What is Read Write Inc. and why do we use it?



It is a systematic phonic scheme.

It teaches progressive skills in reading.

It supports writing, speaking and listening.

Taught 4 times a week in KG2 and 3 times a week in Grade 1.

As children move to grade 1 they should be moving on from the programme.



1-Say the sound




2-Use picture cards

What strategies do we use? Fred Talk and Fred Fingers



Fred is a frog who can say and read words only as pure sounds.

Oral blending: saying each individual sound and knowing how many letters make that sound.

Fred helps children learn to read and spell!

Children convert words into sounds

They press the sounds on to their fingers...

We call this Fred Fingers

Green words are words that can be sounded out phonetically.














Special Friends

When 2 or 3 letters join to make 1 sounds we call these "special friends". Children learn to identify and recall these combinations of letters as special friends. These can be found in the set 2 and set 3 sounds.





During the teaching of each book children should be able to confidently read the words in the book and read it fluently.

They will also complete hold a sentence activities which means the teacher will dictate a sentence to the children and they will repeat it and then write the sentence.

Nearly 90% of students who do not earn a high school diploma struggled to read in 3rd grade.



These struggling readers are 4 times more likely not to graduate, compared to proficient readers.

How to help at home



- Listen to your child read every day.
- Read to your child, ensuring to read with fluency and expression.
- Ask your child questions about what they have read to check comprehension.
- Work on special friends they are struggling with and encourage them to apply them in their writing.
- Work on alien words and decoding unfamiliar words
