

Superintendent's PIE Meeting
Thursday, September 26, 2024

Remote Meeting

Superintendent Crozier opened the meeting at 11:02 a.m. and welcomed all who were present on Zoom.

Updates included:

- SPS is working with the Sudbury Health Department on mosquito borne illness. The concern / risk still remains the same level. Treatments have been completed and currently no additional treatments are necessary on school properties because the effect lasts for 90 days.
- The state uses tools to ensure districts meet DESE expectations. One tool is Tiered Focus Monitoring, which follows a cyclical process over multiple years. This year, focus areas include Student Services, English Learners (EL), and Civil Rights.
- The Student Art Gallery preview is scheduled for Wednesday, October 9th at Central Office; 40 Fairbank Road. Artists and their families are invited to attend beginning at 3:00 p.m. The gallery opens up to the public at 3:30 p.m.
- The last open house for the 2024-2025 school year is scheduled for this evening. All others have been completed. These provide an opportunity to meet teachers, visit classrooms and learn more about the curriculum planned for the year. They have all been very well attended and the feedback shared has been very positive.
- MCAS results will be available via the ASPEN portal by Thursday, October 17th. These tests share a snapshot of student performance but are also a good tool to help build interventions if necessary.
- The District is partnering with community boards and organizations such as Select Board, Board of Health, LSRHS, Goodnow Library Foundation, Sudbury Family Network and local pediatric practices to bring Dr. Jean Twenge to Sudbury to share her talk on "Parenting Today's Super Connected Kids". This presentation will be held on Tuesday, November 12th at Curtis Middle School. Information will be shared via each school's weekly / bi-weekly flyers.
- The First View Bus Tracking App will be available next week. Each school will receive instructions and their schools code to access their schools bus routes.

Questions from participants included:

- A better understanding of MCAS results and how they relate to peer districts.
- How recess monitoring is held at each school and whether parent volunteers are allowed in this role.

Mr. Crozier ended the meeting at 11:16 a.m.
