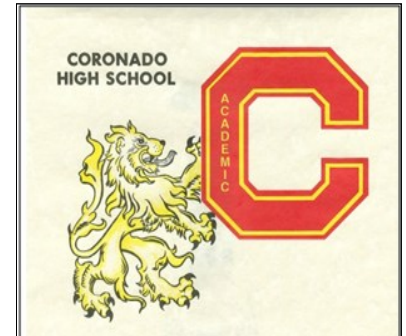

CORONADO INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Our goal this year is to ensure that every student attends school regularly. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life. We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school—regardless of the reason—it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is chronically absent—which means missing 18 or more days over the course of an entire school year. Research shows:

- Children chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.
- By 6th grade, chronic absence is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school.
- By 9th grade good attendance can predict graduation rates even better than 8th grade test scores.

Absences can add up quickly. A child is chronically absent if he or she misses just two days every month!! Clearly, going to school regularly matters! We don't want your child to fall behind in school and get discouraged. Please ensure that your child attends school every day and arrives on time. Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your children keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and load backpacks the night before.
- Ensure your children go to school every day unless they are truly sick.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session.
- Talk to teachers and counselors for advice if your children feel anxious about going to school.
- Develop back up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, neighbor, or another parent to take your child to school.

CORONADO ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It is difficult for the teacher and class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent.

- Parents and guardians must excuse their students within 48 hours of the absence.
- Students who missed 50% of class will be marked as an unexcused absence. Please call the attendance office to excuse your student.

Chronic tardiness may result in detention or suspension and may become a serious discipline issue.

If you need your student released early due to an appointment, please send a note with your student or call the attendance line. Notes should be brought to the attendance office before school or between classes. Please call the attendance office 1 hour in advance to request an early release. Requests made without a 1 hour notice may result in a student not being released by the requested time. We appreciate your assistance with this. This allows us to page your student during passing periods and get a pass for the student to be released in time for their appointment, thereby reducing interruptions to classes.

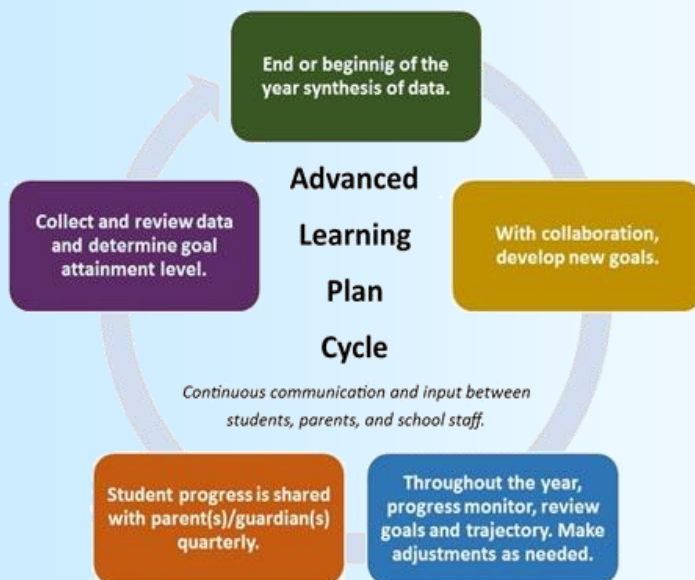

GT, ALPs, AND ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Gifted and Talented—Advanced Learning Plans (ALPs) AP Exam Two-Step Process

STUDENT-LED ONLINE ADVANCED LEARNING PLANS (ALPs) NOW TIED to ICAPS

Students will be able to participate in creating their own ALP goal this year, while at the same time, completing requirements for their ICAP—Individual Career



Academic Plan. This plan allows students to address their identified area of talent, test scores, giftedness and growth, college or post-secondary planning, as well as interests and pursuits. The plan became a

requirement for high school students following the passage of 2009's Senate Bill 256, a K-12 funding bill.

This year identified gifted and talented students are able to identify a yearly academic and affective goal, along with their post-secondary goal that will meet ICAP requirements, but they will be housed in PowerSchool.

Information and instructions regarding ICAP, ALPs and access through the PowerSchool system were emailed to GT students and families in late August. Ultimately, we hope to focus more on the quality and meaning of student goals as they relate to the interests and passions of our identified gifted students. Goals are due by September 23, 2024 through PowerSchool. Mrs. Graham will follow-up with students and families throughout the month of October to support with collaboration on these goals. Parent and Guardians should review student goals and sign their students ALP. Please email Mrs. Graham if you need any assistance with signing your students ALP.

Mrs. Graham also supports the needs of GT students in the classroom, resources social emotional awareness and skills, and coordinates Coronado's dual/concurrent college course enrollment, helping GT students through their 4 years of high school.

REGISTERING FOR THE 2024-2025 AP EXAMS

College Board account and Join Code - Many students have completed the first step – logging into their College Board account and using their course assigned join code **AP** (provided by your AP teacher) to join their AP class, thereby signing up for AP Classroom resources and registering through College Board for their AP exam.

AP AND DUAL AND CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TESTING INFORMATION

Students currently taking Advanced Placement courses, or enrolled for next semester will take AP exams during the AP exam period from May 5—16, 2025.

To be considered for college level credit, most colleges suggest students should earn a 3, 4, or 5 on the exam. Each exam will be paid for by School District 11.

Most students have already registered for their AP exams and resources through their AP class(es). ALL students should be registered by Wednesday, October 23, 2024. AP Microeconomics students will register in January-February, since it is a spring semester course, only. Once the exam order is placed, if a student drops an AP class or decides not to take the exam then there will be a \$40 fee added to the student's account.

If your child needs any accommodations for these exams, please check with Mrs. Wetta as soon as possible in order to establish those accommodations with the College Board. Accommodations need to be entered by January 22, 2025. Please click this [link for AP Exam Overview information](#).

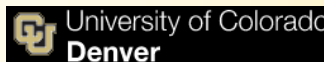
CU SUCCEED/CSUP— Dual/Concurrent College Enrollment

The dual and concurrent enrollment registration period for Fall 2024 courses for UCCS and CSU Pueblo are open. The deadline for UCCS is **October 17** and for CSU Pueblo fall courses is **November 1**. (UC Denver fall registration dates have passed; however, the last day to drop courses is Oct. 18). **Tuition will be paid by students/parents for UCCS and UC Denver at the time of registration. CSU Pueblo fees are covered by D11—with students registering through their class—check with course instructor.**
