General Information

Pasadena High School opened in 1874 and the current campus was opened in 1962. Pasadena High is best described as an ethnically diverse, urban comprehensive high school of approximately 1,750 students. PHS draws 65.1% of its enrollment from low-income households in the Pasadena area. Pasadena High graduates 93.3% of its seniors, well above the statewide average of 86.8% and the District average of 84.9%. A certificated staff of over 100 provide for the leadership and certificated support roles of the school site. A clerical staff of 33 provide for the day-to-day operations of Pasadena High School.

Course Offerings

Honors courses are offered to academically talented students capable of working at an accelerated rate. Honors courses include English 1-2, Chemistry, Economics, Math Integ. 1-3, Web App Dev 1-3.

Based on student demand, we offer the following Advanced Placement courses: Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, Chinese Language, Computer Science Principles, English Language Composition, English Literature Composition, Environmental Science, European History, Government and Pol US, Human Geography, Physics 2, Physics C, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, Studio Art, and US History.

In 2024, we had 65 AP Scholars with Distinction, 26 AP Scholars with Honor and 94 AP Scholars.

Academies & Pathway Programs

The Law and Public Service Academy is a 4-year college preparatory program specifically designed for students with interest in legal, government, public, or protective service careers.

The App Academy teaches computer programming and computer science through an engaging, project-based curriculum using HTML, JavaScript, Python and C++. Students use their creativity to design and build websites, games, mobile apps, and more!

Creative Arts, Media, and Design (CAMAD) was founded in 1990 and provides students with opportunities to create original work, develop client-based projects, and build confidence/knowledge in the creative arts, media, and design fields.

Math Academy students begin learning algebra, geometry and trigonometry and complete everything up through AP Calculus BC by the end of 8th grade. The standard high-school topics are supplemented by competition-level problem solving and rigorous proof writing techniques. The high school program consists of undergraduate-level pure and applied mathematics with a particular focus on individual research projects. Classes are University of California approved sequenced courses that students take on site and during normal school hours in place of their grade level math classes.

The Mandarin Dual Language Immersion Program is a continuation of the program that begins at the elementary school level. DLIP freshmen students take AP Chinese Language and Culture and progress through a rigorous set of courses. Completion of the MDLIP program grants the student a Seal of Biliteracy upon graduation.

Puente is a University of California college preparatory sponsored program. The mission of the Puente Program is to increase the number of educationally underserved students who enroll in four year Colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to their community as leaders and mentors to future generations.
