## Principal's Message:

This is also my reminder to families to start dressing your students in layers. We often have cooler mornings and warmer afternoons. We have already been talking to the kiddos about dressing for all the weather changes that may occur so they are warm enough when we are outside for the morning lineups or even recess. ## **Cougar Course!**

Friday, October 18, is the Cougar Course Obstacle Run put on by our P.I.E.C.E. group. While this is a fundraiser for our school, it is also an awesome physical activity for our students. Each grade level has a designated time throughout the day that they work their way through the course. Parents are welcome to come and watch and cheer the students on! You can park out back. The obstacle course is set up all the way around the back trail. Thanks for everyone's support with this event.



#### **Adult Lunch Visitors**

We are happy to have adult lunch visitors on any given day. Here are a couple things that will help us out.

First, we are no longer offering adult school lunches to be purchased at the school. If you are coming for lunch, I do ask that you bring your own food if you are intending to eat with your child.

Secondly, if you are bringing in outside food for your child, please only bring in food for yourself and your child. We ask that you not share any food with other students sitting at or near your student. This is to ensure that no one is eating something that they may have an allergic reaction to and it also protects the feelings of other students around you that may not get to be part of the sharing.

## **Attendance & Timely Arrivals**

This is a reminder of the importance of having your child at school each and every day and ready to go by 7:45. When your students are in class and ready to go they feel at ease and ready to learn. This also teaches your children the life skill of being prepared and on time for things they will be a part of in the future. We do track attendance and arrivals on a daily basis and we want to partner with you to make sure students are here and ready to learn. This year again we will periodically be sending letters to families whose students are gone 10% or more of the school attendance days. Being absent 10% or more of the time is considered chronic absenteeism by the State of Illinois.

If your student arrives to school AFTER 7:50, we need an adult to sign them in at the office.



#### Verkada Visitor Management System & Other Front Door Info

This is another reminder that Unit 5 is expanding its use of the Verkada visitor management system to all district schools. This system, which has been used in Unit 5 high schools for the past year, is designed to enhance the safety and security of our students, staff, and visitors. Upon entry into a school, visitors and volunteers will enter the main office and present their photo ID to be scanned by the Verkada system. The system tracks the arrival and departure of visitors, while also strengthening student safety by checking all visitors against a registered sex offender database.

The visitor's full name and date of birth is searched on sex offender registries. Additionally, the name is reviewed on our district banned person list. Within seconds, the system will share the results with school staff and will print an ID badge for entry.

If someone doesn't have an ID, they will be checked in manually by office staff, sharing other forms of information.

It is important to note, this is only in use for times a visitor is entering the school during the day. It will not be used for after-school activities or when a parent is just coming to pick up a child.

We believe that the implementation of Verkada will greatly contribute to a safer and more secure environment for everyone in our school community. We are committed to providing a secure learning space and appreciate your support as we integrate this new system.

If you have any questions or concerns about Verkada, please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

One other simple thing that is of great help to us is making sure that everyone buzzes the front door to be let into the building. What sometimes happens is as one person is leaving, they hold the door open for someone who may be coming up the front walk. I understand you are trying to be polite, but in this instance, we need them to buzz the office so we are aware they are entering the building. Thanks for your help with this!

PBIS is the system we use to provide an overall structure for behavior within our classrooms and school. Each month throughout the year we emphasize basic vocabulary and affirmations. During September the focus was on building our class and school communities. The focus for October is on respect. Each month students can earn a fun "Out of the Blue" activity. To end September the classes got to be part of our Under the Sea Bubbles! Students had the opportunity
