In Module 9, we will learn how to divide syllables in words that have a V/CV or VC/V pattern. The phonics focus skills will be Vowel Team oo and Vowel u that make the /oo/ sound and Vowel Teams oo and ou that make the /o/ sound.

Focus Skill: Syllable Division V/CV

Rule	Routine
The Tiger Rule applies when there is one consonant between two vowels. When a word has one consonant between two vowels, the Tiger Rule tells us to divide after the first vowel (V/CV). The first syllable is open, making a long vowel sound.	 Look for the vowels. Notice that there is one consonant between two vowels. Use the Tiger Rule to break the word into smaller chunks between the first vowel and the consonant that follows. Blend the syllables together.

Focus Skill: Syllable Division VC/V

The Camel Rule applies when there is one consonant between two vowels. When a word has one consonant between two vowels and the Tiger Rule does not work, the Camel Rule tells us to divide the word after the consonant (VC/V).		 Look for the vowels. Notice that there is one consonant between two vowels. Try the Tiger Rule. If it does not sound right, try the Camel Rule. Divide the word after the consonant. Blend the syllables together.

Phonics Focus: Vowel Team oo and Vowel u as in /oo/

Grapheme	eme Rule		Examples		
00	This is the vowel team oo. A vowel team is a combination of letters that represent a single vowel sound. When the vowels o and o are together, they work as a team to make one sound. One sound the vowel team oo spells is /oo/	book	good	hook	
u as in /ŏo/	Sometimes the vowel u does not make its short or long sound. When those sounds do not work, try the /oo/ sound.	push	put	pull	

Phonics Focus: Vowel Team oo and ou as in $/\bar{u}/$

Grapheme	eme Rule		Grapheme Rule Exam		Examples	
00	This is the vowel team oo. We already know this vowel team spells $/ \overline{o} o / $ like in the word book. The grapheme oo can also spell $/ \overline{u} / $, like in the words goose and boot. The vowel team oo as $/ \overline{u} / $ is usually found in the middle of a word but can also be found at the beginning or end of a word.	goose	food	broom		
ou	The vowel team ou as $/\bar{u}/$ is a far less common spelling of $/\bar{u}/$; however, this vowel team can be found in the middle of words like soup and youth.	soup	group	youth
