Parent-Teacher Conferences

Grades 3-5 will have their one night of student-led showcase on Thursday, October 17th, 2024 in an Open House format from 3:30 - 5:45 pm. There is no need to sign up for grades 3 - 5. Why are we trying this format? The student-led showcase empowers students to take ownership of their learning and foster positive parent-child interactions. It's also a time when students demonstrate responsibility for being active participants in their education and show pride in their academic performance by providing a review of their work for their adults. This opportunity allows students to set goals along with their caretakers and teachers in academic and social areas.

Grades K-2/3 combo conferences will be our traditional conferences which will take place over two nights of conferences: Thursday, October 17th, and Tuesday, October 22nd from 3:45-6:30 pm. These 15-minute conferences aim to discuss your child's academic progress and his or her overall school experience. We'll share insights into their strengths, areas for growth, and explore strategies to support their success. Together, we can create a plan to address any challenges and ensure their continued academic development.

Traffic and Parking

At times, parking and traffic around Johnston are frustrating, but please help us ensure our students' safety. Traffic and parking rules around schools are created for the safety of our students. Please follow all posted signs. To avoid traffic congestion, a suggestion is to park further away from school and let your child cross the street with a crossing guard, safety patrol member, or a marked or unmarked crosswalk. Never let your child cross between parked cars or mid-block! The school parking lot is NOT a drop-off zone; this is due to the fact that many students cross in front of the lot on the sidewalk. Reducing the traffic in/out allows for our students to walk safely near this parking lot.

As you may be aware, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) made recent and very important changes to Wisconsin's administrative code (Wis. Admin. Code ch. DHS 144), which outlines immunization requirements for school entry. This change includes adding Meningococcal ACWY-containing vaccines to the requirements for students entering seventh grade, and a booster dose for eligible students entering 12th grade. This change comes after an increase in meningococcal cases seen in the US. As of March 25, 2024, the CDC reported 143 cases of meningococcal disease in the United States, which is a 75% increase from the same time period in 2023. This is the highest number of cases reported since 2014. The CDC notes that the increase in cases is mainly due to the serogroup Y, which can be prevented with vaccination. For additional information about these vaccines, please discuss with your student's provider or visit CDC Meningococcal Vaccination Information.

October 5th is World Meningitis Day. Meningitis is one of the most common types of meningococcal disease. The observance aims to raise awareness about meningitis, its symptoms, and vaccines that can help prevent it. Visit the World Meningitis Website here to learn more—Meningitis Research Foundation.

What is meningitis?

Meningitis is the swelling of the lining around the brain and spinal cord (the meninges) and is usually caused by a bacterial, fungal or viral infection.

What are some common symptoms of meningitis?

Fever, headache and stiff neck. There could also be other symptoms such as nausea, vomiting, eyes being more sensitive to light and confusion.
