MTSS News

Freshwater's MN MTSS leadership team is continuing their work evaluating Freshwater's level of implementation, building a plan for continuous improvement and monitoring the implementation process again this year. The first meeting of the school year was on August 20.

Here's a refresher on what MnMTSS is:

The Minnesota Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MnMTSS) is a systemic, continuous improvement framework for ensuring positive social, emotional, behavioral, developmental, and academic outcomes for every student. MnMTSS provides access to layered tiers of culturally and linguistically responsive, evidence-based practices and relies on the understanding and belief that every student can learn and thrive. In addition, it engages an anti-bias and socially-just approach to examining policies and practices and ensuring equitable distribution of resources and opportunity.

READ ACT

The Read Act for Minnesota schools is legislation designed to improve literacy outcomes for students. It mandates that schools provide early and effective reading instruction, especially in the early grades (K-3), and includes provisions for screening, intervention, and progress monitoring to ensure students are on track to meet grade-level reading expectations. The act also emphasizes professional development for educators in evidence-based reading practices and requires schools to involve parents in supporting their child's reading development. The overall goal is to ensure that all students are proficient in reading by the end of third grade.

We will be implementing Phase 1 this school year. Phase 1 focuses on establishing a strong foundation in early literacy for students in kindergarten through third grade and for students receiving special education services. The key components of Phase 1 include:

1. Screening and Identification: Schools are required to conduct early and regular screening assessments to identify students who may be at risk of reading difficulties. These assessments help educators determine which students need additional support.

2. Evidence-Based Instruction: The act mandates that reading instruction in K-3 is grounded in scientifically-based reading research. This includes explicit and systematic instruction in the five essential components of reading: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.

3. Intervention and Support: For students identified as at risk of falling behind, the act requires schools to provide timely and targeted interventions. These interventions are designed to address specific areas where a student is struggling.

4. Progress Monitoring: Schools must continuously monitor the progress of all students, particularly those receiving interventions, to ensure they are making adequate progress toward reading proficiency.

5. Professional Development: Educators are provided with professional development opportunities focused on evidencebased literacy instruction, enabling them to effectively support students' reading development.

6. Family Engagement: The act emphasizes the importance of involving families in their children's literacy development. Schools are encouraged to communicate with parents and provide them with resources to support reading at home.

Overall, Phase 1 of the Read Act is about early identification, effective instruction, and intervention to ensure that all students are on track to becoming proficient readers by the end of third grade.

What does this mean for Freshwater?

All **Early Childhood Teachers** will be trained in LETRS EC (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling for Early Childhood). LETRS EC is a professional development program designed to provide educators with in-depth knowledge and skills in teaching reading. It is based on research in literacy and language development and focuses on the foundational components of reading, such as phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. LETRS training equips teachers with evidence-based strategies to effectively teach reading and spelling, especially for students who struggle with literacy. The program emphasizes understanding the science of reading and applying that knowledge to improve student outcomes in the classroom.

All other **special education teachers** will be trained with the Online Language & Literacy Academy (OL&LA). OL&LA is an online professional development program designed to help educators improve their literacy instruction skills. It offers training modules based on the science of reading, covering key areas such as phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension. The program is flexible, allowing teachers to learn at their own pace, and focuses on applying evidence-based practices in the classroom to support all students, particularly those who struggle with reading. The OL&LA aims to enhance teachers' effectiveness in fostering literacy development in their students.




8. Minnesota Harvest Apple Festival
