Cadet Group Commander


C/Lt. Col. Daniel Rueda

Women's History Month

As we all know, March is Women's History Month. Thank you to all women of the past and present who continue to contribute to our society today. I would like to recognize Malala Yousafzai for continuously fighting for education rights for young women today.

Meet Malala Yousafzai, who is a Pakistani activist fighting for female rights. Ms. Yousafzai was born on July 12, 1997 in Mingora, Pakistan, which is located in Swat Valley. Once the Taliban started to take control of Swat Valley, women and girls were no longer allowed to achieve an education. In September 2008, she began to speak out against the removal of women and girls' right to education. In 2009, only being 11 years old, Malala Yousafzai began blogging for the BBC about living under the threat of the Taliban's threats to deny her and others an

education. She had to hide her identity under the name of Gul Makai, however she was revealed when she became the BBC blogger in December. As a result, she was nominated for the International Children's Peace Prize in 2011 along with Pakistan's National Youth Peace Prize. Yousafzai continued to speak for her and fellow women and girl's right to an education, when

her family and her learned that the Taliban issued a death threat against her. During this time, her and her friends continued to discreetly attend her father's school, however, on their way home on October 9th, 2012, she was shot by the Taliban. Surviving, she continued to speak out. Nine months after being shot, Malala Yousafzai spoke at the United Nations, urging leaders to change their policies surrounding education. Along with many awards, she is the youngest person in the world to earn the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014.

As tradition goes, every year we have an



this amazing opportunity!






COVID-19 Remembrance
