LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have had another fantastic and busy week! On Tuesday, the children enjoyed a livestream from Henley Literary Festival from the author of the book 'Blue Monster.' They have also enjoyed some yoga this week in PE and have been building prototype shelters in DT. The children have been reading 'The Three Little Pigs' and have been comparing and contrasting the pigs and the wolves. The children have also filled their first marble jar and are having their treat this afternoon!

Ask me: How to describe the wolf in 'The Three Little Pigs.'







Year 2 continued to learn about the zones of regulation and we learnt that all the zones are okay to be in as long as we know how to regulate our emotions. In music, we sang a jazz song and clapped different rhythms. In English, we created a recipe for our very own marvellous medicine! In maths, we learnt how to count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s!

Ask me: What are the zones of regulation?







Year 3 enjoyed listening to the author, Hannah Gold, talk about our new class reader and her latest book called Turtle Moon. In science, we have recapped on facts about bones and joints before introducing muscles and how they generate movement at the joints. We also chose our own colour collections in art and used fine brushes to work within the lines on a template to complete a wide array of colour patterns.

Ask me: How do muscles work in pairs?





Year 4 really enjoyed their dance lesson this week, producing some very impressive freestyle moves. In English 'freeze frames' helped the children to think about how the townsfolk were feeling after the wolf knocked over the fire. Year 4 made predictions about what would happen next in the story. They added sound and actions to different punctuation marks, to help with speech punctuation. On Thursday Year 3 and Year 4 were part of a webinar organised by the Henley Literary Festival. They listened to the author, Hannah Gold, talk about our new class reader and her latest book called Turtle Moon. Finally, in Maths Year 4 have been rounding to the nearest ten and one hundred.



Ask me: What is the rhyme to help us with rounding?

Reception have enjoyed reading the story Harold and the Purple Crayon this week and had a chance at creating their own part of the story to make into our own book. We had discussions about what Harold was drawing and why and the children enjoyed bringing their ideas to life. They also spent some time creating dens outside and sorting objects by their colour.

Ask me: What did Harold draw in your part of the story?
