## NOTE FROM THE HEAD

Greetings Sage Ridge Community Family and Friends,

I am pleased to share the impact of your generosity, volunteerism and support of Sage Ridge School. 2023-2024 marked our 25th anniversary, and this milestone year included many highlights for Reno-Tahoe's only non-sectarian, independent, college-preparatory school.

The revival of the Annual Fund after a brief hiatus, with a "25 Years, 25 Days" campaign, was a huge success. As our primary annual fundraiser that supports vital operational resources for our school that tuition alone does not cover, our community rallied to exceed our fundraising target of \$250,000. Similarly, our "Fire & Ice" Gala surpassed fundraising goals in support of the Opportunity and Teacher Funds, which fund Sage Ridge Scholars and above-and-beyond faculty needs like STEM equipment, updated VR software for experiential learning, play rights for theater, grades 3-12 robotics equipment and more.

Another incredible highlight was the fall soft opening of the Sage Ridge School E.L. Wiegand Student Activity Center, which marked an important milestone in Phase One of our Achieve, Innovate, and Magnify (AIM) Capital Campaign. The Wiegand Student Center fulfills a dream of so many: to provide our students with a new "heart" at the center of our school's campus while serving the broader Northern Nevada community. We could not have raised the more than 8 million dollars for the Wiegand Student Center without you. A point of pride for our community, the completion of the Wiegand Student Center marks the first new building on our 44-acre property in 20 years. The momentum for the next phase of the AIM Capital Campaign is strong and includes the Innovation Center and 350-seat Theatre.

Beyond monetary donations, volunteerism within and beyond the school fuels and strengthens our Scorpion Community. Our community gathered donations over the holidays to support local families in need and our youngest, 3rd-grade students raised money, which was matched by a parent employer, and compiled care kits to support teens through a local charity, the Eddy House. Our Middle and Upper School students volunteered at the Humane Society and students sewed blankets from material donated by Patagonia for the homeless within our community. These actions not only impact the well-being of our broader Northern Nevada community, but they also bring our pillars of respect, courage and community to life and give our students important opportunities to practice kindness and empathy for others – critical life skills to become curious and confident citizens with exceptional intellect and character.

In addition to celebrating the past 25 years, we looked ahead to the next 25 through our re-accreditation and strategic planning work. Every five years, our school reaffirms who we are and what we aim to achieve as we complete our re-accreditation with the Northwest Association of Independent Schools. Through this work, the Board, administration, faculty and staff recommit ourselves to high standards for all students. Our focus is on rigorous subject matter that stands the test of time; extensive opportunities to engage in research, problem-solving, writing and speaking; a view on character, including the development of empathy, altruism, and an appreciation for the richness of diversity; close and mutually respectful relationships between faculty and staff and the students we serve; and use of technology in ways that enhance the student-teacher relationship rather than erode or replace it.

The impact of the school, both within the broader community and for the students and families we serve, remains incredible. I am optimistic for the next 25 years, in large part because of the strength and commitment of our community. Your generosity, involvement and passion make our vision to inspire passion and purpose through the joy of learning achievable, and I wholeheartedly thank you for your continued support and participation.

#### RHEA SKARIA '25 NAMED 2024 HARVARD PRIZE BOOK AWARD WINNER

Skaria received the 2024 Harvard Prize Book Award from The Harvard Club of Northern Nevada and the Sierra in a ceremony on May 4, 2024 at our E.L. Wiegand Student Activity Center. Sage Ridge History Dept. Head Ms. Stephanie Deveza-Porter wrote a recommendation letter for Skaria detailing her "intrinsic motivation to learn, her abilities as a leader, and her passions both in and out of the classroom, along with her compassion for the community." Harvard Club President Jeannie Reeth introduced Skaria and her academic, extracurricular and volunteer accomplishments noting, "Rhea is an outstanding student at Sage Ridge School with a 4.4 cumulative GPA and a challenging course load of AP classes."

#### 2023 AP SCHOOL HONOR ROLL: PLATINUM DISTINCTION

The College Board named Sage Ridge School to the 2023 Advanced Placement (AP) Program School Honor Roll in October 2023. Sage Ridge earned the platinum distinction based on results from the 2022-2023 academic year. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening access. During the 2022-2023 school year, Sage Ridge School had 95% of its seniors take at least one AP exam, 89% of seniors scored a 3 or higher on at least one AP exam, and 47% of seniors took five or more AP exams. Nineteen AP courses were offered during the 2022-2023 academic year including AP Psychology, AP Environmental Science, and AP Computer Science. Recognition for the 2023-2024 academic year will be announced by the College Board in fall 2024.



