As a reminder, this is in our Employee Handbook: FIELD TRIPS: Field trips are events that students attend that differ from the normal, routine location of students in their educational program. Field trips should be well-planned and organized with definite objectives and must be pre-approved by your supervisor. Notification of such trips must be turned in to the supervising coordinator/director/designee as far in advance as possible so that any schedule changes can be made. If transportation is required, early notification is especially important. All students attending the field trip must return a permission slip signed by their parent or legal guardian. This permission slip should include the purpose of the trip, who is supervising the trip, the destination, and the duration of the trip.



Freshwater Education District welcomes new comfort dog

Students and staff at Freshwater Education District in Wadena recently welcomed a new four-legged student this year — a golden retriever affectionately named Buckie by students.

Buckle is a certified and trained comfort dog and will assist the district with a wide range of needs including helping students who are struggling with behavioral issues or experiencing stressful circumstances during the school day.

This past May, Jena
Osberg, who serves as the
Freshwater Academies
site facilitator, set out to
raise funds to purchase a
comfort dog after a
chance encounter with a
lost puppy in the school's
parking lot left a lasting
impression on both students and staff. Osberg

said the reaction to the puppy by students was very positive and inspired her to learn more about the benefits of a comfort dog in a school setting.

Osberg said students were aware the district was raising funds to purchase a comfort dog that would be arriving in the fall and the dog would need a name.

"Our mascot here at school is the Bucks and so one of the students said the dog's name should be Buck for sure,"
Osberg said. However, the
dog was a female and the
next best thing was to
name her Buckie to make
it more feminine, she
said.

"We do a thing here where every new student puts their hand print on the wall and it shows that they are part of our school now. The same student that named her also said that Buckie needs to

be included by adding a paw print to the wall," Osberg said.

In addition to individual contributions made through the district's online donation form, Osberg sent out letters to local organizations and clubs and attended area meetings with Lions, Elks, and Rotary clubs throughout the region. With the donations and grants the district received from the community, they were able to purchase a comfort dog from the Texas-based company Interquest

"It was really fun to see that generosity come out," Osberg said. "We tend to be in our own little bubble here and you reach out when you have to, but this just created such a nice feeling of community and support," said Osberg. "Numerous people reached out to learn how they could help school district's behaviorand made donations." al specialist, is Buckie's

In addition to donations Osberg wrote and received grants to help fund the purchase and care of Buckle from Sourcewell, Astera Health Foundation and the Corey Borg-Massanari Foundation.

Trent Becker, the

school district's behavioral specialist, is Buckie's handler and Osberg said the addition of a comfort dog will allow Becker to better serve students.

"Trent, who is Buckie's handler, unfortunately has to come in when kids are in a difficult place, so they are not always happy to see him but when he comes in with Buckie, it has already had an impact and that is exactly what we wanted," said Osberg.
