Resources or Distractions?

Should Phones be Allowed in Classrooms?

Phones are important for many reasons. They help us get information, communicate with our friends, and connect with the whole world. Even though phones are so great, should we be allowed to have them with us during the day? Are they an important tool we can use throughout the day or just a distraction?

Twenty students were asked what their take on this idea was. There were 18 people that said that students should be allowed to have their phones in class. Most people agreed that we should be able to have our phones during an emergency situation.

One student said, "I believe students should be able to have their phones with them because there are certain situations in school where students need to have the ability to contact a guardian."

Some of the students mentioned that they would also like to be able to go on their phones when class is over or to listen to music while doing independent work. Phones could also be used to check updates for upcoming events and easier access to apps like Gmail and Google Classroom. For students participating in high school sports, they mentioned that being able to see practice updates or game changes as soon as they come out is very helpful.

One common theme among almost all the "yes" answers though was that there needs to be limitations. Many students said that you should have to keep it in your backpack and not have it out all class.

A student mentioned, "I think it is reasonable for there to be restrictions on when they are allowed to be used in the classroom."

A couple responses said that phones need to be put away during specific circumstances including tests and quizzes. People were also saying it is important for students to be responsible with their phones. They were saying that if students were being accountable with their devices, then they shouldn't be a problem.

A student that mentioned this said, "I think phones can be used in positive ways, but they can also be a distraction during lessons. It depends on how kids use their phone, if they are good or not."

The other 2 students said that phones should not be allowed in the classroom. These students believed that having your phone on you during class would be too much of a distraction.

A student stated, "I believe that the productivity of students would decrease."

Other points mentioned were not being able to completely "lock in" during classes and not being able to put your focus towards getting good grades.

Some of the teachers have made their own decisions on the topic. There are teachers that make you give them your phone as soon as you walk in the door. Other teachers will ask you to use your phone to take photos of whatever is on the board. Many students agreed that it was ultimately the teacher's decision on what they did with their phones.

Some comments were, "Teachers should be able to make the students take their phone to a 'phone jail' if they have it during class when they should not be on it," and, "I feel as if students should be allowed to carry their phone with them during class, but if they were to get caught it should be taken away."

No matter what your opinion on the topic is, make sure to respect your teacher's decision.


Knockout Cancer

Is Justin Fields The One?







Senior Tanner Cunningham's 30-yard touchdown from Strader put the Rams up 22-0 after one quarter. Pine-Richland would keep their foot




She always helped me when I needed it. Our relationship is built on shared memories, laughter, and, sometimes, fights.


