Notes from the Counseling Department

Career of the Week: Radiologic Technologists

"<u>Radiologic technologists</u> perform diagnostic imaging examinations on patients. <u>MRI</u> <u>technologists</u> operate magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scanners to create diagnostic images" (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2023). To <u>become</u> a <u>radiologic or MRI technologist</u>, one must complete an accredited training program and obtain certification from a governing agency such as <u>JRCERT</u>. In addition, radiologic and MRI techs must be <u>licensed in CT</u>.

The national median salary is \$76,020 per year and the profession is expected to have *faster than average growth at 6% through 2033* (BLS, 2023). Note that the average salary in Connecticut for <u>radiological/MRI techs is higher</u> at \$85,380 per year (BLS,2023). College of the Week: Quinnipiac University

<u>Quinnipiac University</u> (QU) is located in Hamden, CT and was originally <u>founded in 1929</u> as the Connecticut College of Commerce. Today QU has become a vibrant university consisting of 9 schools and colleges, including a medical school and a law school. Nearly 6,300 undergraduate students are enrolled and choose from <u>100 majors/programs</u>. Some of the most popular majors include accounting, business management, marketing, communications, allied health and social sciences.

The Bobcats offer 21 <u>NCAA Division 1 athletic teams</u>, in addition to the many <u>club</u> and <u>intramural</u> sports teams on campus. There are approximately 175 active <u>clubs and organizations</u> to choose from as well. Annual tuition is <u>\$55,480 (2024-2025)</u>; housing and meal plans will cost an additional \$17,260 per year.