#### SAGE SESSION

Every May, Sage Ridge students in grades 3-11 experience Sage Session, a Sage Ridge signature program of elective and enrichment classes taught by Sage Ridge faculty. These courses enhance our students' core curriculum and are a favorite time of year for our Scorpions. Examples of some classes offered in 2023-2024: Physics of Flight; Engineering and Design with Robots; Stocks, Bonds, Options and Investments; What the Art? An Exploratory Guide to Nevada Arts and Culture; History of Pirates and Ballet & Musical Theater Jazz.



#### PERFORMANCES THAT EMPOWER: AMPLIFYING UNIQUE VOICES



From the courageous journey of a 15-year-old autistic detective in "The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time," to rediscovering one's inner child in "PAN" and the heartwarming acceptance of individuality in "Shrek the Musical," each performance showcased our students' commitment to respect, integrity, and courage. This season was marked by significant achievements, including "The Curious Incident" selection for the 2024 NV Thespians State Mainstage Showcase, marking the fifth mainstage selection in Sage Ridge's 25-year history. Neurodiversity Consultants Cady Stanton and Gillian Raymond played a pivotal role in guiding our students during rehearsals, further enriching the experience. Our winter play "PAN" saw our youngest Scorpions take center stage with a dynamic cast of students from grades 3-6, under the direction of Upper School Student Director Scarlett Lopiccolo '25. The season concluded with "Shrek the Musical," which brought together a diverse cast of Scorpions from grades 5-12. The success of our theatre season is a testament to the dedication, creativity, and passion of our award-winning student crew team. Their hard work ensures that Sage Ridge continues to share powerful stories with the Reno-Tahoe community.





#### SCORPION ART AT THE NEVADA MUSEUM OF ART & SHEPPARD GALLERY

Sage Ridge student Ana Treadway '27 was nominated for a Scholastic Art Awards American Visions Award, a prestigious award for "originality, skill and the emergence of a personal voice or vision" for her fashion piece "Beautiful Inside Out." Treadway's denim dress also won a Gold Key Award from the Scholastic Art Awards. Treadway created "Beautiful Inside Out" because she wanted to explore creating a piece where the outside beauty is a reflection of the beauty on the inside. 2024 Gold Key Award-winner Owen Heaphy '27 had his piece "Golden" on display at the University of Nevada Reno's Sheppard Contemporary Gallery. Treadway and Scorpions Addison Clark '25 and Ashley Friedman '27 were also awarded Silver Keys. Gold Key and Silver Key Award-winners were honored at the Scholastic Art Awards 2024 Award Ceremony. Twenty-one Scholastic Art Awards were awarded to 14 Sage Ridge students in 2024. Sage Ridge offers a robust arts curriculum for grades 3-12 and many Scorpions earn the opportunity to feature their work in galleries, magazines, or displays around the Reno-Tahoe community and internationally.

#### 2023-2024 ATHLETIC HIGHLIGHTS

- Sophia Soran '25 was the Nevada stat leader for Varsity Girls Basketball earning first place in the state for points per game, rebounds per game and steals per game. Soran played in the 2024 Northern Nevada All-Star Game.
- Varsity Track and Field State Champions Lauren Sherven '26 (1600m and 800m) and Caleb Mulvaney '25 (long jump) led a team of medalists: Beatrice Liwanag '26 (2nd for 800m, 3rd for 1600m), Andrew Zhang '26 (3rd for 200m, 4th for 100m), Sophie Najjar '26 (4th for 200m, 100m) and Jeremy Gupta '25 (6th for triple jump, long jump). State Champion Mulvaney also placed 2nd in high jump.
- Varsity Swim Team's Zach Power '25 was named 2024 NIAA 3A State Champion in the 100-yard fly. Addison Clark '25 placed 3rd at State for 200-yard free and 4th for 100-yard free. Jensen Wu '27 placed 4th for the 50-yard free and 100-yard breast.
- Morgan Hayes '26 placed 5th at 2023 NIAA State Varsity Golf Tournament and 1st at the 2023 Regional Tournament.
- Owen Higgins '28 was named Middle School Track and Field State Champion for 200m hurdles. Sage Ridge also placed 2nd in long jump and 400m and 3rd in 3200m, 100m, 200m and 80m hurdles.

