GUIDELINES FOR LUNCH VISITORS

Due to space and safety concerns, lunch visitors are subject to important guidelines:

- All lunch visitors must follow established check-in/checkout procedures and will receive a name tag upon arrival, which must be worn at all times while on campus.
- Lunch visitors are asked to follow the dining procedures in our *Lower School Handbook*, as follows: *"Parent/guardian lunches for students in kindergarten through grade 4 will be scheduled from October through April using the grade-level link available in the Parent Portal. (The link will also be sent in September.) Each family will be allotted three lunch dates within the school year. (Note: The lunch count is per family and not per child.) Please be aware that some dates may not be available due to previously scheduled events on campus. The school will limit the number of reservations per day to avoid congestion in the parking lot and within the school building."*
- St. Francis uses Veracross for scheduling family lunch dates to ensure efficient organization of highly attended dates when limited space is available.
- Students are not allowed to invite their friends to eat with their parents and them.
- No outside food is allowed.

New Attendance Line: How to Report Student Absences and Appointments

HOW TO REPORT UNPLANNED ABSENCES

When your child will be absent due to illness or for other unexpected reasons:

1. Notify us by emailing the new [Upper School Attendance Line](#), or submit an absence via your Parent Portal.
2. Please always provide the reason for the absence.
3. Report each day your child will be out of school; otherwise, your student will be counted as Absent Unexcused.

Please note: Letting teachers know of an absence is helpful; however, the US Attendance Line is monitored and is considered the “official” way to notify administration.

HOW TO REPORT APPOINTMENTS OR EARLY DEPARTURES

When your student needs to leave campus during the school day:

1. Please let us know in advance that your child has permission to leave campus by emailing USAttendance@StFrancisHouston.org or by notifying us through the Parent Portal.
2. When it's time for the student to leave, they should sign out with Upper School Office Manager Lydia Urbanek, and sign in with Ms. Urbanek upon their return to campus. (Parents do not need to sign for their students as long as parental permission has been given.)
3. If a student is attending a doctor's appointment, please provide a doctor's note.
