Credentials report pertaining to credentialed personnel, employed by local educational agencies across Santa Barbara County

Registration of Credentials or Other Certification Documents

The Santa Barbara County Education Office (SBCEO) registers credentials provided to all individuals throughout Santa Barbara County who have been issued credentials and permits by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC). (Education Code § 44332.5)

The content in this section of the report is informational.

Issuance of Temporary County Certificates

Temporary County Certificates (TCC) are issued by SBCEO to individuals during the interim period from when they apply for a credential with the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing to when they are issued or denied the official credential.

A TCC allows an individual to actively work and be paid for service in those positions for which the credential is required while they await final clearance of their credential or permit.

Temporary County Certificates must be approved by the County Board of Education. (Education Code § 44332)

The certificated and classified personnel reports are provided to the board as an information item.

Certificated Personnel Report

Certificated employees are those whose positions require a specific credential issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The certificated personnel report is generated regularly and includes all actions made regarding employment of certificated employees at SBCEO such as appointments and separations.

Classified Personnel Report

Classified employees are those whose positions do not require a state-issued credential. Since 1975, the Santa Barbara County Education Office has operated a Merit System for the classified service. Merit System law (Education Code § 45240-45320) provides that classified employees are selected, retained and promoted on the basis of merit and fitness, exclusive of discrimination due to actual or perceived race, color, ethnicity, age, religion, political affiliation, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation or national origin. The Personnel Commission, composed of three members, is the impartial body authorized by the state to be responsible for implementing and interpreting Merit System rules and adjudicating appeals on those facets of employment within its purview.

The classified personnel report is typically generated monthly and includes all personnel actions affecting classified employees at SBCEO such as appointments, changes to status, and separations.

Subject: 2024–25 County Office of Education Budget and Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)

Pursuant to California *Education Code* (*EC*) Section 1622(b), the California Department of Education (CDE) has reviewed Santa Barbara County Office of Education's (SBCOE) budget to determine whether it satisfies the following criteria:

- Complies with the Criteria and Standards for fiscal stability adopted by the State Board of Education.
- Allows SBCOE to meet its financial obligations during the fiscal year.
- Is consistent with a financial plan that will enable SBCOE to satisfy its multiyear financial commitments.

Based on this review, SBCOE's 2024–25 adopted budget is approved.

Additionally, this letter serves as formal notification that the State Superintendent of Public Instruction has approved the SBCOE's 2022–23 through 2024–25 LCAP for the 2024–25 school year, consistent with *EC* Section 52070.5(d).

The CDE notes that the 2024–25 negotiations with the certificated and classified bargaining units were not settled at the time the budget was adopted. To the extent that collective bargaining agreements result in additional ongoing costs, the CDE advises SBCOE that such increased costs should be supported by additional ongoing revenues or ongoing reduction of expenditures. Further, the Criteria and Standards specify that upon settlement, SBCOE must provide the CDE with an analysis of the cost of the settlement and its impact on the operating budget. The public disclosure documents prepared in compliance with *Government Code* Section 3547.5 can be used to satisfy this requirement.

The CDE appreciates the submission of SBCOE's budget and awaits its First Interim Report, which is due to the CDE by December 16, 2024. On behalf of the

SBCEO and Santa Barbara County School Boards Association (SBCSBA): Education Workforce Housing

CSBA's Daily New Roundup featured our recent Education Workforce Housing in Santa

Barbara County Online Panel Discussion. This informative discussion was well attended by superintendents; school board members; and education leaders in finance, facilities, and operations. The recording is available at www.SBCEO.org.

SBCEO and SBCSBA: New Candidate Workshop

This workshop, typically held every two years, is intended to provide prospective board candidates information about the Brown Act, closed session board meetings, and roles and responsibilities. This year's workshop will be held online on October 7.

SBCEO Leadership Retreat

All SBCEO managers and supervisors attended a full day SBCEO Leadership Retreat at Direct Relief in Goleta. After a 5-year hiatus, our team designed the day to reconnect with one another, build upon our collective knowledge, and deepen our understanding about the communities we serve throughout Santa Barbara County.

SBCEO DIVISIONS

Administrative Services Division

District Budget Approval: School Business Advisory Services (SBAS) district financial advisors have completed their review of districts' 2024-25 adopted budgets for compliance with state criteria and standards, to identify technical corrections needed, and to determine whether the budget will allow the local educational agency (LEA) to meet budget year and multiyear financial commitments. On or before September 15, SBCEO approved the adopted budgets for all twenty school districts.

