Our staff has spent a lot of time and effort identifying all of the areas in which we would love them to become "McKinley Scholars," not just academics. We will incorporate all of these areas in classroom lessons and teachable moments over the course of the school year, and also recognize these positive attributes in students through our PBIS system.

The McKinley PTO will be holding monthly meetings this year each month at 3:30 in the building. Join us to take part in all of the wonderful ways the PTO helps McKinley students. As they are planning events for the year and plan to hold their annual fall fundraiser. We are already planning for our Fall Parade and Festival, as well as other events for our students in the coming months.




