowel /or/ as in *or*, *our*, *ore*

Grapheme	Rule		Examples	
or	The r-controlled vowel or makes the /or/ sound. This grapheme is usually found in the middle or at the beginning of a word.	fork	north	thorn
ore	The r-controlled vowel <i>ore</i> makes the /or/ sound. This grapheme has a silent e and is usually found at the end of a word.	chore	tore	wore
our	The r-controlled vowel <i>our</i> makes the /or/ sound. This grapheme is a less common spelling.	four	pour

## Phonics Focus: *r*-Controlled Vowel /er/ as in *er*, *ir*, *ur*

Grapheme	Rule	Examples		
er	The r-controlled vowel <i>er</i> makes the /er/ sound. This grapheme is the most common spelling of the /er/ sound.	ladder	her	teacher
ir	The r-controlled vowel <i>ir</i> makes the /er/ sound. This grapheme has a silent e and is usually found at the end of a word.	first	bird	chirp
ur	The r-controlled vowel <i>ur</i> makes the /er/ sound. This grapheme is a less common spelling.	fur	blur	nurse





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# Phonics Focus: *r*-Controlled Vowel /ēr/ as in eer, ear

Grapheme	Rule	<u>S E</u>	Examples	
eer	The r-controlled vowel eer makes the /ēr/ sound.	deer	sheer	cheer
ear	The r-controlled vowel ea <i>r</i> makes the /ēr/ sound.	gear	ear 5	year

or	The r-controlled vowel <i>or</i> makes the /er/ sound. This grapheme follows the consonant <i>w</i> and at the end of a two-syllable word.	worm work world doctor major	
ar	The r-controlled vowel <i>ar</i> makes the /er/ sound. This grapheme comes at the end of a two-syllable word.	dollar polar solar

Have your child practice writing sentences that use the Irregular (Heart) Words. Your child can write their own sentences or you can think of a sentence and have them write what you say.




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# Word Mapping Mat

Directions:

- Choose words from the Module to practice. You can also use words from previous Modules. Print as many times as needed for practice or use a plastic page protector and dry erase marker to make this reusable.
- Say It: Say the word. Then have your child say the word three times.
- Tap It: Say the sounds in the word while tapping one star for each sound.
- Map It: For every sound you hear in the word, draw one circle in a box.
- Graph It: Write the graphemes (letters) that represent the sounds you hear (one sound in each box).
- Write It: Write the word three times. You can also have your child use the word in a sentence.



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