Fiscal Year Close Out: Fiscal Services closed out the 2023-24 fiscal year and completed the required SACS Unaudited Actuals report. This year-end data will form the basis for the 2023-24 annual financial report and provide actual beginning fund balances that will be loaded into the First Interim report. The annual financial report will be completed by SBCEO's external auditors, who are scheduled to be on site November 4-8, 2024.

Curriculum and Instruction (C&I) Construction Project: Internal Operations has completed contract paperwork with PreCon Industries for the C&I first floor construction project. Staff is currently taking steps to prepare for the start of construction (preliminary pre-construction meeting, moving and storing furniture and material, etc.) which is scheduled to start October 30.

Curriculum and Instruction Division

LCAP: We thoroughly reviewed and approved all 20 district LCAPs. Each district and charter school will prominently post their LCAP on the homepage of their website, and

this year, for the first time, will upload their LCAP to the California School Dashboard. We will also post each district and charter LCAP on our website.

CALPADS Training Series for Leaders: In September, we hosted the first of three workshops for site and district leaders related to the data certification processes for our California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data Systems (CALPADS). Our state data system is used to maintain individual-level data including student demographics, course data, discipline, assessments, staff assignments, and other data for state and federal reporting and funding calculations. Data certification is a new area for districts to qualify for technical assistance. This proactive training is through a partnership with the CDE, California School Information Systems (CSIS), and several other county offices of education.

Free SBCEO Portal: We debuted the first phase of the redesigned SBCEO Digital Resources Portal at the most recent Curriculum Council on September 27. Schools and districts used to pay a subscription for portal use. By eliminating the for-cost resources, we have been able to provide direct access to the California State Library Online media resources by creating a secure, easily navigable portal of vetted, high-quality resources. On October 2, we hosted the COMPASS manager to demonstrate the breadth and quality of resources for our library media specialists. Each school principal received a flier with their school log-in credentials to provide to staff, students, and families. Our portal creates a distraction-free, ad-free space for research, inquiry, learning and exploration, with no data tracking or targeted content.

11th Annual A Salute to Teachers Gala: On Saturday, November 2, we will gather 300 honorees and guests at the Music Academy of the West to celebrate our Santa Barbara County Teacher of the Year, Performing Arts Teacher of the Year, three Distinguished New Educators, and three Distinguished Mentors. Actor and philanthropist, Duane Henry, will be our emcee. Student performances, film vignettes of each honoree, and a reception will unite educators and community members for an evening of celebrating outstanding educators and the field of education.

Breakfast with the Authors: The first of our academic events will take place on Saturday, October 19 in the SBCEO Auditorium. Community members of all ages will convene for a bibliophiles' brunch to interact with a panel of authors and illustrators around the theme: Just Keep Swimming; Navigating the Creative Midpoint.

We continue to grow! The need for services and programs is increasing, and the SELPA Joint Powers Agency (JPA) board recently approved the expansion of preschool programs in Santa Maria.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

2024-2025 CTE Educator Tour Schedule: The CTE department is introducing a new model for teacher tours this year. The 2024-2025 CTE Educator Tours will now be multidisciplinary, highlighting the connections across various industry sectors. This change was made based on feedback from both educational and industry partners.

The tours are a continued collaboration between SBCEO's CTE department and the Santa Maria and Santa Barbara South Coast chambers of commerce. They will take place in both north and south county, and will include CTE teachers, counselors, administrators, as well as related community college faculty.

Inspiring Performances at Kids at the Bowl: In early October, CCP presented the Dancing Wheels Company at the Kids at the Bowl event, in collaboration with the Santa Barbara Bowl Foundation. This inclusive performance, featuring dancers with and without wheelchairs, was attended by 3,000 students from 15 different schools. The event promotes messages of inclusion and accessibility, showcasing the arts' ability to break barriers and celebrate diversity.

Resident Artist Program Expands to More Schools: The Resident Artist program has launched in 37 schools for the 2024-2025 school year, bringing arts education to 206 classrooms and approximately 4,944 students so far. CCP continues to collaborate with districts to offer a broad range of artistic disciplines, ensuring students receive a well-rounded arts education. Exciting partnerships with other SBCEO programs, such as Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS) and Early Care and Education (ECE), are also underway. Through ECE, CCP will bring music and dance to our earliest learners in the Lompoc and Santa Ynez areas, further expanding arts access.