### **COMMUNITY**





# ACHIEVE, INNOVATE, MAGNIFY

Sage Ridge School is dedicated to expanding its campus to meet the evolving educational and facility needs of our growing community.

### 24,000-SQUARE-FOOT E.L. WIEGAND STUDENT ACTIVITY CENTER OPENS NOVEMBER 2023

Sage Ridge School opened the doors of the E.L. Wiegand Student Activity Center to the Scorpion community for the first time on November 17, 2023. Students, parents, grandparents, grandfriends, graduates and donors came to celebrate inside the new space together after a reception in the Webster Building for Sage Ridge School's annual Grandfriends Day.

The new 24,000-square-foot Wiegand Student Center includes the 13,000-square-foot Ernest J. Primm Gymnasium with a bleacher seating capacity of 875. The facility also features a state-of-the-art fitness center, modern locker rooms including the Joan M. Primm Girls Locker Room, an athletic office, concession stand, concourse, trophy case area and multipurpose academic and social Cory and Deborah Clemetson Lounge and the Primm Family Lounge.

The soft opening began with a ribbon-cutting ceremony, entering the building together as a community for the first time. Sage Ridge Coordinator of Student Life Mrs. Elyse Bozsik and student emcee Owen Heaphy '27 led the student portion of the event which included community cheers with the Sage Ridge Sting Squad, student performances, and recognition of our grandfriends and Sage Ridge athletics, theatre and clubs. Even the University of Nevada, Reno Wolf Pack cheerleaders and mascots Alphie and Luna joined the party!





Sage Ridge School's "Achieve, Innovate, and Magnify (AIM)" Capital Campaign funded the construction of the Wiegand Student Center. This campaign is part of a broader effort to expand Sage Ridge's 40+ acre campus to best meet the educational and facility needs of our growing community. Upcoming phases include the development of an Innovation Lab and a Performing Arts Theater. The Wiegand Student Center is the home to Sage Ridge athletics, community events, graduate gatherings, youth sports tournaments, academic competitions, and special events.

"The build-out of our campus would not be possible without the generosity of our capital campaign donors who have donated more than \$8 million to build this amazing facility for our students," Sage Ridge Head of School Dr. Ginger Hovenic said.



#### **CONQUERING MILES IN HONOR OF KONNER ROBISON '14**

Sage Ridge alumni Tera Robison '14, Nathan Hayes '15, Stuart Hayes '17, Rachel Matsumura (SRS 5-9) and Jenna Matsumura (SRS 5-8) participated in the 178-mile Reno Tahoe Odyssey Relay Run Adventure in loving memory of Sage Ridge graduate Konner Robison '14. As a student at Sage Ridge, Konner created the Scholastic Gateway Fund with the Community Foundation of Northern Nevada (CFNN) to put technology in the hands of students in need, raising \$143,011 for Northern Nevada students from 2012 to 2014. Konner was the first of only six Golden Scorpions in Sage Ridge School's 25-year history, meeting the award's exceptional academic, athletic and philanthropic requirements. Konner graduated from Stanford with his undergraduate and graduate degrees and Cornell with an MBA and J.D. Konner left a lasting impact on every community he touched. "If more people lived the way he lived, in wanting to help people, it would be a much better place," CFNN Philanthropic Advisor Lyndsey Crossley said. "A very tenacious and compassionate individual that would do anything to help."

#### **EMILY (PIERCE) LANCASTER '12 GRADUATES WITH PHD IN MARINE BIOLOGY**

Scorpion alumna Emily Lancaster celebrated her graduation from The University of Maine with her PhD in Marine Biology before embarking on her next aquatic adventure: Tenured track faculty position at Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Florida, which offers one of the best marine science programs in the country. In addition to teaching biological oceanography and invertebrate zoology, Lancaster started an environmental DNA (eDNA) lab. Lancaster's PhD studies used eDNA to detect invasive invertebrates in nearshore ecosystems in the Gulf of Maine. "eDNA is shed by all organisms in the environment," Lancaster said. "The cool thing about this is that we can use that DNA to detect the animal before we can see it with our eyes. The sooner we find invasive species, the better chance we have to battle them. If they take over, it becomes much harder. This is preventative work–like finding early-stage cancer."






## **GIVING OPPORTUNITIES**

#### **ANNUAL FUND**

The Sage Ridge School Annual Fund Campaign is our primary fundraising effort and the first gift we ask of our community.
