- 3. Take Care of our School / Community


Please Help Your Child Succeed in School!

Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early. School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in Kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. It is important to start to build this habit in preschool so that our students learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Thank you Cumru parents for helping your child to fulfill Cumru's Motto to "Be Here, Be You, and Belong."