Children and Family Resource Services (CFRS)

Promotores Program Raises Awareness on the Dangers of Extreme Heat: In collaboration with the California Department of Public Health, the CFRS/Health Linkages Promotores Program is working to raise awareness among students and families about the increasing threat of extreme heat in our county. Extreme heat is not just uncomfortable—it can be life-threatening. Those most at risk include infants, young children, the elderly, individuals with chronic medical conditions, those on medications affecting heat regulation, outdoor workers, people without shelter, pregnant women, and residents in urban areas.

As trusted voices in the community, the promotores have shared life-saving information with 500 families on staying safe during heat waves. They have provided guidance on hydration, locating cooling centers, recognizing signs of heat-related illness, and accessing additional resources at CuidateDelCalorCA.com or HeatReadyCA.com.

Early Care and Education (ECE)

Strengthening Families in Our Community: The Early Care and Education (ECE) department has successfully launched several high-quality training opportunities this school year, focusing on enhancing the support they provide to families. Recently, ECE hosted a two-part series on the Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework—a research-based, strengths-focused approach designed to prevent child abuse and neglect by prioritizing family well-being and empowering families to build on their protective factors.

Two ECE team members, Monica Thorpe and Rebecca Arreola, have been certified by the Children's Trust Fund Alliance, reinforcing ECE's commitment to this important framework. The framework identifies five key protective factors that support family strength and resilience:

- 1. Parental Resilience
- 2. Social Connections
- 3. Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development
- 4. Concrete Support in Times of Need
- 5. Social and Emotional Competence of Children

Participants in the training shared how this experience positively influenced their work:

- "After this training, I feel better prepared to serve the children and families I work with."
- "I'm now viewing our families through a strengths-based lens, appreciating their hard work and resilience."
- "This training is both empowering and informative. I've gained valuable strategies for engaging with parents and recognizing the diversity of cultural parenting practices."

• "I attended the Strengthening Families class last year and found it so beneficial that I returned this year. I always discover something new."

ECE remains committed to supporting early educators and the families they serve. The insights gained from these training sessions not only strengthen programs but also enhance the well-being of the community.

Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS)

Back-to-School Night at Peter B. FitzGerald Community School: Peter B. FitzGerald Community School hosted its annual Back-to-School Night on September 18, with 57.69% of families in attendance. Families were treated to a meal before following their child's class schedule and meeting teachers.

The evening concluded at the "Counseling Center," where parents met with the community outreach & career counselor and the mental health & social work counselor to learn about the valuable resources available to students at FitzGerald.

New Bike Helps Student in Need: Thanks to an intra-SBCEO partnership with Transitional Youth Services, Peter B. FitzGerald Community School was able to provide a new bicycle to a student experiencing homelessness. Previously, the student's parents dropped him off as early as 6:00 a.m. on their way to work. Now, with his new bike, he can sleep in and arrive at school with his fellow students, feeling more rested and ready to learn.

Partners in Education

Job Readiness Training & Internship Program: Fall 2024 Cohort: The Job Readiness Training & Internship Program is gearing up to launch its fall 2024 cohort. So far, 69 applications have been received from high school students representing various schools across the county. The 8-week job readiness training began in late September, with support from volunteer career coaches from a range of industries, including government, healthcare, business, and engineering.

In addition to career coaching, students will engage with guest speakers and apply their skills in a culminating mock interview event. Board members interested in attending the mock interviews—as a volunteer or guest—may contact Erika Terrazas for more information: eterrazas@sbceo.org.

Partners in Education typically offers two cycles of Job Readiness Training each year, with the goal of matching students with paid internships upon completion.

Computers for Families: New Computer Basics Course: The newest offering from Computers for Families—an in-depth Computer Basics course—will be available in Guadalupe starting in early October. This 6-week, 24-hour course recently wrapped up in Carpinteria and Lompoc, where it served more than 70 adults. The program teaches essential computer skills such as sending email, navigating the web, and typing, helping participants support their children in school or pursue higher-paying jobs.

School Climate and Student Engagement

CHKS Administration and TUPE Program Updates: On September 17, a collaborative meeting was held at the Buellton Recreation Center, co-facilitated by Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley (FBSMV), UC Santa Barbara, and SBCEO. The meeting brought together representatives from TUPE-funded districts and community partners to discuss updates on the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) and Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) programs.

