COMMENTS regarding OCR Resolution

Pete Conrad: On principle, I am opposed to the findings of the OCR resolution, and believe a follow-up, fair hearing of the case would show it to be without merit. As a parent of a student with an IEP, I can attest to the school's investment in and care for my child's education. Specifically, the Academic Support Team involved in my child's education is thoroughly involved in every aspect of the student's development as a scholar and a person. Based on my own experience, I am completely confident the AST response to the unfortunate event with regard to Mr. Campbell's education and well-being would be categorized as above-and-beyond. An IEP meeting, while important, would have been a formality and a review on steps already taken. All responses from all faculty/staff involved was swift and appropriate. The unfortunate reality is requesting a hearing comes with limited upside and tremendous cost to the school. The optics are not favorable with either decision LCHS could take, and, in fact, continuing to fight could be perceived as caring more for appearance than the education and well-being of our students. This would be furthest from the truth and, ultimately, why I felt the board made the correct decision to sign the resolution. It is my sincere hope by accepting this resolution, the LCHS faculty, staff, and BOD can continue to do what we have always done: provide the best environment for the strongest education available in this great country.

Elizabeth Timpe: I am opposed to the findings of the OCR resolution based on my understanding of the case. I think the school should be allowed a chance to appeal the findings but understand that the appeal process would be more costly than deemed financially responsible for the school. The school had no choice but accepting the OCR resolution due to the political system in place which I find very unfortunate.

Raven Banning: I am disappointed in the way cases are handled by the OCR. Not allowing the school administration and board to see what their "findings" were until after the resolution was signed is completely unjust. They are strong-arming schools to make sure that they do exactly what OCR wants them to do without any recourse for the schools themselves to dispute the claims. While I agree that there should be standards on how these cases are handled, there are no actual policies the OCR has in place for schools to follow that I could find, so what exactly are they basing their findings on? Liberty responded as quickly as possible and made sure discipline was made where necessary.