Participants reviewed services provided under the TUPE County Technical Assistance and Tier 2 Services grants, with FBSMV reporting on countywide service delivery. The group also worked on refining a custom survey module that will be administered alongside CHKS to students in 5th/6th, 7th, 9th, and 11th grades throughout the county. The data collected will support grant applications and inform community service plans. In addition to student surveys, many districts will conduct parent and staff surveys. CHKS school climate data will be publicly available in the spring and will be used to inform Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAP), School Plans for Student Achievement, and Comprehensive School Safety Plans.

School Safety

Rollout of Standard Response Protocol Signage at SBCEO Sites: The school safety liaison and the Maintenance and Operations team collaborated on the rollout of new safety signage at all SBCEO locations. Standard Response Protocol (SRP) posters, in both English and Spanish, have been placed near fire extinguishers and exit doors. These posters serve as reminders to staff and visitors about the appropriate actions to take during emergencies. The five key actions detailed in the SRP are: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

Registration Open for 2024 Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium: SBCEO is excited to announce that registration is now open for the 2024 School Safety Symposium. This one-day, in-person event will focus on release and reunification training, led by nationally recognized school safety expert Jeffrey Solomon of Consortium Training and Consulting. The symposium is designed for district and school leaders, early care and education partners, higher education safety leads, first responders, and school resource officers.

Participants will receive instructional information and take part in a hands-on reunification exercise, with the goal of equipping attendees to implement effective release and reunification procedures at their sites.

Increase in School Violence Threats in Santa Barbara County Schools: Schools across Santa Barbara County recently experienced an increase in threats of violence. While some incidents remained under investigation or were being monitored, many were determined to be non-credible. In every case, schools worked closely with law enforcement to thoroughly investigate each potential threat. Ensuring the safety and security of students and staff remained the highest priority.

Dennis Thomas, Santa Barbara County's school safety liaison, actively supported schools and law enforcement throughout these situations, ensuring that any additional assistance needed was provided.

Transitional Youth Services (TYS)

Transitional Youth Services Teams Up with YouthWell for Mental Health First Aid Training: Transitional Youth Services is excited to partner with YouthWell to offer vital Mental Health First Aid training. This all-day session, scheduled for October 11 at the SBCEO Auditorium, will equip foster and homeless liaisons with essential tools and knowledge to better support the youth they serve. The partnership was inspired by a meeting with YouthWell during the 2023-2024 school year, which focused on building resilience in young people.

Transitional Youth Services and Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley Collaborate to Train SMJUHSD Counselors: Transitional Youth Services is partnering with Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley (FBSMV) to provide comprehensive training for counselors in the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District (SMJUHSD). This collaboration aims to clarify the roles of TYS and FBSMV, address questions about the laws and rights of foster youth and youth experiencing homelessness, and share valuable resources. This training aligns with TYS's mission to strengthen the support systems for students.

TYS Participates in Good Samaritan Shelter's 2024 Recovery Day Event: For over 12 years, Good Samaritan Homeless Shelter has hosted Recovery Day, bringing together hundreds of people to celebrate recovery. This year's event featured craft and game stations, along with informational booths from community organizations supporting the homeless community. TYS representatives were present to meet with families and share information about the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act. It was a day filled with fun, connection, and a celebration of recovery.

- (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall apportion funds proportionally to county offices of education, school districts, charter schools, and the state special schools on the basis of an equal amount per unit of average daily attendance for kindergarten and grades 1 to 12, inclusive, as those numbers were reported as of the second principal apportionment for the 2021–22 fiscal year. The average daily attendance for each state special school shall be deemed to be 97 percent of the enrollment as reported in the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System as of the 2021–22 Fall 1 Submission.
- (c) Funding appropriated pursuant to this section shall be available for encumbrance through the 2025–26 fiscal year. Local educational agencies are encouraged, but not required, to proportionally use resources received pursuant to this section for the purposes noted in paragraphs (1) to (5), inclusive, of subdivision (a) and to support arts and music education programs.
- (d) For purposes of this section, standards-aligned instructional materials includes, but is not limited to, books for school and classroom libraries.
- (e) The governing board or body of each school district, county office of education, or charter school receiving funds pursuant to this section shall discuss and approve a plan for the expenditure of funds received pursuant to this section at a regularly scheduled public meeting. It is the intent of the Legislature that each school district, county office of education, or charter school expend any resources received pursuant to this section consistent with their governing board or body approved plan.
